RDER of the Local Government Board : Motor Car Act, 1903: Regulation under Section 8. BOROUGH OF BEVERLEY.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Beverley; --And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that We, the Local Government Board, may, by Regulations made under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, restrict the driving of any motor cars or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway, or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in Our opinion, be especially dangerous;

And whereas the Town Council of the Borough of Beverley having made application to us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the abovementioned sections restricting the driving of motor cars on certain highways or parts of highways situate within the Borough of Beverley (hereinafter referred to as "the Borough") to a speed not exceeding five miles per hour, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and such Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon.

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, do hereby, by this Our Order, make the following Regulation :-

A person shall not drive a motor car at a greater speed than five miles an hour on the highways or parts of highways within the Borough, which are indicated by pink colouring on the plans hereinafter referred to, being-

- (a) a portion of highway situate at the junction of the streets known as York-road and North Bar-street Without, and including the area known as "The Bar"
- (b) a portion of highway forming the entrances to the Market Place and Lairgate from North Bar-street Within;

(c) the street known as Butcher Row.

The above-mentioned Plans are two Plans, each of which is sealed with Our Seal, and marked "Plan showing the highways or parts of high-ways referred to in the Order of the Local Government Board, dated the third day of September, one thousand nine hundred and four, relating to the Borough of Beverley," one of the Plans being deposited with Us, and the other in the offices of the Town Clerk of the Borough.

#### Mullet Cay—Beacon Erected near South Point.

## No. 824.—CANADA, NOVA SCOTIA—BAY OF FUNDY, ST. MARY BAY.

#### Gilbert Point-Light Established.

The Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice that, on 18th August, 1904, a red fixed light would be established on Gilbert Point, St. Mary Bay.

The light, which is dioptric of the 7th order, will be exhibited at an elevation of 40 feet above high water from a square wooden lantern in the centre of a square wooden building, 36 feet high, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 7 miles. The lantern and building are both coloured white, but have red roofs.
