PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and twenty-four duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-fourth day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and four, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and twenty-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage of the benefice (being a rectory) of Saint Thomas, Haverfordwest, in the county of Pembroke, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint Mary, Cardigan, in the county of Cardigan, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Fishguard, in the county of Pembroke, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint Dogmaels with the vicarage of Llantwyd annexed, in the county of Cardigan, the benefice (being a rectory) of Loughor, in the county of Glamorgan, and the benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint Ishmaels with All Saints Llansaint and Ferryside, in the county of Carmarthen (all which six benefices are the same as and are hereinafter referred to as the six benefices described in the first part of the schedule hereto), for the patronage of the benefice (being a rectory) of Llandyrnog, in the county of Denbigh, the benefice (being a rectory) of Saint Mary, Derwen,

in the county of Denbigh, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Kerry, in the county of Montgomery, and the benefice (being a rectory) of Llandysilio, in the county of Montgomery (all which four last-mentioned benefices are the same as and are hereinafter referred to as the four benefices described in the second part of the schedule hereto).

“Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the six benefices described in the first part of the schedule hereto is vested in Your Majesty Your Heirs and Successors in right of the Crown and such right of patronage or presentation is exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being.

“And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the four benefices described in the second part of the schedule hereto is vested in the Bishop of Saint David's for the time being.

“And whereas the Right Honourable Hardinge Stanley, Earl of Halsbury, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, and the Right Reverend John, now Bishop of Saint David's, have respectively signified to us their desire that the patronage of the said ten benefices described in the first and second parts of the schedule hereto may be rearranged by way of exchange in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

“And whereas we have made due enquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative values of the said ten benefices and of the patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said ten benefices are set forth in the first and second parts of the schedule hereto, and that the yearly value of each of the said ten benefices in Your Majesty's Books is that which is stated in the same schedule.
