Whereas We have deemed it expedient that a Commission should forthwith issue to consider the existing methods of dealing with idiots and epileptics, and with imbecile, feeble-minded, or

defective persons not certified under the Lunacy Laws; and in view of the hardship or danger resulting to such persons and the community from insufficient provision for their care, training, and control, to report as to the amendments in the law or other measures which should be adopted in the matter, due regard being had to the expense involved in any such proposals and to the best means of securing economy therein;

Now know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorized and appointed, and do by these presents authorize and appoint, you, the said Thomas Henry, Marquess of Bath; William Patrick Byrne; Charles Edward Henry Hobhouse; Frederick Needham; Henry David Greene; Charles Edward Heley Chadwyck - Healey; Harold Nelson Burden; Willoughby Hyett Dickinson; Charles Stewart Loch; and Ellen Frances Pinsent to be Our Commissioners for the purposes of the said inquiry.

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; and also to call for, have access to and examine all such books, documents, registers and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And We do by these presents authorize and empower you, or any of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid.

And We do by these presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof,

and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's, the ninth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and four, in the fourth year of Our Reign.

SHORES OR BANKS OF THE SEA AND THE ESTUARY OF THE RIVERS TAW AND TORRIDGE AT WESTWARD HO AND NORTHAM.

REMOVAL OF MATERIALS PROHIBITED.

Whereas the Board of Trade, acting in pursuance of the Harbours Act, 1814, as amended by the Harbours Transfer Act, 1862, find it necessary for the protection of the Port of Barnstaple to prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from that portion of the shores or banks of the sea and of the estuary of the Rivers Taw and Torridge between the junction of the parishes of Abbotsham and Northam (near Rock Nose, Westward Ho), and the stream which enters the estuary on the north-east side of Northam Burrows, near West Appledore, as lies to the southward of an imaginary line drawn south 80 degrees west true from the Upper Lighthouse at Braunton, such line passing 530 yards to the northward of the Old Lifeboat House on Grey

Sand Point when that boathouse is in line with Northam Church, being within the said port:

Now the Board of Trade do hereby, by this Order, prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of the sea and of the estuary of the Rivers Taw and Torridge within the limits above mentioned.

No. 797.—UNITED STATES, ATLANTIC COAST—CONNECTICUT.

New London Harbour-Shoal in Approach, Buoys.

The United States Government has given notice, dated 20th August, 1904, of the existence of a shoal, with a depth of 9 feet over it at low water, in the approach to New London Harbour, situated with Black Ledge Beacon bearing N. 34° W., distant 3 cables, and the western extremity of Pine Island N. 33° E.

Approximate position, lat. 41° 18′ N., long. 72° 4′ W.

The above shoal is the summit of a large shoal area extending about 5 cables southward and eastward from Black Ledge, the depths on which are from 14 to 18 feet.

The red conical buoy No. 2, marking the southern end of Black Ledge has in consequence been marked No. 4, and moved $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables S. 6° W. from its former position; it is now moored in a depth of 30 feet at a distance of $2\frac{3}{4}$ cables S. 5° W. from Black Ledge Beacon. A red conical buoy, marked No. 2, has also been moored in a depth of 30 feet at a distance of $4\frac{1}{2}$ cables S. 23° E from the same beacon.
