Notice is hereby given that His Majesty The King will hold Levées at St. James's Palace on Monday, the 30th May, and on Tuesday, the 7th June next, at 12 o'clock noon, and that for these and all future Levées Cards of Admission will be required, as the numbers at each of these Ceremonies must be limited.

The following are the rules to be observed:

ATTENDANCES AND PRESENTATIONS.

1. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, of whatever rank, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty. All Civil Officers of the Admiralty will follow the same rule.

2. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Army, Militia, Yeomanry, or Volunteers, of whatever rank, except those on the Indian and Colonial Establishments, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Adjutant-General at the War Office.

3. All Officers of the Indian Civil Service and of the Indian Army, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.

4. All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the Colonies possessing responsible Government, who will apply to the War Office for their cards for attendance or for presentation by the Adjutant - General. The application must in all cases be supported by a credential from the Governor or Officer commanding the local Forces of the Colony.

5. Similarly, all Gentlemen connected with the Foreign Office, the Home Office, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament or any Government Department, will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation at Levées from the Department under which they serve.

6. Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel, and all Legal Officials holding appointments under the Crown, are requested to make their applications through the Secretary to the Lord Chancellor.

7. Peers, Bishops, Members of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all Gentlemen other than the above mentioned, will be good enough to communicate with the Lord Chamberlain at St. James's Palace, when they will each be furnished with a card of admission for use at the Levée.

In the case of the Levée to be held on the 30th instant all names, both for attendance and presentation, must be received at the various offices not later than Wednesday, the 25th instant.

For the Levée to be held on the 7th June the names, both for attendance and presentation, must be received at the various Offices above indicated not later than eight days prior to the date of the Levée, except in the case of Officers who make application to the War Office, where, owing to the great number of applications to be dealt with, fourteen days' notice will be required.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the fifth year of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria (Session two) chapter twenty-six, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheine bearing date the twenty-eighth day of April, in the year one thousand nine hundred and four, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the fifth year of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria (Session two) chapter twenty-six, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing certain additions and improvements at the episcopal house of residence belonging to the See of Manchester.

"Whereas the Right Reverend Edmund Arbuthnott now Bishop of the diocese of Manchester is desirous that certain alterations and improvements should be made at the said episcopal house of residence and has submitted to us the particulars of such proposed alterations and improvements and we have approved the

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the said proposed alterations and improvements a sum of two thousand five hundred pounds (being a sum which in addition to the balance outstanding of the sum of one thousand two hundred pounds previously borrowed upon the same security by the Bishop of the diocese of Manchester under the authority of the Statutes hereinbefore mentioned does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by the borrowing of such sum by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Bishoprick of Manchester.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Edmund Arbuthnott, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (testified by his having affixed his signature and episcopal seal to this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorized to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above-mentioned Acts any further sum not exceeding two thousand five hundred pounds and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and

ments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by deed for the term of twenty-two years or until the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid with the interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following: that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of twelve months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of twelve months so computed and at the end of every such like period of twelve months thereafter pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one-twentieth part of the said principal sum until the whole thereof shall be repaid and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of twelve months computed as aforesaid pay interest at the rate of four pounds per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid, and that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of forty days after the same shall become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale and that such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and shall bind as well the said Edmund Arbuthnott now Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester as every succeeding Bishop of the same diocese until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be paid to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and that the receipt of our Joint Treasurers for the time being indorsed on the said mortgage deed shall be a good and sufficient discharge of the said Governors and their successors for the same who shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof, and that upon the receipt of the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed additions and improvements at the said episcopal house of residence.

"And we further recommend and propose that the Bishop of Manchester for the time being shall insure against loss or damage by fire and keep insured the said episcopal house of residence the said insurance to be for a sum of not less than ten thousand pounds and to be effected in one or more of the public offices of insurance in London or Westminster to be approved by us and that in case of loss or damage by fire to the same episcopal house of residence the moneys receivable in respect of the said insurance shall be paid over to us by the said. Bishop and shall with any interest or accumulations thereon be applied by us in rebuilding or repairing the same episcopal house of residence with the concurrence of the said Bishop.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the thirtythird and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter thirty-nine and of the Acts therein mentioned that is to say the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Saint John the Baptist, Foord, in the county of Kent, and in the diocese of Canterbury.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of saint John the Baptist, Foord, is vested in the vicar or incumbent for the time being of the vicarage of the new parish of Christ Church, Folkestone, in the said county of Kent, and in the said diocese of Canterbury.

"And whereas the Reverend Henry Legh Richmond Deck, Clerk in Holy Orders, now vicar or incumbent of the said vicarage of Christ Church, Folkestone, is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint John the Baptist, Foord, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in

the Reverend Hanmer William Webb-Peploe, a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London, and Vicar of the Vicarage of Saint Paul, Onslow-square, in the city of Westminster, the Reverend James Hardy Honeyburne, Clerk in Holy Orders, an Honorary Canon of Liverpool, of Abbotsbury, Number 23, Duke-street, Southport, in the county of Lancaster, John Henry Buxton, of Hunsdon Bury, Ware, in the county of Hertford, Esquire, Edward Hildred Carlile, of Helme Hall, Huddersfield, in the county of York, Esquire, and the Reverend Richard Gooch Fowell, Clerk in Holy Orders, Secretary of the Church Pastoral Aid Society, Falcon-court, Fleet-street, in the city of London, and their heirs and assigns.

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, now Archbishop of Canterbury has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned in token that such transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made

necessary.

"And whereas in consideration of the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Saint John the Baptist, Foord, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed a sum of five hundred pounds has been paid to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England for the augmentation of the endowment of the said benefice of Saint John the Baptist, Foord, and this circumstance will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the new parish of Saint John the Baptist, Foord.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Legh Richmond Deck (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his archiepiscopal seal) and with the consent of the said Hanmer William Webb-Peploe, James Hardy Honeyburne, John Henry Buxton, Edward Hildred Carlile, and Richard Gooch Fowell (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted ()rder the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint John the Baptist, Foord, now vested in the vicar or incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of Christ Church, Folkestone, as aforesaid, shall be transferred from him to the said Hanner William Webb-Peploe, James Hardy Honeyburne John Henry Buxton, Edward Hildred Carlile, and Richard Gooch Fowell, and their heirs and assigns, and shall thereupon and theuceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Hanner William Webb-Peploe, James Hardy Honeyburne, John Henry Buxton, Edward Hildred Carlile and Richard Gooch Fowell, and their heirs and assigns for ever.

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district or new parish for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the parish of Watford, and partly out of the particular district of Saint Andrew, Watford, both in the county of Hertford, and in the diocese of Saint Albans.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said parish of Watford and the said particular district of Saint Andrew, Watford, are cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Watford and of the said particular district of Saint Andrew, Watford, which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is within the limits of the said proposed separate district or new parish a consecrated church in use for the purpose of Divine worship, and such church is named 'The Church of Saint John, Watford.'

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a sum of five thousand pounds sterling towards providing an endowment for the said proposed district or new parish, and we have in respect of the said sum of five thousand pounds sterling agreed and have undertaken to pay by equal quarterly payments on the first day of

and every year to the minister or Incumbent of the said proposed district or new parish and to his successors a sum of one hundred and fifty pounds per annum so long as the said capital sum of five thousand pounds shall remain in our hands.

"And whereas the said capital sum of five thousand pounds sterling has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage to the said proposed district or new parish should be assigned in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

'And whereas the contributors of the said sum of five thousand pounds have nominated the Bishop of Saint Albans for the time being as the person in whom they desire that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or new

parish shall be vested.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Edgar Bishop of Saint Albans (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said parish of Watford and of the said particular district of Saint Andrew Watford which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district or new parish for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named The New Parish of Saint John, Watford.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said church of Saint John Watford shall as from the day last mentioned be and for that purpose we hereby specify the same church as the parish church of the said new parish of Saint

John Watford.

"And we further recommend and propose with the consent of the said Edgar Bishop of the said diocese of Saint Albans (testified as aforesaid) that without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or new parish that is to say of the new parish of Saint John Watford aforesaid and of the nomination of the minister or Incumbent thereto shall be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Edgar Bishop of Saint Albans and his successors in the same Bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of

Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The New Parish of Saint John Watford comprising :-

"(1.) All that portion of the parish of Watford in the county of Hertford and in the diocese of Saint Albans which is bounded upon the northwest and upon the north-east by the particular district of Saint Andrew Watford, upon the south-east by the parish of Bushey, both in February, the first day of May, the first day of I the said county and diocese and upon the

remaining sides that is to say upon the south and upon the south-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Bushey from the said parish of Watford at the centre of the bridge which carries Water-lane across the old course of the River Colne and extending thence first north-westward, then south-westward and then westward along the middle of Water-lane for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lower Derby-road and extending thence northeastward along the middle of Lower Derby-road for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with Derby-road and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Derby-road for a distance of seventeen chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Loates-lane and Beechen Grove-road and extending thence northwestward along the middle of Beechen Groveroad for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath which runs past the northern side of the Beechen Grove Sunday School to Meeting-alley and extending thence westward to and along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of two chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Meeting-alley and extending thence northward along the middle of Meeting-alley for a distance of eighteen yards or thereabouts to a point opposite the wall forming the boundary between the premises of the Watford Agricultural Hall and the premises of the Beechen-grove Baptist Chapel and extending thence north-west-ward to and along the said boundary wall for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to the point where such wall meets the eastern side of Clarendon-road and extending thence first northwestward to and then south-westward along the middle of Clarendon-road for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Highstreet and extending theoce north-westward along the middle of High-street for a distance of twenty-one chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Saint Albans-road upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Watford from the said particular district of Saint Andrew Watford.

"(2.) And also all that portion of the said particular district of Saint Andrew Watford which is bounded upon the south-west by the above described portion of the parish of Watford and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the north-east upon the north and upon the north-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Watford from the said particular district of Saint Andrew Watford at the centre of the bridge which carries the main line of the London and North-Western Railway across the middle of Loates-lane and extending thence north-west-ward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of eighteen chains and a half or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such line of railway across the middle of Saint John's-road and extending thence first south-westward and then north-westward along the middle of Saint John's-road for a distance of twenty-seven chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Saint Albans-road and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Saint Albans-road for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said particular district of Saint Andrew Watford from the said parish of Watford."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures out of which it is intended that the district

recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken.

And whereas the Incumbents and some of the patrons of the said cures have respectively signified their assent to such scheme or offered no objection thereto.

And whereas the remaining patrons of the said cures have offered certain objections to the same scheme.

And whereas notwithstanding these objections the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint Albans.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for apportioning the income of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint Andrew, Kinson, in the county of Dorset, and in the diocese of Salisbury, between that benefice and the benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint Clement, Branksome, in the said county of Dorset, and in the said diocese of Salisbury.

"Whereas the patronage of the said benefice of Saint Andrew, Kinson, and of the said benefice of Saint Clement, Branksome, is vested in the Right Honourable Ivor Bertie, Baron Wimborne, and his heirs and assigns.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said benetice of Saint Clement, Branksome, is at present insufficiently endowed and that the said benefice of Saint Andrew, Kinson, has endowments of such an amount that after the apportionment hereinafter recommended and proposed to be made shall have been made the said benefice of Saint Andrew, Kiuson, will still be sufficiently endowed.

"And whereas we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the new parish of Saint Clement Branksome aforesaid, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Saint Andrew, Kinson, which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

· "And whereas the said benefice of Saint Andrew, Kinson, is now full, the Incumbent being the Reverend Arnold Mortimer Sharp,

"And whereas the said Arnold Mortimer Sharp is consenting that the apportionment hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take place as from the day hereinafter mentioned in that behalf.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bishop of Salisbury acting as Bishop of the diocese within which each of the said two benefices is situate (in testimony of which consent he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) and with the consent of the said Ivor Bertie, Baron Wimborne, acting as the patron of each of the said two benefices as aforesaid (in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Arnold Mortimer Sharp (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and as from the day of the date on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette all that sum of seven hundred pounds five pounds per centum debenture stock of the Poole Waterworks Company held by us for the benefit of the Incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Saint Andrew, Kinson, as part of the endowments of such benefice, and also all that capital sum of seven hundred pounds granted by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England to the Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Andrew, Kinson, by an Instrument dated the twenty-seventh day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three and published in the London Gazette on the fourth day of the following month shall be transferred by way of apportionment from the said benefice of Saint Andrew, Kinson, and shall be annexed to and form part of the endow-ments of the said benefice of Saint Clement, Branksome.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of

Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Salisbury.

"That there is in the county of York and diocese of York the parish of the vicarage of Elloughton which comprises the township of Wauldby the boundaries whereof are well known

and defined.

"That there is also in the same county and diocese the parish of the vicarage of Welton-with-Melton which adjoins the said township of Wauldby.

"That according to the last census the population of the said parish of Elloughton was 973 persons and that of the said parish of Welton-with-Melton was 787 persons and that of the said township of Wauldby was 50 persons.

""That the net annual value of the said vicarage of Elloughton is £311 and that of the said Welton with-Melton is £400 or vicarage of thereabouts

"That the patronage of the said vicarage of Elloughton is vested in the said Archbishop in right of his Archbishopric and that the Reverend Sidney John Soady M.A. is the present vicar

"That the patronage of the said vicarage of Welton-with-Melton is vested in Henry Broadley Harrison-Broadley of Welton House in the said county of York Esquire and the Reverend James Raine B.A. is the present vicar thereof.

"That the said patrons and incumbents are consenting parties to the separation and annexa-

tion hereinafter proposed.

"That it appears to the said Archbishop that under the provisions of the said Act of Parliament the said township of Wauldby may be advantageously separated from the parish of Elloughton aforesaid to which it at present belongs and be united for ecclesiastical purposes to the parish of Welton-with-Melton aforesaid.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the before-mentioned Act the Archbishop has prepared a scheme in writing appended to this report describing the mode in which it appears to him the alterations above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereupon in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect of patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such scheme he doth by this report to Your Majesty in Council certify the same to Your Majesty in Council with the consents in writing to the said scheme of the patrons and incumbents of the parishes to be affected to the intent that Your Majesty in Council in case it shall be thought expedient and proper so to do may make an Order for carrying such scheme into effect.

"As witness the hand of the said Archbishop this ninth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and four.

" SCHEME.

"That the vicar of the parish of Elloughton shall cease to have cure of souls within the said township of Wauldby and the vicar of the parish of Welton-with-Melton shall have exclusive charge and cure of souls within the limits of

such township.

"That the inhabitants of the said township of Wauldby shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the parish church of Elloughton or any other church or chapel now or hereafter to be erected within that parish but shall be liable as other inhabitants of the parish of Welton-with-Melton for the repair of the parish church of Welton-with-Melton,

"That the inhabitants of the said township of Wauldby shall have the same rights as to pews and the performance of all offices and services of the church at the said parish church of Weltonwith-Melton and otherwise in relation to the

said church as the other inhabitants of the said parish of Welton-with-Melton.

"That the fees for all such offices and services. performed for the inhabitants of the said township of Wauldby as aforesaid or arising within the limits of the same and usually payable to the incumbent of a benefice shall belong to and be received by the incumbent of the benefice of Welton-with-Melton aforesaid.

"That no alteration shall be made as to the patronage or endowment of either of the said two benefices to be affected by this scheme.

"We William Dalrymple by Divine providence Lord Archbishop of York Primate of England and Metropolitan the patron or person entitled to present to the vicarage and parish church of Elloughton in the county of York within our diocese and jurisdiction in case the same were now vacant and the Reverend Sidney John Soady M.A. the present vicar of the said vicarage and we Henry Broadley Harrison-Broadley of Welton House in the county of York Esquire, the patron or person entitled to present to the vicarage and parish church of Welton-withvicarage and parish church of Welton-with-Melton in the same county and diocese in case the same were now vacant and the Reverend James Raine B.A. the present vicar of the same vicarage do hereby respectively signify our assent to the foregoing report and scheme and the several matters and things therein stated and proposed.

Now therefore His Majesty by virtue and in exercise of the powers on this behalf by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act 1850" or otherwise in His Majesty vested is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order and it is

hereby ordered as follows:-

I. For the purposes of this Order the expression "Crown Lands" means the lands abandoned as aforesaid by the Chiefs Khama Sebele and Bathoen to wit the lands bounded on the west by the native Reserves of the Bangwaketsi the Bakwena and the Bamangwato on the north by the Shashi River on the east by the Transvaal.

and on the south by the territory of the Baralongs always excepting the territories of the Chiefs Moghosi of the Bamaliti and Linchwe of the Bakhatla, all of which native reserves and territories have been or shall be more particularly described in Proclamations of His Majesty's High Commissioner for South Africa.

High Commissioner for South Africa.

II. All rights of His Majesty in or in relation to any Crown Lands shall vest in and may be exercised by His Majesty's High Commissioner for South Africa for the time being on behalf of

His Majesty.

III. The High Commissioner may make grants or leases of any Crown Lands on such terms and conditions as he may think fit subject to any directions received from one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

IV. This Order may be cited as the Bechuanaland Protectorate (Lands) Order in Council 1904.

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that it is expedient to make Regulations for the maintenance of good order among the sea fishing boats and the persons belonging thereto, which resort to Balta Sound, in the Island of Unst, Zetland, and to impose fines not exceeding ten pounds for the breach of such

Regulations.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in exercise of the powers vested in him by the said recited Act, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to make the Regulations which are set out in the Schedule annexed hereto, and to direct that the same shall come into and be in force on and after the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and four, and doth hereby impose a fine not exceeding ten pounds for any breach thereof.

1. For the purposes of this Order Balta Sound shall be described as the sheltered water area

6. Masters and owners of vessels shall comply with any requisition made by any officer of a Government Department or Sea Fishery officer with the view of relieving congestion of traffic and maintaining a fairway in the Sound.

hundred and four, and doth hereby impose a fine not exceeding ten pounds for any breach
