FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

In pursuance of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department

proposes, at the expiration of 40 days from the publication of this notice, to make an Order under section 49 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, allowing the overtime employment of women in non-textile factories and workshops, and parts thereof in which are carried on the making-up of any article of table linen, bed linen, or other household linen, and processes incidental thereto.
