LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.

Additional Rule dated May, 1904, made by the Board of Trade with respect to the Notices to be given and Deposits made in cases where alterations of work are proposed during Progress of Application.

Where an application for an Order authorizing a light railway has been made to the Light Railway Commissioners and the Promoters communicate to the said Commissioners their desire to make any additions to or alterations in the line of the railway or the works thereof or the lands to be taken as respectively proposed under such application, and such desired additions or alterations are not of such extent or character as to make it inconvenient or inadvisable in the opinion of the Commissioners that the same should be dealt with under the said application, the Promoters shall, with the consent of the Commissioners given at any time before the said application has been decided on by them, publish such advertisements and give such notices and make such deposits (including any lists and statements required under Rules 32 and 33 of the Board of Trade Rules 1898) as would have been requisite under the said Rules if such additions or alterations had formed the subject of a separate

6. Near a bridge, named Aveugle, a green fixed dioptric light (unwatched) will be established at an elevation of 23 feet above high water, or 19 feet above the ground. It will be shown from an iron column, painted white, erected at a distance of about $13\frac{1}{2}$ cables S. $15^{\circ} W.$ from the Western Tower on the Casquets.

The rear red light will be visible in clear weather from a distance of 8 miles; the front lights, and the light on the western Casquet Tower, 4 miles; the rear green lights will be visible from a distance of 6 miles; the front lights, and light near Aveugle Bridge, 3 miles, the lights powers being with one exception under 100 candles.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Burton-upon-Trent, acting by the Council as a Local Authority for the district of the said borough, and as the Promoters of the tramways authorized to be constructed therein, have this day made the following Bye-laws with respect to tramways within the said Borough, under the provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, incorporated in the Burton-upon-Trent Corporation Act, 1901, and the Burton-upon-Trent Corporation Tramways Order, 1903, confirmed by the Tramways Orders Confirmation (No. 1) Act, 1903, that is to say:—

BOROUGH OF BURTON-UPON-TRENT TRAMWAYS.

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

The Burton-upon-Trent Corporation Act, 1901, the Burton-upon-Trent Corporation Tramways Order, 1903, confirmed by the Tramways Orders Confirmation (No. 1) Act, 1903, and the Tramways Act, 1870.

BURTON-UPON-TRENT CORPORATION TRAMWAYS.

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Burton-upon-Trent, acting by the Council as the Local Authority for the District of the said Borough, and as the Promoters of the Tramways authorized to be constructed therein, with respect to Tramways within the said Borough.

Interpretation.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the word "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Burton-upon-Trent; the word "Tramways" means the tramway system worked by the Corporation situate within the county borough of Burton-upon-Trent; the word "Car" means any carriage or car run upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers; the word "Conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having charge of or helping in the charge of a car; and the word "Driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a car.

Entering and Leaving Cars.

2. Every person shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindmost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor.

All persons desiring to mount a car for the purpose of travelling thereon, shall first permit all persons to alight who may be intending to do so.

Smoking.

3. No person shall smoke or carry lighted pipes, cigars, or cigarettes inside any car, except in a compartment specially set apart for the purpose. No person shall smoke on the outside of the car in front of the trolley standard.

Playing Musical Instruments.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while riding in or upon any car, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

Objectionable Persons.

5. Any person who is in a state of intoxication, or who from that or any other cause is in the opinion of the conductor unfit to be a passenger on a car, shall not be allowed to board or enter upon any car, and may be prevented from mounting or entering any car, and if any such person be found in or upon any car he or she shall be

requested by the conductor to leave the car, failing which it shall be lawful for the conductor or any other officer or servant of the Corporation to remove such person from the car.

Notice regarding Spitting.

6. No person shall spit in or upon any car.

Offensive Language or Conduct, &c.

7. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any car or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car or tramway station, or premises used in connection with the tramway system, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger. No person shall distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms, or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any car.

Damaging Cars.

8. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, for the amount of any damage so done.

Offensive Clothing.

9. Any person whose dress or clothing will, in the opinion of the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Corporation, soil or injure the seats, lining, or cushions of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or any person who may for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be allowed to enter or remain in or upon any car and may be prevented from mounting or entering such car, and any such person found in or upon any car shall, on the request of the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Corporation, leave the car upon the fare (if previously paid) being returned.

Payment of Fares.

10. Each passenger shall upon demand pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Corporation the fare legally payable for his journey and obtain a ticket therefor. Any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his journey.

No child under 3 years of age who is sitting on the lap of a passenger shall be liable to pay a fare, provided that this provision shall apply only to one such child accompanying any one passenger; any additional child, irrespective of age, accompanying such passenger shall pay the full fare legally demandable for the distance travelled by such child.

Tickets.

11. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his ticket to any officer or servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket, or in default thereof pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Tickets shall not be transferable, and shall only be available for the car on which they are issued.

Wrongful use of Workmen's Tickets.

12. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the Act of Parliament relating to the

Corporation, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

Luggage.

13. Any person about to enter or mount upon any car and having any luggage (including the tools of an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer), shall if so requested by the conductor place such luggage upon either of the platforms, and shall not take or place same in the interior or on the roof of the car unless permitted by the conductor so to do.

No person shall carry or deposit upon any car any luggage which shall cause hindrance or annoyance to passengers.

Travelling on Steps, &c.

14. No person not being an officer or servant of the Corporation shall travel or ride on the steps, platforms, outside rails, buffers, or guards of any car, and no person not being an officer or servant of the Corporation shall stand either on the platforms or in the interior of any car, or shall sit on the outside rail on the roof or any part of any car not intended for passengers, except in accordance with the regulations of the Corporation exhibited upon such car, and any person so travelling, riding, standing, or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor or other duly authorized servant of the Corporation.

Entering Full Cars.

15. When any car contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to carry, no additional person shall enter, board, or remain in or upon any such car. The conductor shall not permit any person beyond the licensed number of passengers to enter, board, or remain in or upon any part of a car. All such persons shall leave the car immediately upon the request of the conductor.

Disabled Cars.

16. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way injured, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be entitled to travel by the next available car the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares.

Interference with the Duties of the Conductor or Driver.

17. No person other than the conductor or driver shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a car or its equipments, or signal a car to start. Any person acting in contravention to this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

Entering or leaving a Car when in motion.

18. No person shall enter, board, or leave, or attempt to enter, board, or leave, any car whilst in motion.

Dogs.

19. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any car, except by permission of the conductor, or in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive

or an annoyance to passengers shall the same be allowed on the outside of any car. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or upon any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Firearms.

20. No person shall travel in or on any car with firearms, or dangerous articles or things, provided that nothing contained in this Bye-law shall apply to persons in the Naval, Military, Reserve, or Auxiliary Forces carrying unloaded firearms.

Obstructing Officers in exercising of their duty.

21. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Corporation.

Stations and Stopping Places.

22. It shall be lawful for the Corporation, from time to time, in such streets as they may think expedient, to appoint and vary junctions and stations and other places where the carriages shall start from or stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers, and it shall not be incumbent upon the conductor of a car to stop the same for the purpose of taking up or setting down passengers, except at such stations and stopping places.

Impeding Traffic.

23. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on any of the tramways of the Corporation.

Persons suffering from Disease not to travel on Cars.

24. No person afflicted with any infectious or contagious disease shall board, enter, or travel, on any car, or attempt so to do, and no driver or conductor shall wilfully or knowingly suffer or permit any such person so to do.

Power to remove Passengers committing offence.

25. Any person who shall commit, whilst on any car, any legal offence, or any breach of these Bye-laws, shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be immediately removed from the car, and if such person shall have paid his fare, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his fare so paid.

Conductors and Drivers to enforce Bye-laws.

26. Every conductor and driver shall to the best of his ability enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations, and prevent the breach thereof; and if any such conductor or driver fails to enforce the same as aforesaid, he shall be deemed to have committed a breach thereof.

Penalty.

27. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and, in the case of a continuing offence, to a penalty not exceeding ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

Copy of Bye-laws to be hung on Cars.

28. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

29. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the second day of August, 1904.

KING'S NORTON AND NORTHFIELD URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL.

The Tramway Act, 1870.

The King's Norton and Northfield Urban District Tramways Act, 1901.

Notice and Deposit of Lease by the Council as the Local Authority.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 19 of the Tramway Act, 1870, notice is hereby given, that it is the intention of the above named Council to grant a lease to the City of Birmingham Tramways Company Limited of certain tramways authorized to be constructed by the King's Norton and Northfield Urban District Tramways Act, 1901, and therein referred to as Tramways Nos. 3, 4, and 4a, such lease being for the term commencing as from the completion of the construction of the said tramways and expiring on the 30th June, 1911, at the following rent, namely:—

- (1) A yearly rent equal in amount to the sum of one pound per centum upon the total amounts from time to time expended by the Council in the construction of the leased tramways and in payment to the Corporation of Birmingham, pursuant to the said Act, of the cost of construction of the said tramway described in the said second part of the said schedule hereto and upon or in respect of the widening, alteration, or rebuilding of any bridges on county main roads within the said district which may be required to be widened, altered, or rebuilt under the provisions of section 38 of the said Act (the marginal note whereof is "for the protection of the County Council of Worcestershire"), and in executing or doing any other work, act, or thing necessary for the purpose of complying with the provisions of the said section, and in the acquisition of the land required as a site for, and the erection of, any waiting rooms, carriage houses, and sheds provided by the Council in pursuance of an agreement dated the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and three, and made between the Council of the one part and the Company of the other part, and in paying the fees and charges of the consulting engineer and of the clerk of the works from time to time retained or

employed by the Council in relation to the construction of the leased tramways and all other charges and expenses whatsoever of and incidental and in relation to the construction of the said tramways and the other matters in this Clause mentioned as ascertained and certified from time to time by the engineer for the time being of the Council (all which amounts so expended by the Council and certified as aforesaid are hereinafter referred to as "the Council's capital outlay").

- (2) Such further yearly sum as being accumulated at compound interest at the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, or if such sum in the opinion of the Council (regard being had to the securities in which they are authorized to make investments) will be insufficient for the purpose hereinafter mentioned then such sum as being accumulated at compound interest at the rate of two pounds seventeen shillings and sixpence per centum per annum would at the expiration of the period of forty years from the date or dates of borrowing the same be sufficient to discharge all moneys borrowed from time to time by the Council for the purpose of defraying the Council's capital outlay, provided that nothing in this sub-clause contained shall entitle the Company to call upon the Council nor shall the Council be required to actually invest the money in a sinking fund.
- (3) A further yearly sum equal in amount to the interest which the Council may have to pay upon the total amount from time to time of the moneys borrowed by the Council for the purpose of defraying the Council's capital outlay.
- (4) As an additional payment a sum of nine hundred and twenty-eight pounds per annum for the repair and maintenance by the Council of the track and track-paving of the tramways described in the first part of the said first schedule and the roadway along which the said tramway is laid in accordance with the covenant by the Council hereinafter contained.

The said proposed lease will also contain covenants and conditions of which the following is a description:—

Covenants by the Company.

- (1) As to payment of rent, &c.
- (2) As to working the said tramways.
- (3) As to provision and maintenance of a sufficient number of carriages of a design and construction to be approved by the Council, &c.
- (4) As to employment of drivers and conductors.
- (5) As to condition of carriages.
- (6) As to removal of unfit carriages.
- (7) As to the time and place for the performance of any other act necessary or auxiliary to the working of the tramways.
- (8) As to the use of motive power.
- (9) To comply with any Regulations made by the Council as to the carriage of goods.
- (10) To keep the rails clear for traffic.
- (11) To work the said tramways so as to cause as little wear and tear of the streets as possible.
- (12) To permit any person duly appointed by the Council to ride free of charge.
- (13) The Council to be at liberty to use the said tramways between the hours of midnight and five o'clock A.M. for sanitary purposes.

- (14) As to provision and service of workmen's cars and fares.
- (15) As to the use of patent rights held by the lessees.
- (16) As to stages and fares.
- (17) As to the publication of tables denoting the tolls and charges.
- (18) The Company not to interfere with the rails, wires, &c.
- (19) The Company to give notice to the Council if the rails of the tramways are not on a level with the surface of the road.
- (20) The Company to be liable for the wilful or negligent acts or defaults of their servants.
- (21) The Company not to assign or underlet without the consent of the Council.
- (22) The Company to maintain and keep in good order all car-sheds, waiting-rooms, cables, &c.
- (23) The Company to insure the waiting-rooms and car-sheds.
- (24) Proviso that the rights of the Company as to the user of the tramways shall be subject to the rights of the Council as the local or road authority.
- (25) Proviso as to grant of running powers to the Council.
- (26) The Company not to interfere with the servants or workmen of the Council engaged in executing any repairs to the tramways.
- (27) Proviso for re-entry on non-payment of rent.
- (28) Arbitration clause.
- (29) Proviso as to the breach by the Company of the clauses and conditions of the lease.
- (30) Proviso for re-entry on bankruptcy or winding-up of the Company.
- (31) As to generating stations.
- (32) Saving clause protecting rights of either party with regard to the existing tramways under section 43 of the Tramways Act, 1870.
- (33) Indemnity to the Council for any damage to or upon the said tramways.
- (34) As to delivery up of possession at expiration of lease.
- (35) As to the repair and maintenance of the permanent way.
- (36) As to the duties of the Council to duly perform and observe all duties and obligations imposed upon them by any Act or Order, Bye-law or Regulations (except those imposed by these presents upon the Company).
- (37) Covenant for quiet enjoyment.
