LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.

Portsmouth and Hayling Light Railway Order.

The Light Railway Commissioners have submitted to the Board of Trade, for confirmation under the above-mentioned Act, an Order made by them authorizing the construction of a Light Railway in the Borough of Portsmouth and in the Rural District of Havant, in the County of Southampton, including a Conveyer Bridge over the Langstone Channel.

Any objections to the confirmation of the Order should be addressed to the Assistant-Secretary (Railway Department), Board of Trade, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W., and must be lodged with the Board on or before the 25th July, 1904. BOARD OF EDUCATION.

Appointed Day.

Order made under Section 27 (2) of the Education Act, 1902.

Whereas by Sub-section (2) of Section 27 of the Education Act, 1902 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that the Act shall, except as expressly provided, come into operation on the appointed day, and the appointed day shall be the twenty-sixth day of March, nineteen hundred and three, or such other day, not being more than eighteen months later, as the Board of Education may appoint, and different days may be appointed for different purposes and for different provisions of the Act and for different Councils.

And whereas by an Order dated the sixteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and three, the Board of Education have fixed the first day of April, nineteen hundred and three, as the appointed day for the purposes of Sub-section (5) of Section 23 of the Act.

And whereas by an Order dated the eighteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and four, the Board of Education have fixed as the appointed day for the Council of the County Borough of

Swansea, for all other purposes and provisions of the Act the first day of July, nineteen hundred and four, or such later day or days as the Board might for any such other purpose or provision for the said Council thereafter appoint.

Now, therefore, the Board of Education, pursuant to the Act and to every other power enabling them in that behalf, hereby appoint as the appointed day for the said Council for all such other purposes and provisions the twenty-sixth day of September, nineteen hundred and four.
