The following Addresses were presented to His Majesty on the occasion of Their Majesties' visit to Liverpool, on Tuesday, the 19th instant, to lay the Foundation Stone of the new Cathedral:—

To His Most Excellent Majesty King Edward VII.

May it please Your Majesty,

We, Your Majesty's most loyal and dutiful subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Liverpool in Council assembled, humbly approach Your Majesty with the dutiful homage of ourselves and of the loyal community we represent, and desire to express the gratification with which we avail ourselves of the great privilege of welcoming Your Majesty and Your Royal Consort on the occasion of Your first visit to this City since Your Majesty's accession to the Throne of these realms.

It is a matter of great satisfaction to our Citizens that Your Majesty has once more evinced Your deep interest in all that concerns the welfare of Your people by Your presence in this City for the purpose of laying the Foundation Stone of the new Cathedral, an edifice which we earnestly hope will not only serve to promote the highest interests of humanity, but also prove an important addition to the buildings which adorn and beautify our City.

We fervently pray that every blessing may attend Your Majesty and Your Royal Consort, and that Your Majesties may long be spared to rule over this great Empire, to the promotion of the best interests of which Your Majesties' efforts have always been directed.

Given under the Corporate Common Seal of the City of Liverpool, the 19th day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and four.
