## FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

## BOARD OF EDUCATION.

Appointed Day.

Order made under Section 5 (1) of the Education (London) Act, 1903.

Whereas by Sub-section (1) of Section 5 of the Education (London) Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred

to as "the Act"), it is enacted that the Act shall, except as expressly provided, come into operation on the appointed day, and the appointed day shall be the first day of May, nineteen hundred and four, or such other day, not being more than twelve months later, as the Board of Education may appoint, and different days may be appointed for different purposes and for different provisions of the Act.

And whereas by an Order dated the twenty-third day of June, nineteen hundred and four, the Board of Education appointed as the appointed day for the purposes of Sub-section (1) of Section 2 of the Act, and for the purpose of the repeal in London of Section 15 of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, the first day of October, nineteen hundred and four, or such later day or days as might be appointed by the Board of Education thereafter for the purpose.

And whereas the Act came into operation for all purposes other than the aforesaid on the first day of May, nineteen hundred and four.

Now, therefore, the Board of Education, pursuant to the Act and to every other power enabling them in that behalf, hereby appoint as the appointed day for the purposes aforesaid the first day of November, nineteen hundred and four, or such later day or days as may be appointed by the Board of Education hereafter for those purposes.
