The KING, taking into His Royal consideration, that upon the decease of Henry Hugh, Earl of Devon, which happened on or about the twentieth day of January last past, the dignity of Earl of Devon devolved upon Charles Pepys, now Earl of Devon, as eldest son and heir of Henry Reginald Courtenay, Esquire (commonly called Lord Courtenay), who, whilst living, was the eldest son and heir presumptive to the said Henry Hugh, Earl of Devon, and that according to the ordinary rules of honour the brothers and sisters of the said Charles Pepys, now Earl of Devon, cannot enjoy that place, rank, and precedence which would have been due to them had their father the said Henry Reginald Courtenay survived his father and thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl of Devon, His Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Henry Hugh Courtenay, Clerk in Holy Orders, and Frederick Leslie Courtenay, Clerk in Holy Orders, the only brothers of the said Charles Pepys, now Earl of Devon, and Amy Evelyn, wife of Reginald Henry Bertie (commonly called the Honourable Reginald Henry Bertie), Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Lieutenant-Colonel and Brevet Colonel Royal Welsh Fusiliers, and Caroline Elizabeth Courtenay, Spinster, the only sisters of the said Charles Pepys, now Earl of Devon, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the same title, place, rank, pre-eminence, and precedence, as if their late father Henry Reginald Courtenay (commonly called Lord Courtenay) had survived his father the said Henry Hugh, Earl of Devon, and had thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl of Devon.

Appointed Day.

Order made under Section 27 (2) of the Education Act, 1902.

Whereas by Sub-section (2) of Section 27 of the Education Act, 1902 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that the Act shall, except as expressly provided, come into operation on the appointed day, and the appointed day shall be the twenty-sixth day of March, nineteen hundred and three, or such other day, not being more than eighteen months later, as the Board of Education may appoint, and different days may be appointed for different purposes and for different provisions of the Act and for different Councils.

And whereas by an Order dated the sixteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and three, the Board of Education have fixed the first day of April, nineteen hundred and three, as the appointed day for the purposes of Sub-section (5) of Section 23 of the Act.

And whereas by an Order dated the eighteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and four, the Board of Education have fixed as the appointed day for the Council of the County Borough of

Swansea, for all other purposes and provisions of the Act the first day of July, nineteen hundred and four, or such later day or days as the Board might for any such other purpose or provision for the said Council thereafter appoint.

Now, therefore, the Board of Education, pursuant to the Act and to every other power enabling them in that behalf, hereby appoint as the appointed day for the said Council for all such other purposes and provisions the twenty-sixth day of September, nineteen hundred and four.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: District Auditors Act, 1879: Assignment of Duties and District (Supplemental):—

SOUTH-EASTERN COUNTIES AUDIT DISTRICT.

CITY OF CHICHESTER.

To Lawrance Hargreaves Wraith, District Auditor;—

To the Council of the City of Chichester;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign

to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas by an Order dated the 27th day of March, 1901, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of Lawrance Hargreaves Wraith as a District Auditor, and assigned to him the duties therein mentioned and the District in which he should act as Auditor, which District in the said Order was termed "The South-Eastern Counties Audit District";

And whereas the Council of the City of Chichester is an Authority the Accounts of whose

receipts and expenditure under the Education Act, 1902, are subject to be audited by a District Auditor;

And whereas it is desirable that the duty of auditing the Accounts of the Council of the said city and of their Officers, so far as those accounts relate to receipts and expenditure under the Education Act, 1902, be assigned to the said Lawrance Hargreaves Wraith:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall, until We otherwise Prescribe, be the duty of the said Lawrance Hargreaves Wraith to audit, in conformity with the provisions contained in Article II of the above-cited Order, the said Accounts of the said Council and of their Officers, and that the South-Eastern Counties Audit District shall, for that purpose, be deemed to comprise the City of Chichester.

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made under section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, by the Urban District Council of Twickenham, in the county of Middlesex, for the Tramways within their District.

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "car" shall mean any carriage using any tramway laid down within the said district, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of a car.

2. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than 50 yards, except in cases of emergency, when the driver shall comply with the directions given by the authority controlling traffic on the spot.

3. No car shall be stopped within a clear space of 15 yards of another car on a parallel line of rails, nor within a clear space of 15 yards of the intersection or junction of two or more streets or roads.

4. No driver or conductor shall needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

5. In cases where, by reason of the traffic, it becomes necessary for any car to cross over from one set of rails to the other, the car so crossing shall recross the roadway at the next practicable crossing.

6. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence, ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.
