WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (West Riding of Yorkshire) Order, 1904.
Dated 18th April, 1904.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1902, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (West Riding of Yorkshire) Order, 1904."

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire so as to be between the last day of February and the 12th day of August in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those

species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Bullfinch protected against owners and occupiers.

Bullfinch, Blackheaded Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chaffinch, Chiffchaff, Crossbill, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Golden Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Little Grebe (Dabchick), Common Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Kite, Linnet, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Ring Ouzel, Alpine Pipit (Water Pipit), Meadow Pipit, Richard's Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Lesser Redpole, Mealy Redpole, Redstart, Robin, Great Grey Shrike, Lesser Grey Shrike, Redbacked Shrike, Woodchat Shrike, Siskin, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Song Thrush, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Crested Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Treecreeper, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Aquatic Warbler, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Marsh Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Common Wren, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snakebird).

Exclusion from the operation of the Act of 1880.

IV. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall not apply within the Administrative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire to the House Sparrow.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During the period between the 11th day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire:—

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the West Riding.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the Administrative County of the West Riding of Yorkshire:—

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering Order as to Appointment and Duties of Stocktaker:—

ELHAM UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Elham Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by a General Order, dated the 23rd day of January, 1904, We, the Local Government Board, empowered the Guardians of the Poor of the Elham Union to appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker or Stocktakers at the Workhouse and Cottage Homes belonging to the said Union;

And whereas by Article IV of the said Order it is provided that the Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, examine the stores at the Workhouse and Cottage Homes and compare the same with the entries in the Accounts referred to in that Article;

And whereas it is expedient that the said Article IV should be rescinded and that other provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby rescind Article IV of the said General Order dated the twenty-third day of January, one thousand nine hundred and four, and Direct that the following Article shall be substituted in its place; namely:—

ARTICLE IV.—The Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stores at the Workhouse and Cottage Homes belonging to the said Union, and compare the same with the quantities of stock remaining in store as shown by the entries in the proper columns in the Accounts termed respectively the "Quarterly Balance of the Provisions Account" and the "Quarterly Balance of

the Necessaries and Miscellaneous Account." He shall also, on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of clothing at the Workhouse and Cottage Homes, and compare the same with the balance appearing in the Accounts termed respectively the "Clothing Materials Receipt and Conversion Account" and the "Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Account."

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 16TH APRIL 1904.)

DUNDEE (PARASITIC MANGE) ORDER OF 1904.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Separation of Diseased and Suspected Animals and Notice of Disease.

1.—(1.) Every person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected

with or suspected of parasitic mange shall (a) as far as practicable keep that animal separate from animals not so affected or suspected; and (b) with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the horse, ass, or mule being so affected or suspected to a constable of the police force for the police area in which the horse, ass, or mule so affected or suspected is.

(2.) The constable receiving such notice shall forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority, who shall forthwith report the same to the Local Authority.

Duty of Inspector to act immediately.

2. An Inspector of the Local Authority on receiving in any manner whatsoever information of the supposed existence of parasitic mange, or having reasonable ground to suspect the existence of parasitic mange, shall proceed with all practicable speed to the place where such disease, according to the information received by him, exists, or is suspected to exist, and shall see that the provisions of this Order are complied with.

Treatment for Parasitic Mange.

3.—(1.) A person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with parasitic mange, shall from time to time as often as may be necessary, treat that horse, ass, or mule, or cause it to be treated, with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange.

(2.) If any person fail to comply with the requirements of this Article he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection.

4.—(1.) The Local Authority may, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of parasitic mange, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them:

(a.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of any place used by, and of utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things used for or about, any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange:

(b.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and disinfection are to be effected:

(c.) For requiring the owner, lessee, or occupier of any such place to cleanse and disinfect any such place, utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things, at the expense of the Local Authority, or at the expense of such owner, lessee, or occupier.

(2.) If any person fail to cleanse and disinfect any place or any utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place or such utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, to be cleansed and disinfected, and to recover summarily the expenses of such cleansing and disinfection from such person.

(3.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of a Regulation of the Local Authority made under this Order, the owner and the lessee and the occupier of any place in or in respect of which the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be

deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Occupiers to give facilities for Cleansing.

5.—(1.) Where the power of causing any place to be cleansed and disinfected under this Order is exercised by the Local Authority, the owner, lessee, or occupier thereof shall give all reasonable facilities for that purpose.

(2.) If any person fail to comply with the requirements of this Article he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.

6.—(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board two copies of every Regulation made by them under this Order.

(2.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry, with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order, that the same is for any reason objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

7. Horses, asses, and mules shall be animals, and parasitic mange of horses, asses, and mules (in this Order called parasitic mange) shall be a disease for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences or procedure.

Exemption of Army Veterinary Department and Veterinary Colleges.

8. Nothing in this Order applies to any horse, ass, or mule kept in stables of military barracks or camps under the care and supervision of the Army Veterinary Department, or in stables of any Veterinary College affiliated to the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons.

Interpretation.

9. In this Order—

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Extent.

10. This Order extends to the city of Dundee only.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-third day of April, nineteen hundred and four.

Short Title.

12. This Order may be cited as the DUNDEE (PARASITIC MANGE) ORDER of 1904.
