IRTHLINGBOROUGH GAS ORDER, 1900.

Whereas by section 26 of the above-mentioned Order which was duly confirmed by the Gas Orders Confirmation (1) Act, 1900, it was en-

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Regulations: Small-pox Prevention.

BOROUGH OF DEWSBURY.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Dewsbury; To the Guardians of the Poor of the Dewsbury

Union:

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas the Borough of Dewsbury (hereinafter referred to as "the Borough") is affected by Small-pox, and, in view of the circumstances of the case, it is desirable that regulations be made for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in the exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by Sections 130 and 134 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and by the Public Health Act. 1896, and of every other power enabling Us in this behalf, do, by this Order, make the following Regulations (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations"), and Declare the Regulations to be in force in the Borough for a period of six months:-

Local Authority to enforce and execute Regulations.

ARTICLE I. The Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough, acting by the Council, and hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation," shall be the Authority for enforcing and execut-ing the Regulations, and shall forthwith make arrangements for those purposes.

The Corporation shall furnish Us with such particulars of the action taken by the Corporation at such times and in such form as We may

require.

Powers, duties, and remuneration of Medical Officer of Health.

ARTICLE II. The Medical Officer of Health shall advise the Corporation on all matters concerning the enforcement and execution of the Regulations, and shall generally superintend the execution of the Regulations.

The Medical Officer of Health may, where the circumstances, in his opinion, so require, perform vaccination or re-vaccination on any person in immediate danger of contracting small-pex, and

without charge to the said person.

The Corporation shall from time to time pay to the Medical Officer of Health, in addition to the salary or other compensation payable to him in respect of his office, a reasonable compensation for all action by him in the execution of the Regulations.

Provision of Vaccination Centres.

ARTICLE III. The Corporation shall forthwith provide a place (hereinafter referred to as a "Vaccination Centre") at which persons may be gratuitously vaccinated or re-vaccinated.

The Corporation shall also provide such additional Vaccination Centres as, upon the advice of the Medical Officer of Health of the Borough, they deem necessary.

Furnishing Maintenance, &c., of Vaccination Centres.

ARTICLE IV.—(1.) The Corporation shall forthwith cause each Vaccination Centre to be fitted up, furnished, maintained, regulated and managed in such manner as may be necessary for securing the efficient performance of vaccination at the Vaccination Centre; and otherwise in such manner as may be necessary for compliance with the requirements of the Regulations.

(2.) The Corporation shall employ such and so many servants or persons as may be needed for the maintenance, regulation and management of each Vaccination Centre in accordance with the

provisions of this Article.

Public notice of Vaccination arrangements and other matters.

ARTICLE V. The Corporation shall appoint the days on which and the hours during which each Vaccination Centre shall be opened and be kept open for the purpose of vaccination and of the inspection of persons with a view to ascertain the results of operations, and shall from time to time cause public notice of the days and hours during which each Vaccination Centre may be open for the purposes aforesaid, and of any other matters which form the subject or arise out of the Regulations, to be given by hand-bills, placards, or otherwise in such manner as may be sufficient and appropriate for affording information to all persons interested.

Employment of Vaccinators.

ARTICLE VI The Corporation shall employ a registered medical practitioner (hereinafter referred to as a "Vaccinator") to perform vaccination and re-vaccination at each Vaccination Centre:

Provided that if the Public Vaccinator for the Vaccination District comprising the Borough is willing to accept employment under the Regulations as a Vaccinator at any Vaccination Centre the Corporation shall employ the Public Vaccinator accordingly:

accordingly:
Provided also that no person shall be employed as a Vaccinator under this Order unless he has obtained a Certificate of proficiency in Vaccination given by some person whom We have authorized to act for the purpose.

Application of certain provisions of Vaccination Order, 1898, and Vaccination Acts.

ARTICLE VII.—(1.) In the performance and inspection of every operation in pursuance of the Regulations, and otherwise for the purposes of the Regulations, the Medical Officer of Health and every Vaccinator shall observe the "Instructions to Vaccinators under Contract," contained in the Third Schedule to the Vaccination Order, 1898, as if he were a Public Vaccinator under Contract, within the meaning of that Order.

Contract, within the meaning of that Order.

(2.) The Medical Officer of Health who performs vaccination or re-vaccination, and every Vaccinator shall cause all vaccinations or re-vaccinations performed by him, with the results as ascertained by inspection, to be duly registered in a register which shall be in the Form O contained in the Fifth Schedule to the Vaccinations, and the entries therein shall be made in the manner directed in the said Instructions to Vaccinators under Contract.

(3.) In all other respects the Medical Officer of Health who performs vaccination or re-vaccination, and every Vaccinator shall comply with all such provisions of the Vaccination Acts, 1867 to 1898, as are applicable to a Medical Practitioner who is not a Public Vaccinator.

Payments to Vaccinators.

Article VIII. The Corporation shall pay to every Vaccinator employed under the Regulations such sum in respect of every successful primary vaccination and of every successful re-vaccination performed by him, as may be agreed upon between the Corporation and the Vaccinator:

Provided that no payment shall be made in respect of any vaccination unless the same has been performed in accordance with the Regulations, nor unless the provisions of the Vaccination Acts, 1867 to 1898, applicable to vaccinations performed by persons other than public vaccinators have been observed with reference thereto:

Provided also that no payment shall be made in respect of the re-vaccination of any person who shall be less than 10 years of age, unless the Medical Officer of Health, having regard to the special circumstances of the case, has advised the re-vaccination of the person to be necessary.

Medical Visitor.

ARTICLE IX.—(1.) If the Medical Officer of Health so advise, the Corporation shall employ a registered medical practitioner (to be called "the Medical Visitor") who shall be in charge of the Borough or any subdivision of the Borough for the purposes of the Regulations.

the purposes of the Regulations.
(2.) Each such Medical Visitor while so in charge shall act under the superintendence of the

Medical Officer of Health.

(3.) The Medical Visitor shall comply with such instructions as, in accordance with the advice of the Medical Officer of Health, may be given by the Corporation with regard to—

 (a) the visitation of the Borough or of any subdivision of the Borough or of any house in the Borough or sub-division; and

(b) inquiry into the existence of Small-pox;and

(c) the reporting of cases of Small-pox or suspected Small-pox.

· Expenses.

ARTICLE X. Any expenses incurred by the Corporation in the execution of the Regulations shall be deemed to be incurred in the execution of the Public Health Act, 1875, and may be defrayed accordingly.

Offences.

ARTICLE XI. A person shall not wilfully obstruct the Medical Officer of Health, a Vaccinator, or a Medical Visitor in the exercise of any power or the discharge of any duty under the Regulations, and a refusal to comply with a reasonable requisition of the Medical Officer of Health, a Vaccinator, or a Medical Visitor, shall, for the purposes of the Regulations, be deemed to be a wilful obstruction of the Medical Officer of Health, the Vaccinator, or the Medical Visitor, as the case may be.

Definition.

ARTICLE XII. In this Order the expression "Medical Officer of Health" includes any duly qualified Medical Practitioner appointed or employed by the Corporation to act in the execution of the Regulations.

Short Title.

ARTICLE XIII. This Order may be cited as "The Dewsbury (Small-pox Prevention) Order, 1904."

Port and Weather Signals.

The Mexican Government has given notice, dated 21st July, 1904, that the undermentioned general signals for closing the ports, and for indicating the weather on the coasts of Mexico, have been established. These signals will be made at any Meteorological Observatory, Pilot Office, or lighthouse, and at the office of the General Direction of Lighthouses at Veracruz, from flagstaffs painted in red and white bands, with a white yard, the staff above the yard being also white. The signals for closing the port will be made at one yard arm, and the signals indicating the weather prevailing outside the port at the other.

SIGNALS FOR CLOSING THE PORT.

- a. A red ball hoisted at the office of the Chief Pilot indicates that the departure of all native vessels is prohibited.
- b. A black cone, that the departure of all small vessels is prohibited.
- c. A black cylinder, that the port is closed to smaller vessels for all traffic.

WEATHER SIGNALS.

The undermentioned flags will indicate the force, or velocity, of the wind:—

- 1. A square yellow flag with a white square in the centre indicates that the velocity of the wind will be under 18 miles an hour.
- 2. A square white flag with a red square centre will indicate a velocity of from 18 to 36 miles an hour.
- 3. A square red flag with a black square in the centre will indicate a velocity of over 36 miles an hour.

The undermentioned flags will indicate the probable direction of the wind during the day:—

- a. A square blue flag over that indicating the force of the wind, denotes wind from the northward, between N.N.E. and N.N.W.
- b. A square blue flag under that indicating the force of the wind, denotes winds from the southward, between S.S.E. and S.S.W.
- c. A red pennant over the flag indicating the force of the wind, denotes winds from the north-eastward, between N.N.E. and E.N.E.
- d. A red pennant under the flag indicating the force of the wind, denotes winds from the southeastward, between S.S.E. and E.S.E.
- e. A white pennant over the flag indicating the force of the wind, denotes winds from the north-westward, between N.N.W. and W.N.W.

- f. A white pennant under the flag indicating the force of the wind, denotes winds from the south-westward, between S.S.W. and W.S.W.
- g. A blue pennant over the flag indicating the force of the wind, denotes winds from the eastward, between E.N.E. and E.S.E.
- h. A blue pennant under the flag indicating the force of the wind, denotes winds from the westward, between W.N.W. and W.S.W.

EXAMPLE.—A square blue flag over a square yellow flag with a white square centre, indicates that winds between N.N.E. and N.N.W., with a velocity of under 18 miles an hour are, or may be expected to prevail on the coast.

STORM SIGNALS.

- 1. Two square red flags with square black centres, hoisted vertically, indicates a hurricane in the vicinity.
- 2. A square red flag with a square white centre, indicates the existence of a hurricane amongst the West India islands whose course cannot yet be ascertained.
- 3. A square yellow flag with a square red centre, indicates bad weather inside the Gulf of Mexico.
- 4. A triangular flag (white?) with a black triangle in the centre, indicates bad weather to the northward.
- 5. A triangular black flag with a white triangle in the centre, indicates bad weather to the southwards.

When storm signals are made, the information respecting the weather posted on the doors of the Meteorological Observatories, Pilots' offices, or lighthouses should be consulted.

NIGHT SIGNALS.

The undermentioned weather signals will be made at night by means of lanterns.

- a. Two red fixed lights, vertical, indicate strong northerly winds between N.E. and N.W.
- b. Two white fixed lights, vertical, indicate strong southerly winds between S.E. and S.W.
- c. A white fixed light over a red fixed light indicates strong easterly winds from N.E. to S.E.
- d. A white fixed light under a red fixed light indicates strong westerly winds between N.W. and S.W.

STORM SIGNAL.

s. Three red fixed lights, vertical, indicate a hurricane in the vicinity.

The above lights will be suspended 5 feet apart.
