"We are happy to see that those who are responsible for carrying on the excellent work have shown, by their scheme for rebuilding the Hospital, their intention that the future of St. Bartholomew's shall not be unworthy of its fine traditions in the past.

"The names of the famous men educated here prove that an Institution of this kind is not merely a refuge for the suffering, but a school for the advancement of the science and practice of medicine; and in this way the influence of this and the other great Hospitals of this country extends beyond merely local limits to foreign countries and to the Colonies and Dependencies of Our Empire.

"We confidently believe that Our subjects—and especially the citizens of London—will not fail to show interest in the progress of the scheme for rebuilding the Hospital, nor allow that beneficent undertaking to be hindered by want of the necessary funds."
