"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and twenty-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage of the benefice (being a rectory) of Saint Thomas, Haverfordwest, in the county of Pembroke, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint Mary, Cardigan, in the county of Cardigan, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Fishguard, in the county of Pembroke, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint Dogmaels with the vicarage of Saint Dogmaels with the vicarage of Llantwyd annexed, in the county of Cardigan, the benefice (being a rectory) of Loughor, in the county of Glamorgan, and the benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint Ishmaels with All Saints Llansaint and Ferryside, in the county of Carmarthen (all which six benefices are the same as and are hereinafter referred to as the six benefices described in the first part of the schedule hereto), for the patronage of the benefice (being a rectory) of Llandyrnog, in the county of Denbigh, the benefice (being a rectory) of Saint Mary, Derwen,

> "Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the six benefices described in the first part of the schedule hereto is vested in Your Majesty Your Heirs and Successors in right of the Crown and such right of patronage or presentation is exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being.

> "And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the four benefices described in the second part of the schedule hereto is vested in the Bishop of Saint David's for the time being.

> "And whereas the Right Honourable Hardinge Stanley, Earl of Halsbury, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, and the Right Reverend John, now Bishop of Saint David's, have respectively signified to us their desire that the patronage of the said ten benefices described in the first and second parts of the schedule hereto may be rearranged by way of exchange in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

> "And whereas we have made due enquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative values of the said ten benefices and of the patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said tend benefices are set forth in the first and second parts of the schedule hereto, and that the yearly value of each of the said ten benefices in Your Majesty's Books is that which is stated in the same schedule,

"Now therefore, with the consent of the said Hardinge Stanley, Earl of Halsbury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as aforesaid (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said John Bishop of Saint David's acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has affixed his hand and episcopal seal to this scheme) we the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the six benefices described in the first part of the schedule hereto and the churches thereof respectively shall be assigned and transferred from Your Majesty and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said John Bishop of Saint David's and his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever, and that in

exchange for the advowsons or perpetual rights of patronage of or presentation to the said six benefices and churches the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the four benefices described in the second part of the schedule hereto and the churches thereof respectively shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said John Bishop of Saint David's and be absolutely vested in Your Majesty Your Heirs and Successors in right of the Crown and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Hardinge Stanley, Earl of Halsbury, or other the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being acting on behalf of Your Majesty Your Heirs and Successors.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four; of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninetyfour, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and four, in the words following, that is to say:-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels Blackburn and of the new parish of the Trinity Blackburn both in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the thirtieth day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five and published in the London Gazette on the eighth day of July following a certain part of the parish of Blackburn in the said county of Lancaster and at that time in the diocese of Chester but now in the said diocese of Manchester was assigned as a chapelry district to the consecrated church of Saint Michael and All Angels situate in the said parish of Blackburn and the said chapelry district was named 'The Chapelry District of Saint Michael and All Angels Blackburn.

"And whereas the said chapelry district of Saint Michael and All Angels Blackburn has under the provisions of the Act of the nine-teenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty chapter thirtyseven and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said

late Majesty chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-ninth day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine and published in the London Gazette on the third day of the following month a certain part of the said parish of Blackburn was assigned as a chapelry district to the consecrated church called Trinity Church situate in the said parish of Blackburn and the said charelry district was named 'The Trinity Chapelry District Blackburn.

"And whereas the said chapelry district of the Trinity Blackburn has under the provisions of the above-mentioned Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and four become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the above-mentioned Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty chapter thirty-seven and by the above-mentioned

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels Blackburn and of the said new parish of the Trinity Blackburn shall be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Edmund Arbuthnott Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels Blackburn and of the said new parish of the Trinity Blackburn shall be altered so that all that portion of the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels Blackburn which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of the Trinity Blackburn.

"And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other

Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels Blackburn in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester and to be annexed to the new parish of the Trinity Blackburn in the said county and

diocese being:-

"All that portion of the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels Blackburn which is bounded upon the south-east and upon the south by the new parish of Saint Thomas Blackburn in the said county and diocese upon the south-west partly by the new parish of Saint Matthew Higher Audley Blackburn in the said county and diocese and partly by the said new parish of the Trinity Blackburn upon the west by the last-named new parish, and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the north-west upon the north and upon the north-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Trinity Blackburn from the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels Blackburn at the junction of Birley-street with Whalley New-road and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Whalley New-road for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Whalley Old-road and extending thence northeastward along the middle of Whalley Old-road for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with the street called Union-buildings aud extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to its junction with Moss-street and extending thence north-east-ward along the middle of Moss-street for a distance of seventeen chains and a half or thereabouts to the centre of the level crossing where

Moss-street is crossed by the Bolton Blackburn and Hellifield Line of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such line of railway across Stanley-street and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Stanley-street for a distance of four chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Appleby-street and extending thence southwestward along the middle of Appleby-street for a distance of half a chain or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the wall forming the boundary between the premises known as Plantation Mill and the premises known as Appleby's Corn Mill otherwise Daisyfield Corn Mills and extending thence south-eastward to and along the said boundary wall for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its south-eastern end on the north-western side of the towing path of the Leeds and Liverpool Canal and continuing thence south-eastward in the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of twelve yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the said canal upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels Blackburn from the said new parish of Saint Thomas Blackburn.'

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patrons and Incumbents have respectively

signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

(b.) Every such Master or Mate to whom a Pilotage Certificate shall be or shall have been granted or who shall obtain or who shall have obtained a renewal of any Certificate so granted enabling him to pilot any ship or ships therein specified drawing less than seventeen feet of water, shall contribute towards the said fund the sum of two pounds two shillings yearly, provided that such sum does not exceed five per cent. of the Pilotage Dues which would be payable in respect of his ship if he had not held a Pilotage Certificate.

The contributions above mentioned shall be payable to the Treasurer for the time being of the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board at the time when the fee for the granting or for the renewal of the Certificate of such Master or Mate is payable.

And that the Clerk of the Peace shall give notice of any such resolution to every Coroner for such County, and of the time when the petition will be taken by the said Justices into consideration, and the Justices shall confer with every such Coroner who shall attend the meeting of the Justices for that purpose touching such petition, having due regard to the size and nature of each proposed district, the number of the inhabitants, the nature of their employment, and such other circumstances as shall appear to the Justices fit to be considered in carrying into execution the provisions of the said Act; and such petition, with a description of the several proposed districts and of the boundaries thereof, with the reasons upon which the petition is founded, shall be certified to His Majesty under the hands and seals of two or more of the Justices present when such petition shall be agreed to, and the Clerk of the Peace for such County shall forthwith give or send a true copy of such petition, certified under his hand to every Coroner for such County. And that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, if He shall think fit, with the advice of His Privy Council, after taking into consideration any such petition, and also any petition which may be presented to Him by any Coroner of the same County concerning such proposed division or alteration, or whenever it shall seem fit to His Majesty to direct the issue of a Writ de Coronatore Eligendo for the purpose of authorizing the election of an additional Coroner above the number of those who have been theretofore customarily elected in such County, to order that such County shall be divided into such and so many districts for the purposes of the said Act as to His Majesty, with the advice aforesaid

shall seem expedient, and to give a name to each of such districts, and every such Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

And whereas by the Local Government Act, 1888, the powers and business of the said Justices in respect of the matters aforesaid in each County were transferred to the Council of such County.

And whereas by an Order in Council made the twenty-sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, under and in accordance with the said Coroners Act of 1844, the county of Devon was divided into six districts for the purposes of the said Act, respectively named the "Houiton District," "Crediton District," "Barnstaple District," "Okehampton District," "Stoke Damerel District," and "Totnes District," and such districts were respectively to comprise the several parishes and places, and have the boundaries named and set forth in the said Order.

And whereas previous to and at the date of the said Order, and thenceforward until the coming into operation of the Local Government Act 1888, the boroughs of Bideford and Dartmouth, in the said county respectively, were municipal boroughs within the meaning of the Municipal Corporations Act 1835, and the Municipal Corporations Act 1882, respectively, and a separate Court of Quarter Sessions was at the said times holden in and for each of the said boroughs.

And whereas previous to and at the date of the said Order, and since, the borough of South Molton, in the said county, was a municipal borough within the meaning of the said two lastmentioned Acts, and since the date of the said Order and before the passing of the Local Government Act 1888, Her late Majesty was pleased to and did grant that a separate Court of Quarter Sessions be holden in and for the said borough.

And whereas the said boroughs, each having a separate Court of Quarter Sessions as aforesaid, and each containing, according to the census of 1881, a population of less than 10,000, became, under and by virtue of the Local Government Act 1888, on the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and since have been parts of the county of Devon for all purposes relating to Coroners and subject to the jurisdiction of the County Coroners.

And whereas by an Order in Council made the twenty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, it was ordered, directed, and declared, that Writs de Coronatore Eligendo for the election of three additional Coroners for the said county, should forthwith be directed to the Devon County Council, and that from the date of the said Order the county of Devon should be divided into nine districts for Coroners' purposes, which said nine districts should be named, as was in the Schedule to the said Order directed, and should respectively comprise the several parishes and places and have the boundaries prescribed and mentioned in the said Schedule.

And whereas by a further Order in Council made the twenty-third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, it was ordered, directed, and declared, that the district described in the said Order in Council of the twenty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, as the "Bideford District," should be annexed to and form part of, and be included in the district described in the said Order as the "Barnstaple District," that the said county of Devon should be divided into eight districts for

Coroners' purposes and for the purposes of the said first-mentioned Act, and that the said eight districts should be named as in the Schedule to such Order directed, and should respectively comprise the several parishes and places, and have the boundaries prescribed and mentioned in that behalf in the Schedule thereto.

And whereas a petition dated the seventeenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and three, was presented to His Majesty by the County Council of the county of Devon, praying that an alteration should be made in the division of the said county into Coroners' districts as provided by the aforesaid Order in Council of the twenty-third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, by including the South Molton Coroner's District in the Barnstaple Coroner's District.

And whereas the said petition, with a description of the said proposed district and of the boundaries thereof with the reasons upon which the said petition is founded, has been duly certified to His Majesty.

And whereas all the provisions in that behalf of the hereinbefore first recited Act have been duly complied with:

And whereas the Coroners for the said county have not presented any petition to His Majesty concerning the said proposed alteration.

- (a.) That the interior of any such vault in preparation for or immediately after any burial therein shall be thoroughly and effectually ventilated by suitable and sufficient means in direct communication with the external air beyond the walls of the
- (b.) That, as soon as may be after the deposit of a coffin in any such vault, the coffin shall be wholly and permanently enclosed by means of stone flagging properly jointed in cement or brickwork in cement, and otherwise in such manner as effectually to prevent the escape of any noxious gas from the interior of the enclosure so formed; and
- (c.) That, as soon as conveniently may be after the deposit of a coffin in any such vault, the entrance to the vault from the church shall be properly covered, and the covering shall be hermetically sealed by

concrete or cement in such a manner as effectually to prevent the escape of any noxious gas from the vault into the church. Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the twenty-eighth day of May next:

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation one month before the said twenty-eighth day of May.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Worcester College, Oxford, on the 4th day of March, 1904 (and sealed on 7th April, 1904), amending certain of the Statutes of the College, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—
Ex parte the Provost and Fellows of Worcester
College in the University of Oxford.

A STATUTE made to amend certain Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Vict., c. 48), in relation to Worcester College, in the University of Oxford, duly passed at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose on the fourth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and four, by the votes of the whole number of persons present and voting and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

Whereas in Statute II, 7, of the said Statutes it is enacted (inter alia) as follows: "The Provost shall receive a fixed annual emolument of one

thousand pounds free of income tax.

And whereas in Statute III, 1, it is enacted (inter alia) "There shall not be fewer than nine nor more than ten Fellows of the College," and "The Emoluments of a Fellowship shall be such a yearly sum not less than £150 nor more than £200 as the revenues of the College available for the time being will permit," and in Statute III, 6, "The Provost and Fellows may, if they think fit, before holding an election to any Fellowship under Clause 4 give notice of their intention to elect a person who will be required to take part for two years in the educational work of the College. A Fellow elected in pursuance of such notice shall during those years undertake such educational work as a Lecturer of the College as the Provost and Fellows may assign to him, provided that the aggregate number of persons holding Fellowships subject to this requirement and of persons holding Fellowships by election or re-election under Clauses 7 and 8, or either of them, shall not at any time exceed Six." And in Statute III. 9, "There shall not be at any one time in the College more than four Fellows elected or re-elected under the two last preceding clauses, or either of them, in respect of the Offices of Tutor, Lecturer, Bursar, or any of them, nor more than one Fellow elected or re-elected under the same Clauses, or either of them, in respect of the Office of Professor or Public Reader in the

And in Statute III, 13 (inter alia), "A Fellow elected under this Clause shall not be reckoned in the number of four mentioned in Clause 9." And in Statute III, 17 (inter alia), "Every Fellow not elected under Clause 7 nor re-elected under Clause 8 who shall be instituted to an Ecclesiastical benefice, or shall become possessed of property, or entitled to any Government pension, or shall be admitted to any office tenable for life or during good behaviour (not being an academical office within the University of Oxford), or to any Office in the permanent Civil Service of the State, and who shall retain such benefice, property, pension, or office for twelve calendar months from the day of his institution, accession, or admission thereto, or acquisition thereof, shall, if the annual income derivable by him from such benefice, property, pension, or office, or from any two or more of the above-mentioned sources, clear of deductions, except for property or income tax, shall exceed £500, vacate his Fellowship at the expiration of such twelve calendar or income months, and for this purpose the income which the estimated value of any property would produce, if invested in £3 per centum Consolidated Annuities at the price current at the time of the acquisition thereof, shall, in case of doubt, be considered to be income derivable from such property.'

And whereas in Statute IV, 1, it is enacted "There shall be in all eighteeen Scholarships, namely: five of the foundation of Sir Thomas Cookes, four of that of Mrs. Saruh Eaton, five of that of Dr. George Clarke, one of that of Dr. Finney, and three established out of the revenues of the College. The number of Scholarships established by the College may, at any time hereafter, should the College think fit, and have revenue available for the purpose, be increased to five. Such Scholarships are exclusive of the Barnes Foundation, which (having been established within fifty years before the 10th day of August, 1877) shall continue to be governed by the terms of the original trust concerning the same." And in Statute IV, 3 (inter alia), "Every Scholarship shall be tenable for two years from the day of election, if the person elected be then a Member of the University, but if he be not already a member of the University then from a day not later than six months after his election to be fixed by the Provost and Fellows." And at the end of the same clause, "Provided also that, unless a Scholar declare his need of assistance at the University, he shall receive no more than £20 per annum and free rooms." And in Statute IV, 7, "The three Scholarships established by the College, or any of them, may (if the Provost and Fellows shall think fit, and according to regulations from time to time made), be filled up by selection from candidates at any public examination, conducted under the authority of the University, of persons not members of the University, or may be filled up by election after examination under the Clause next following.

And whereas in Statute V it is enacted "The Provost and Fellows shall have power to award ten Exhibitions each of £20 per annum and tenable for the same time and on the same conditions as the Scholarships. There shall always be six Exhibitioners, of whom three shall be named the Cookes Exhibitioners, one the Kay Exhibitioner, and two the Holford Exhibitioners. The Holford Exhibitions shall be awarded to persons duly qualified for election to Holford Exhibitions according to the instrument of

Foundation, being otherwise qualified to be Exhibitioners of the College, if such persons shall present themselves, and in the awarding of the Cookes Exhibitions such persons educated wholly or in part at the Grammar School of King Edward the Sixth at Bromsgrove and not holding a Cookes Scholarship as may satisfy the Provost and Fellows that they are in need of assistance at the University shall, if otherwise qualified, be entitled to a preference. Subject to the foregoing provisions, the Exhibitions shall be awarded by the Provost and Fellows in such manner and on such conditions as they shall from time to time determine for the encouragement of study and learning in the College. In the awarding of the Kay Exhibition no person shall be entitled to preference by reason of his place of birth."

And whereas in Statute VI, 10, it is enacted (inter alia): "The Provost and Fellows shall, subject to the provisions of the Universities Tests Act, 1871, provide religious instruction for all members of the College in statu pupillari."

And whereas in Statute VII, 2, it is enacted (inter alia): "The Vice-Provost shall be one of the three Senior Resident Fellows, and shall exercise, in the absence of the Provost, all the powers and authorities of the Provost."

And whereas it appears to us the said Provost and Fellows of the said College that it is desirable that the said Statutes shall be altered and amended in manner hereinafter appearing.

Now we, the Provost and Fellows of the said College, in exercise of the powers vested in us under and by virtue of the 54th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, do, by this present instrument under our Seal, alter and amend the Statutes of the said College as hereinbefore set out in manner following, that is to say:

In Statute II, 7, by substituting for the words "One thousand pounds" the words "Six hundred pounds, together with an amount equal to the emoluments of two Fellowships."

In Statute III, 1, by substituting for the word "nine" the word "six," and by omitting the words "less than £150 nor."

In Statute III, 6, by omitting the words "for two years" and also the words "during those years," and by inserting at the end of the same clause the words "Provided also that if any Fellow elected subject to this requirement shall decline or cease to take part in such educational work his Fellowship shall forthwith determine."

In Statute III, 9, by omitting the whole clause, and by substituting for it the words "There shall not be at any time in the College more than one Fellow elected or re-elected in respect of the Office of Professor or Public Reader in the University."

In Statute III, 13, by omitting at the end of the clause, the words, "A Fellow elected under this Clause shall not be reckoned in the number of four mentioned in Clause 9."

In Statute III, 17, by substituting for the words "Clause 7" the words "Clause 6 or 7" and by omitting the words "£3 per centum."

Exhibitioner, and two the Holford Exhibitioners. In Statute IV, 1, by omitting the whole clause, The Holford Exhibitions shall be awarded to persons duly qualified for election to Holford Exhibitions according to the instrument of Scholarships chargeable on the revenues of the

College, namely, not more than the following: five on the foundation of Sir Thomas Cookes, four on that of Mrs. Sarah Eaton, five on that of Dr. George Clarke, one on that of Dr. Finney, and three Scholarships to be called College Subject to this provision, the Scholarships. Provost and Fellows shall have power taking into account the financial resources of the College to regulate from time to time, at its discretion, the number of Scholarships on each foundation. Such Scholarships are exclusive of the Barnes Foundation, which (having been established within fifty years before the 10th day of August, 1877) shall continue to be governed by the terms of the original trust concerning the same.

In Statute IV, 3, by substituting for the words "six months" the words "twelve calendar months" in the first paragraph of the clause, and by omitting at the end of the clause the words "Provided also that, unless a Scholar declare his need of assistance at the University, he shall receive no more than £20 per aunum and free rooms," and by substituting the words "Provided also that if it shall appear to the Provost and Fellows that a Candidate for a Scholarship is not in need of assistance at the University, they may, in electing such a Candidate, make such diminution of the emoluments of the Scholarship as they shall think fit." Scholarship as they shall think fit.'

In Statute IV, 7, by substituting for the words "Scholarships established by the College" the words "College Scholarships."

In Statute V, by omitting the whole of the Statute and by substituting the following: "V. Exhibitions. The Provost and Fellows shall have power to award from the revenues of the College five or more Exhibitions of such value as they may from time to time determine. Three of these Exhibitions shall be called the Cookes Exhibitions, and two shall be called the Holford Exhibitions. The Holford Exhibitions Holford Exhibitions. shall be awarded to persons duly qualified for election to Holford Exhibitions according to the instrument of foundation, being otherwise qualified to be Exhibitioners of the College, if such persons shall present themselves, and in awarding the Cookes Exhibitions such persons educated wholly or in part at the Grammar educated wholly or in part at the Grammar School of King Edward VI at Bromsgrove, and not holding another Scholarship or Exhibition at the College, as may satisfy the Provost and Fellows that they are in need of assistance at the University, shall, if otherwise qualified, be entitled to a preference. Subject to the foregoing provisions, the Exhibitions shall be awarded by the Provost and Fellows on such conditions as they may from time to time determine for the encouragement of study and learning in the College. Any other Exhibitions established in the College by special gift or bequest, such as the Kay Exhibition and the Warner Exhibitions, shall be awarded in accordance with the conditions, if any, of such gift or bequest; provided that in the awarding of the Kay Exhibition no person shall be entitled to preference by reason of his place of birth."

In Statute VII, 2, by omitting the words "shall be one of the three Senior Resident Fellows and."

And whereas by Article 153 of the said Order provision was made for the appointment by the said Guardians of persons to hold certain offices in the said Workhouse, including the office of Nurse, and by Articles 155 and 172 of such Order it was further directed that every such appointment should be reported to the Poor Law Commissioners, and that the Guardians should pay to the officers so appointed such salaries or remuneration as the said Commissioners might from time to time direct or approve;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made with regard to the appointment of persons to hold the office of Nurse at the

said Workhouse:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order and Direct that, notwithstanding anything contained in the above-cited Order, if the Guardians of the Poor of the said Union shall submit to Us for Our approval a Statement showing the total number of persons which the said Guardians consider it necessary to appoint to hold the office of Nurse at the said Workhouse, and the salaries or scale of salaries to be assigned to such Nurses, and We approve such Statement, it shall not be necessary for the said Guardians to report to Us each appointment under the said Order of a person to hold the office of Nurse in the said Workhouse, nor to obtain Our approval to the remuneration of any such person, so long as the number of persons so appointed and their salaries do not exceed the number of persons and the scale of salaries shown in the said Statement and approved by Us:

Provided as follows:-

L.S.

(1.) This Order shall not apply to the appointment of any Superintendent Nurse appointed subject to the provisions of the Nursing in Workhouses Order, 1897.

(2.) A person who has not reached the age of twenty-one years shall not be employed in

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 21st APRIL 1904.)

PETERHEAD (PARASITIC MANGE) ORDER OF 1904.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Separation of Diseased and Suspected Animals and Notice of Disease.

(1.) Every person having in his possession the Poor of the Bolton Union (amongst others), I or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange shall (a) as far as practicable keep that animal separate from animals not so affected or suspected; and (b) with all practicable speed give notice of the factof the horse, ass, or mule being so affected or suspected to a constable of the police force for the police area in which the horse, ass, or mule so affected or suspected is.

(2.) The constable receiving such notice shall forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority, who shall forthwith report the same

to the Local Authority.

Duty of Inspector to act immediately.

2. An Inspector of the Local Authority on receiving in any manner whatsoever information of the supposed existence of parasitic mange, or having reasonable ground to suspect the existence of parasitic mange, shall proceed with all practicable speed to the place where such disease, according to the information received by him, exists, or is suspected to exist, and shall see that the provisions of this Order are complied with.

Treatment for Parasitic Mange.

3.—(1.) A person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with parasitic mange, shall from time to time as often as may be necessary, treat that horse, ass or mule, or cause it to be treated, with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange.

(2.) If any person fail to comply with the requirements of this Article he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection.

4.—(1.) The Local Authority may, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of parasitic mange, make Regulations for the following pur-

poses, or any of them:

(a.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of any place used by, and of utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things used for or about, any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange:

(b.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and disinfection are to be

effected:

(c.) For requiring the owner, lessee, or occupier of any such place to cleanse and disinfect any such place, utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things, at the expense of the Local Authority, or at the expense of such owner, lessee, or

occupier.

(2.) If any person fail to cleanse and disinfect any place or any utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place or such utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, to be cleansed and disinfected, and to recover summarily the expenses of such cleansing and disinfection from such person.

(3.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of a Regulation of the Local Authority made under this Order, the owner and the lessee and the occupier of any place in or in respect of which the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of

1894.

Occupiers to give facilities for Cleansing.

5.—(1.) Where the power of causing any place to be cleansed and disinfected under this Order is exercised by the Local Authority, the owner, lessee, or occupier thereof shall give all reasonable facilities for that purpose.

(2.) If any person fail to comply with the requirements of this Article he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.

6.—(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board two copies of every Regulation made by them under this Order.

(2.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry, with respect to any Regulation made by the Loca Authority under this Order, that the same is for any reason objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

7. Horses, asses, and mules shall be animals, and parasitic mange of horses, asses, and mules (in this Order called parasitic mange) shall be a disease for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Section forty-three (powers of police);
Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);
and also for the purposes of all other sections of
the said Act containing provisions relative to or
consequent on the provisions of those sections
and this Order, including such sections as relate
to offences or procedure.

Exemption of Army Veterinary Department and Veterinary Colleges.

8. Nothing in this Order applies to any horse, ass, or mule kept in stables of military barracks or camps under the care and supervision of the Army Veterinary Department, or in stables of any Veterinary College affiliated to the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons.

Interpretation.

9. In this Order-

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Extent.

10. This Order extends to the burgh of Peterhead only.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day of April, nineteen hundred and four.

Short Title.

12. This Order may be cited as the PETERHEAD (PARASITIC MANGE) ORDER of 1904.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement of Swine into out of or within Scheduled District.

1. No swine shall be moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along over or across a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District where they are moved through such District to another place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within such District.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

3.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person

for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the Mansfield and District (Swine-Fever) Prohibition of Movement Order of 1904.
