INSTRUMENT substituting the New Church of Saint Swithin, situate within the parish of Saint Swithin, Lincoln, in the county of Lincoln, and in the diocese of Lincoln, for the Old Church of Saint Swithin, formerly situate within and having been the Parish Church of the same parish, but now pulled down.

To all to whom these presents shall come the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England send greeting.

WHEREAS a new church has lately been built within the parish of Saint Swithin, Lincoln, in the county of Lincoln, and in the diocese of Lincoln, and has been consecrated and dedicated to Saint Swithin.

And whereas the Right Reverend Edward Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln as such Bishop and also as the patron in right of his See of the vicarage of the said parish of Saint Swithin, Lincoln, and the Reverend Walter Wanstall, a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Lincoln, as the Vicar or Incumbent of the said vicarage, have by an Instrument under their hands bearing date on or about the twenty-fifth day of April, in the year one thousand nine hundred and four, certified to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England that it would be for the convenience of the said parish of Saint Swithin, Lincoln, that the said new church of Saint Swithin, situate within such parish, should be substituted for the old parish church (also dedicated to Saint Swithin) of the same parish.

Now, therefore, we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in exercise and execution of the power or authority in that behalf contained in the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, and in the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of all other powers or authorities in anywise enabling us in the same behalf, do by this Instrument, under our common seal, with the consents (testified as hereinafter mentioned) of the said Edward Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln, and of the said Walter Wanstall, hereby declare that the said new church of Saint Swithin, situate within the said parish of Saint Swithin, Lincoln and duly consecrated as aforesaid, shall be and the same is hereby substituted for the said old parish church (dedicated to Saint Swithin as aforesaid) of the same parish, and that such new church shall henceforth be the parish church of the said

parish of Saint Swithin, Lincoln, in lieu of the said old parish church of Saint Swithin, as fully in all respects as if the said new church of Saint Swithin so hereby substituted had been originally the parish church of the same parish. And we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and with such consents as aforesaid (testified as hereinafter mentioned), do hereby transfer all the endowments, emoluments, and rights of or belonging to the said old parish church (dedicated to Saint Swithin as aforesaid) of the said parish of Saint Swithin, Lincoln, or of or belonging to the Vicar or Incumbent thereof, to the said new church of Saint Swithin (now being by virtue of these presents the parish church of the said parish of Saint Swithin, Lincoln) and to the Vicar or Incumbent thereof and his successors for ever.

In witness whereof to these presents we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have set our common seal, and the said Edward, Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln, has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal, and the said Walter Wanstall has set his hand and affixed his seal this fifth day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and four.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY  
BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Wednesday, the 25th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, 52 Vic., cap. 6, and 4 Edw. VII, c. 1, to the amount of £2,500,000, of which £1,000,000 will be in replacement of Bills falling due on the 28th instant, and £1,500,000 will be an issue under the Act, 4 Edw. VII, c. 1.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000, and will be dated the 28th May, 1904. Bills for £1,000,000 will be payable at twelve months after date, viz.:—on the 28th May, 1905. Bills for £1,500,000 will be payable at nine months after date, viz.:—on the 28th February, 1905.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Thursday, the 26th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than twelve o'clock, on Saturday, the 28th instant.

6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
