Application of Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903.

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903 shall, subject as herein provided, apply to the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the administrative county of the Isle of Wight shall thereupon cease to be a separate Area.

Revocation of Existing Regulations.

2. The powers of the Local Authorities of any district comprised in the Schedule hereto to make regulations under the Swine-Fever Order of 1894, as to movement, exposure, or sale of swine, shall be suspended during the operation of this Order, and all such regulations in force at the commencement of this Order shall thereupon cease to operate.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October, nineteen hundred and four.
