#### ALIEN.

Regulations dated the 29th of April, 1904, made by the Secretary of State for the Home Department for carrying into effect the provisions of the Naturalization Acts.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by the Naturalization Acts, 1870 to 1895, and with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, I hereby make the following Regulations:—

- 1. No Fee shall be taken for granting a Certificate of Naturalization and for registering the same together with the oath of allegiance in the case of an Alien residing in the United Kingdom and serving on British Ships.
- 2. These Regulations shall take effect as from the 30th of April, 1904; and so much of the Regulation of the 1st February, 1872, as relates to Fees shall be deemed to be modified accordingly.
- 3. The Regulations dated the 20th October, 1897, and the 4th August, 1903, are hereby annulled.

#### FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

In pursuance of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, at the expiration of 40 days from the publication of this notice, to make an Order under section 40 (4) of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, extending the exceptions in that section which permit young persons to have the meal hours at different times, and to remain during process is being carried on, to male young persons employed in iron and steel foundries in the United Kingdom, and repealing the Order of the 14th July, 1903, which related to iron and steel foundries in Scotland.
