## WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Somerset) Order, 1904.

Dated 30th April, 1904.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1902, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Somerset, I hereby make the following Order:—

### *Title.*

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Somerset) Order, 1904."

### BIRDS.

#### *Close Time Extended.*

II. The time during which the killing or taking of the Sheldrake or Burrow Duck is prohibited within the Administrative County of Somerset, shall be extended so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of September in any year.

#### *Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.*

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of

Somerset to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hobby, Kestrel, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Osprey, Ring Ousel, Water Ousel or Dipper, Meadow Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Great Grey Shrike, Red-backed Shrike, Swallow, Swift, Blue Tit, Cole Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Grey Wagtail, Grey-headed Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Blue-throated Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wheatear, White-throat, Lesser Whitethroat, Common Wren, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wood Wren or Wood Warbler, Wryneck.

*Certain Birds Protected during the whole of the Year.*

IV. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the Administrative County of Somerset:—Bittern, Little Bittern, Common Buzzard, Rough-legged Buzzard, Chough, Crossbill, Dotterel, Peregrine Falcon, Bar-tailed Godwit, Black-tailed Godwit, Goldfinch, Dusky Grebe, Great-crested Grebe, Little Grebe, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Merlin, Nightjar, Osprey, Ring Ousel, Brown Owl, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, White Owl or Barn Owl, Oystercatcher, Raven, Redshank, Spotted Redshank, Redstart, Black Redstart, Siskin, Spoonbill, Black Tern, Common Tern, Lesser Tern, Grey Wagtail, Grey-headed Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Green Woodpecker, Great-spotted Woodpecker, Lesser-spotted Woodpecker, Common Wren, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren.

*All Birds Protected during the whole of the Year in certain Areas.*

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended so far as the Sheldrake is concerned by Clause II of this Order does not extend, the killing or taking of all Wild Birds is prohibited on the beach, shore, or foreshore in the parishes of East Quantoxhead, West Quantoxhead, Dunster, and Carhampton, and on so much of the beach, shore, or foreshore in the parish of Old Cleeve, as lies to the west of a line drawn due north from a rock known as "Grey Rock" at Blue Anchor Point (the total length proposed to be protected being six miles and a half).

**Eggs.**

*All Eggs Protected in certain Areas.*

VI. The taking or destroying of the Egg or Eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited on the foreshore, beach, shore, or cliffs within the distance of 50 yards measured inland throughout from the top edge of the cliffs, and from the inland edge of the shore or beach where there is no cliff, between Sparkhayes-lane, in the Parish of Luccombe, in the County of Somerset, on the west, and Shurton Bars, in the Parish of Stogursey, in the said County, on the east.

*Duration of Order.*

VII. This Order shall not remain in force after the expiration of five years from the date thereof.

*Repeal of former Order.*

VIII. The Order of the 9th May, 1899, is hereby repealed.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated April 8, from His Majesty's Representative at Panama, intimating that, owing to an outbreak of bubonic plague at Lima, all vessels arriving at Panama from Peru, have been ordered to undergo fumigation and quarantine for five days, irrespective of the ports in the latter Republic at which the vessels may have touched.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated April 22, from His Majesty's Representative at Trieste, enclosing the following translation of a Circular which has been issued by the Imperial and Royal Marine Board at Trieste respecting sanitary measures to be imposed on arrivals from South Africa:—

According to official information bubonic plague has broken out in an epidemic form at Johannesburg. This is made known to the port and sanitary offices and officers recalling to their special attention the instructions on treatment of vessels in case of plague published by Government Circular of June 17th, 1897, No. 5,684, and, considering the importance of the subject, to be most careful in the sanitary line with reference to arrivals from South Africa.
