WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of London) Order, 1904.

Dated 27th June, 1904.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of London, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of London) Order, 1904."

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended, so far as concerns the County of London, so as to be between the last day of January and the 1st day of September in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County of London to the Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chaffinch, Hobby, Kestrel, Magpie, Martins, Merlin, Osprey, Shrikes, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed

Pheasant), and Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird), in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of February following, the killing or taking of any of the following kinds of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of London:—

Blackbird, Buntings, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chaffinch, Chiffchaff, Coot, Cuckoo, Flycatchers, Goldfinch, Gulls, Hedge Sparrow (or Dunnock), Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Landrail (or Corn-crake), Lark, Linnet, Magpie, Martins, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Osprey, Owls, Redstart, Robin (or Redbreast), Shrikes, Starling, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Thrushes, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Blue Tit, Cole Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Wagtails, Black-cap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Woodpeckers, Common Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

All Birds protected on Sundays in certain parishes.

V. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of February following, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited in the following parishes in the County of London:—

St. Marylebone; St. Pancras; Lambeth; St. George, Hanover-square; Islington, St. Mary; Shoreditch, St. Leonard; Paddington; St. Matthew, Bethnal Green; St. Mary, Newington; Camberwell; St. James, Westminster; St. James and St. John, Clerkenwell; Chelsea; Kensington, St. Mary Abbot; St. Luke, Middlesex; St. George the Martyr, Southwark; Bermondsey; St. George-in-the-East; St. Martin-in-the-Fields; Hamlet of Mile End Old Town; Woolwich; Rotherhithe; St. John, Hampstead; St. Mary, Whitechapel; Christchurch, Spitalfields; St. Botolph Without, Aldgate; Holy Trinity, Minorities; St. Katherine, Precinct of; Hamlet of Mile End New Town; Liberty of Norton Folgate; Old Artillery Ground; Tower, District of; St. Margaret, Westminster; St. John the Evangelist, Westminster; St. Paul, Deptford, including Hatcham; St. Nicholas, Deptford; Greenwich; Clapham; Tooting Graveney; Streatham; St. Mary, Battersea; Wandsworth; Putney, including Roehampton; Hackney; St. Mary, Stoke Newington; St. Giles-in-the-Fields; St. George, Bloomsbury; St. Andrew, Holborn above Bars; St. George the Martyr, Holborn; St. Sepulchre, Holborn; Saffron Hill, Hatton Garden, Ely Rents, and Ely-place; the Liberty of Glass House Yard; St. Anne, Soho; St. Paul, Covent Garden; St. John the Baptist, Savoy, or Precinct of the Savoy; St. Mary-le-Strand; St. Clement Danes; Liberty of the Rolls; St. Peter and St. Paul, Hammersmith; Fulham; St. Anne, Limehouse; St. John, Wapping; St. Paul, Shadwell; Hamlet of Ratchiff; All Saints, Poplar; St. Mary, Stratford-le-Bow; St. Leonard, Bromley; Christ Church, Southwark; St. Saviour (including the Liberty of the Clink); Charlton-next-Woolwich; Plumstead; Eltham; Kidbrooke; Lee; Lewisham, including Sydenham Chapelry; Hamlet of Penge; St. Olave, Southwark; St. Thomas, Southwark; St. John, Horselydown.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VI. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of London from the date of this Order:—

Blackbird, Buntings, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Coot, Cuckoo, Flycatchers, Goldfinch, Hawfinch, Hedge Sparrow (or Dunnock), Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Landrail (or Corncrake), Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Lark, Linnet, Magpie, Martins, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Osprey, Owls, Redstart, Robin (or Redbreast), Shrikes, Starling, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Thrushes, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Blue Tit, Cole Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Wagtails, Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Woodpeckers, Common Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Repeal of former Order.

VII. The Order of the 10th January, 1900, is hereby repealed.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 24TH JUNE 1904.)

DOVER AND DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER)
PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT ORDER
OF 1904.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement of swine into out of or within Scheduled District.

1. No swine shall be moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along over or across a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within such District.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

3.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the DOVER AND DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER) PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1904.
