#### BOYS' HOME, BATTERY GREEN, LOWESTOFT.

New Certificate.

#### SHORES OR BANKS OF FALMOUTH BAY AT FALMOUTH.

REMOVAL OF MATERIALS PROHIBITED.

Whereas the Board of Trade, acting in pursuance of the Harbours Act, 1814, as amended by the Harbours Transfer Act, 1862, find it necessary for the protection of the Port of Falmouth to prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of Falmouth Bay between an imaginary line drawn across the shore and banks 100 yards south-east of the Falmouth Hotel, and another line drawn across the shore and banks at the southern end of and including the whole of Swan Pool Beach, Falmouth, being within the said port:

Now the Board of Trade do hereby, by this Order, prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of Falmouth Bay between the lines above mentioned.

Note.—Any person removing shingle or ballast in contravention of this Notice is liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £10.

# ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 8TH NOVEMBER 1904.)

SWINE-FEVER (MOVEMENT FROM IRELAND) TEMPORARY ORDER OF 1904.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Temporary Order of 1894 continued until 30th November 1905.

1. The Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland)
Temporary Order of 1894 shall be read and
have effect as if the thirtieth day of November,
nineteen hundred and five were substituted
for the thirtieth day of November, one thousand
eight hundred and ninety-four in Article 1 of that
Order, as the date from and immediately after
which that Order shall cease to operate, and the
operation of that Order is hereby continued
accordingly.

4 cables wide; there are depths of from 12 to 18 fathoms around it, but shoal water, with varying depths, extends further to the southward; vessels should therefore give this shoal a berth of 10 miles in passing. There are ripples over this shoal in fine weather, but in bad weather the sea breaks over the shoaler heads.

The native fishermen state that there are no other than the above dangers in this vicinity, it is considered therefore that the dangers marked

2. In order to prevent the leading marks or lights being in any way obscured, when two vessels are proceeding from the harbour to the pass, the last vesrel must not pass the Pivot buoy until the preceding vessel is clear of the pass; this is shown by signal from Gabbari Tower.

#### HARBOUR REGULATIONS :--

- a. All incoming vessels are to hoist the quarantine flag and their number before rounding i Pivot buoy, and are to keep the former flying until pratique is obtained, and the latter until they arrive in the inner harbour, or for a reasonable time after anchoring in the outer harbour.
- b. All vessels coming from an uninfected port and having no sickness on board, may proceed into the inner harbour where they will be boarded by the quarantine officer. They are not, however, to go alongside the quays until pratique has been obtained.
- c. All vessels coming from an infected port are to anchor in the quarantine ground to the westward of the quarantine buoy (conical yellow), where the medical visits will take place.
- d. Every week the Pilot Department will be supplied by the Quarantine Office with a list of ports or harbours which are infected with plague or cholera.
- e. Vessels are strictly forbidden to make use of steam sirens in the inner harbour or arsenal basin.
- f. The captains of outward-bound vessels are requested to furnish a note with the name of the vessel, and the date and time of leaving the port, and affix their signatures to the document.
- g. The pilot charges commence and end abreast the Mole lighthouse.
- h. Shipping companies and owners, conjointly with the captains of the vessels, will be held entirely responsible for the observance of the above regulations and for any collision or damages which may result from the infringement of them.

#### No. 1054.—SPAIN—SOUTH-EAST COAST.

#### Canet Point-Light Established.

The Spanish Government has given notice that, on 31st October, 1904, a white group flashing light, showing groups of two flashes in quick succession about every seven seconds, would be established on Canet Point. Canet Point Light would be elevated 110 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 16 miles. NOTICE is hereby given, that the following Bye-laws were, on the 20th day of October, 1904, made and sealed by the London United Tramways (1901) Limited.

#### The London United Tramways (1901) Limited.

BYE-LAWS and REGULATIONS made by the London United Tramways (1901) Limited (hereinafter called "the Company"), under and by virtue of powers conferred on the Company by the London United Tramways Acts, 1873 to 1904, and the London United Tramways Limited (Light Railway Extensions) Order, 1898, and the Acts incorporated therewith.

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall apply to all carriages of the Company, and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make Bye-laws or Regulations.

2. In these Bye-laws the word "conductor" shall mean and include any inspector, driver, conductor or other officer of the Company.

3. Except by direction of the conductor, no person shall enter or depart from a carriage otherwise than by the step of the hindermost platform. All persons desiring to alight from any carriage at any point shall do so before any person enters into or mounts upon such carriage at any point for the purpose of travelling thereon, and all persons desiring to enter into or mount upon the carriage at such point shall first permit such first-named persons to alight as aforesaid.

4. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette inside any carriage. Any person offending against this Bye-law shall be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter mentioned, to be summarily removed from

the carriage.

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5. No person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

6. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or mount upon any carriage, and any such person who shall be found in or upon any carriage may be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

7. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language or behave offensively whilst in or upon any carriage, or spit or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any

passenger.

- 8. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice in or upon any carriage, or place his feet upon or lie upon any seat, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.
- 9. No person whose clothing or personal condition might, in the opinion of the conductor, soil or injure any carriage, or the linings or cushions thereof, or the clothing of any passenger, or who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall be

entitled to enter or remain in or upon any carriage, and may be prevented from entering in or upon any carriage, and shall not enter in or upon any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in or upon any carriage shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned. Any person offending against this Bye-law shall be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty below-mentioned, to be summarily removed from the carriage.

10. No person suffering from any contagious or infectious disease shall enter or mount upon any carriage, nor shall any clothing, bedding or other articles likely to spread any contagious or infectious disease be placed by any person upon any carriage.

11. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, or any other duly authorised officer of the Company, the fare legally demandable

for the journey.

12. When required to do so each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) to the conductor, and shall either deliver up such ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled

over by such passenger.

- 13. Any ticket, for the time being issued by the Company in respect of a fare, shall be available only for the carriage on or for which it is issued, and no passenger shall be entitled to leave any carriage for any purpose whatever at any stage and resume his journey by a different carriage from that on or for which such ticket was issued, except upon payment of a fresh fare from the point at which the passenger entered the second or other carriage.
- 14. No person, other than an artisan, mechanic or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the Company's Acts of Parliament or Orders, shall use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics or daily labourers.
- 15. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics or daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in or upon any other part of any carriage.
- 16. No person other than an officer or servant of the Company shall travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage or stand on the roof thereof, or sit on the outside rail on the roof thereof, and any such person shall immediately on request of the conductor cease so to do.
- 17. No person other than a passenger or intending passenger shall enter into or mount upon any carriage, or shall hold or hang on by or to or be upon any part of any carriage.
- 18. When any carriage contains in the interior thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation according to the notice thereof attached to such carriage is provided in such interior, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount or remain therein except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained.

When any carriage contains on the outside thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation according to the notice thereof attached to such carriage is provided on such outside, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount or remain thereon.

19. No person shall enter, mount or leave, or attempt to enter, mount or leave any carriage whilst in motion.

- 20. No person shall sell or offer for sale any goods or merchandise of any sort in or upon any carriage of the Company.
- 21. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or upon any carriage, in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal may be offensive or an annoyance to passengers, nor in any other case otherwise than by permission of the conductor. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or upon any carriage in breach of this Regulation shall be removed from the carriage by the person in charge of such dog or other animal immediately upon request of the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.
- 22. No person with loaded firearms or gunpowder or other explosive materials shall travel in or upon any carriage of the Company.
- 23. No unauthorised person shall interfere in any way with the electrical equipment or other mechanical apparatus of any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done to such electrical equipment or other mechanical apparatus.
- 24. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Company in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Company
- 25. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding 40s.
- 26. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the 10th day of January, 1905.

(Dissolution and Re-incorporation of the Epping Gas Company Limited; Powers to supply Gas and Definition of Limits; Defining and Increasing Capital; Maintenance and Extension of Works; Manufacture and Storage of Gas and Residual Products; Powers to Deal in Stoves, Fittings, Machinery and Appliances; to acquire Patent Rights; to Levy Rates, Rents and Charges; Agreements with Local Authorities and others; Exemption of Fittings, &c., from Distress; Incorporation of Acts; and other matters.)

OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next Session by the Epping Gas Company

- Limited (hereinafter called "the Limited Company") for an Act for all or some of the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—
- 1. To dissolve the Limited Company, and to incorporate into a Company (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") the members of the Limited Company and all other persons and Corporations who shall hereafter become proprietors in the Undertaking of the Company for, the purpose of making and maintaining gasworks and manufacturing, storing and supplying gas and residual products within the limits hereinafter mentioned, and for carrying on any business usually carried on by gas companies, and for other the objects and purposes of the intended Act.
- 2. To vest in the Company all the Undertaking, works, lands, buildings, stock, plant, moneys, securities and other property of what nature or kind soever, interests, rights, powers, privileges, easements, contracts, licences and agreements, and benefits of all contracts, licences and agreements now vested in or belonging to or enjoyed by the Limited Company or any person on their behalf.
- 3. To declare void and to cancel the memorandum and articles of association of the Limited Company, and to make all necessary provisions consequent thereon.
- 4. To declare, define and regulate the capital and borrowing powers of the Company, and to authorize the Company to raise further money by the creation and issue of shares and stock, with or without a preferential or guaranteed dividend or other rights or privileges attached thereto, and by borrowing, and by the creation and issue of debenture stock or by any of such means.
- 5. To authorize the Company to supply gas for public and private purposes to and within the following limits (that is to say):—

The parishes of Epping, Epping Upland, Havering atte Bower, Nazeing, and so much of the parish of North Weald Bassett as lies to the south of an imaginary line drawn in a due north-easterly direction from the smith's shop at the extreme southern boundary of the parish of Latton, and joining the parish of Harlow at Shonke's Brook, Stapleford Abbots, Stapleford Tawney, Theydon Bois, Theydon Garnon and Theydon Mount, all in the county of Essex.

6. To empower the Company to maintain, alter, improve, enlarge, extend and renew or discontinue the existing gasworks and works connected therewith upon the lands hereinafter described, and on those lands or on any part or parts thereof respectively to construct, erect, lay down, provide, maintain, alter, improve, enlarge, extend and renew or discontinue, with all necessary roads, approaches, sidings and conveniences, gasworks, retorts, gasometers, receivers, purifiers, drains, sewers, mains, pipes, meters, lamps, lampposts, machinery, and other apparatus, appliances, works and conveniences, and to do all such acts as they may think proper for the making, manufacture, conversion, utilization, storage and supply of gas and coke and other products employed or obtained in or resulting from the manufacture of gas and matters producible therefrom, and to make, store and supply gas, and to manufacture, convert, store, sell, supply and deal in gas, coke, tar, pitch, asphaltum, lime, ammoniacal liquor, sulphate of ammonia, and all other products or residuals of any materials employed in or arising or resulting from the manufacture of gas and matters producible therefrom.

7. The lands hereinbefore referred to are as follows:—

A piece of land situate in the parish of Epping, in the county of Essex, now belonging to, or reputed to belong to, the Limited Company, and on which the existing gasworks and buildings of the Limited Company are situated, and which contains by admeasurement 2 acres, or thereabouts, bounded on the north by land in the occupation of the Epping Steam Laundry Company, on the west by the Great Eastern Railway, on the south by land belonging to, or reputed to belong to, Colonel Houblon, and on the east by land occupied by Messrs. Hayden and Sons, and numbered 160 on the 25-inch Ordnance Map of Essex, L 14, published in 1874.

- 8. To empower the Company for any of the purposes of their Undertaking to purchase by agreement or take on lease and hold lands, houses and buildings, and to sell, lease or otherwise dispose of any lands, houses or buildings for the time being belonging to them and not required for the purposes of their Undertaking.
- 9. To authorize the Company to maintain, take up, alter and repair the existing mains, pipes and other works of the Limited Company, and to lay down, maintain, take up, alter and repair additional mains, pipes and other works in, through, under, over, across and along, and to cross, open, break up, divert, stop up, or otherwise interfere with, either temporarily or permanently, any turnpike or other roads, highways, footways, occupation roads, footpaths, streets, including streets not dedicated to the public use, public places, bridges, canals, navigations, towing paths, railways, tramways, sidings, works, pipes, sewers, drains, rivers, streams, brooks, and watercourses within the limits of supply so far as may be necessary or convenient for all or any of the purposes of the intended Act.
- 10. To empower the Company to purchase, provide, sell, let on hire, and otherwise deal in and fix stoves, ranges, meters, fittings, engines, dynamos, machinery, pipes, lamps, burners, apparatus and appliances for lighting, for motive power, for heating, cooking, ventilating, manufacturing, agricultural, industrial, or any other purpose whatsoever, and to supply or work the same by means of gas.
- 11. To enable the Company and any Local Authority, Company, Corporation public body, officers or persons to enter into and carry into effect contracts and arrangements for or with respect to the supply by the Company of gas in bulk or otherwise for any public, sanitary, trading or other purpose, and to authorize any such Local Authority, Company, Corporation, public body, officers or persons respectively to apply their respective funds, and to raise further moneys for the purpose of any such contract or arrangement, and to sanction or confirm any such contract or arrangement already made or which prior to the passing of the intended Act may be made with respect to the matters aforesaid.

- 12. To authorize the Company to acquire, hold and use patent rights and licences in relation to the manufacture and distribution of gas, and the conversion, manufacture or utilization of any products or residuals of any materials used or employed in or resulting from the manufacture of gas, and to erect, fit up, and maintain and let houses, cottages and dwellings for the officers and servants of the Company.
- 13. To make provision in regard to the supply and consumption of gas and in regard to matters incidental to the objects of the intended Act, including the following:—The price, pressure, quality and testing of gas; the use of antifluctuators and the laying of pipes for ancillary purposes.
- 14. To authorize the Company to levy and receive rates, rents and charges, differential and otherwise, for or in respect of the supply of gas, and for the sale and hire of meters, fittings, stoves, ranges, engines, machinery, apparatus, appliances, pipes, lamps, burners, fittings, articles and things; to alter existing rates, rents and charges; to relieve the Company from any obligation or liability with reference to any such alteration; to confer, vary and extinguish exemptions from the payment of rates, rents and charges; and to allow discounts or rebates to consumers for prompt payment of gas rent or for other considerations.
- 15. To empower the Company to refuse to supply persons in debt to the Company in respect of other property.
- 16. To make provision for limiting the period at or during which errors in meters tested in manner provided by the Sale of Gas Act, 1859, shall be deemed to have arisen, and as to the recovery of the allowance or overcharge to be made to or by the Company in consequence of any such errors.
- 17. To exempt from liability to distress engines, fittings, stoves, cookers, machinery and apparatus supplied or let by the Company, and to provide for the service of notices by and on the Company.
- 18. To confer upon the Company all powers, rights, authorities and privileges which are or may become necessary for carrying the powers of the intended Act into complete and full effect, to vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might in any manner impede or interfere with the objects and purposes of the intended Act, and to confer other rights and privileges.
- 19. To incorporate with the intended Act all or some of the provisions of the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1847; the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1871; the Sale of Gas Act, 1859; the Companies Clauses Acts, 1845 to 1889; and the Lands Clauses Acts, and so far as may be necessary or expedient to alter, amend, or extend all or some of the provisions of those Acts.

### ACCRINGTON DISTRICT GAS AND WATER BOARD.

(Extension of Limits of Supply; Power to Construct Additional Works and to take Lands and Waters; Power to acquire Lands for such and other purposes connected with their Water Undertaking; Power to take Easements; Powers to prevent Contamination and Waste of Water, and for Protection of Waterworks; to alter and increase Water Rates and Charges for Supply of Water; Provisions as to Gas Undertaking; Discounts; Further Capital; Amendment of Acts; and other purposes.)

OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session by the Accrington District Gas and Water Board (hereinafter called "the Board") for an Act for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

To extend the Board's limits for the supply of gas and water as defined by section 4 of the Accrington District Gas and Water Board Act, 1894, by including therein the parish and township of Altham, in the County Palatine of Lancaster.

To confer upon the Board in respect of the area proposed to be included within the limits of supply similar powers, rights, privileges and authorities, and to impose upon the Board similar obligations and duties as the Board now have or are under in respect of their existing limits of supply, so far as the same are applicable, and to extend all or any of the provisions of the Board's Acts, with or without modifications, to, and to make them applicable within, the area aforesaid, and to enable the Board to make and recover rates, rents and charges for gas and water.

To enable the Board within their extended limits of supply to have, enjoy and exercise all the powers, rights and authorities of an urban and rural authority under the Public Health Act, 1875, and the Acts amending the same with respect to the supply of gas and water.

To enable the Board to make and maintain the following works (that is to say):—

An enlargement of the existing reservoir of the Board called or known as the Dean Clough Reservoir, situate in the parish, township and urban district of Great Harwood, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, on lands belonging to the Board and numbered 292, 306, 307 and 313 on the  $\frac{1}{2500}$  Ordnance Map, 1st edition 1893, of the said parish of Great Harwood, by raising the existing embankment of the said reservoir. Such reservoir, when enlarged by the raising of the said embankment, will extend for a distance of 415 yards in a south-westerly direction from the said embankment.

To enable the Board from time to time to make and maintain all proper embankments, bridges, roads, ways, wells, tanks, basins, gauges, filters, dams, sluices, bye-washes, waste weirs, outfalls, washouts, discharge pipes, shafts, adits, tunnels, aqueducts, culverts, cuts, channels, conduits, mains, pipes, stand pipes, junctions, valves, drains, telegraphs, telephones, engines, apparatus, approaches, buildings, houses, works and conveniences connected with the hereinbefore described works, or any of them, or incidental thereto, or necessary or proper for supplying, conducting, inspecting, cleansing, repairing or managing the

same or otherwise in connection with their gas or water Undertaking.

To authorize the Board to make ateral and vertical deviations to any extent defined by the Bill or prescribed by Parliament from the line and levels of the proposed works shown on the plans and sections hereinafter mentioned.

To authorize the Board to lay down and maintain pipes, wires and apparatus in, under, over, through and across, and for that purpose to divert, alter or stop up, cross and break up, whether temporarily or permanently, highways, roads, footpaths, pipes, sewers, streams, watercourses, and telephonic, telegraphic and other electrical apparatus, so far as necessary or convenient for the purposes of the intended works, or any of them, or for the purposes of their gas or water Undertaking.

To empower the Board for the purposes of the Bill and of their water Undertaking to purchase or take by agreement, or to take on lease, lands (including in that expression where used in this Notice houses and buildings) and any rights and easements therein, thereover or thereunder, including the right of discharging water into any stream or sewer with which any of the intended works may communicate, and (notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Waterworks Clauses Act, 1847, contained) including also mines and minerals for the purposes of the intended works, and to vary or extinguish all rights and privileges in any manner connected with such lands.

To empower the Board to take, raise, collect, divert and impound into or in their said reservoir as so extended and enlarged the waters of the Dean Brook, and all tributaries and streams flowing into that brook, all of which streams and waters now flow either directly or indirectly into the Dean Brook and thence into the River Calder and thence into the River Ribble, and of any other streams, brooks or springs which may be found in, upon or under, or may be diverted or intercepted by the proposed works, and any water which they at present impound or are authorized to impound in or into any of their existing reservoirs and works, and any waters which can or may be impounded by or collected into the said reservoir as proposed to be extended or enlarged under the powers of the intended Act, or can or may be found in, on or under, or flowing through or past any lands which they may be authorized by the intended Act to acquire, or in which they may be authorized by the said Act to acquire any estate or

To constitute the proposed new works for all purposes part of the water Undertaking of the Board.

To empower the Board to acquire lands by agreement in the drainage area of the Dean Brook, and to hold such lands for the purpose of protecting, securing and preserving their waterworks or water supply, and to sell, lease or exchange lands vested in them, with power to reserve water rights or other easements therein, and with power to agree as to the drainage of such lands, and to exempt such lands and the Board in respect thereof from the provisions, or some of the provisions, of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, with respect to the sale of superfluous lands.

To enable the Board to make provisions to prevent the fouling of water, and to enforce the provisions of the Rivers Pollution Prevention Act, 1876, and any Act amending the same.

To empower the Board to make, levy and recover rates, rents, assessments and other charges for the supply of water, and other the purposes of the Bill, and to increase, alter, repeal or extinguish existing rates, rents, assessments and charges, and to make new or increased rates, rents, assessments and charges in lieu thereof, to grant exemptions, and to compound with the owners and occupiers of houses and premises for the payment of such rates, rents, assessments and charges.

To enable the Board to allow discounts in respect of the payment of gas or water rates in consideration of prompt payment or large

consumption.

To provide for the amendment of section 30 of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Act, 1896, and to provide that the Board may use mechanical power for moving carriages or wagons along the line of rails leading from the North Lancashire loop line of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company at Great Harwood, across Heys-lane, into the gasworks of the Board.

In John-street, Capcoch-

Between points distant respectively 46 yards and 60 yards, or thereabouts, north-westward of the north-west corner of Richard-street,

Capcoch.

Tramway No. 4 (1 mile 1 furlong 2.8 chains in length, whereof 7 furlongs 9.5 chains will be a single line and 1 furlong 3.3 chains will be double)-Commencing in Cardiff-road by a junction with Tramway No. 2 at its termination above described, passing thence along Clarencestreet, Jubilee-road, Gooseberry-hill, thence along a new road to be constructed in continuation of Gooseberry-hill and Fair View-terrace, through the field known as Humphrey's Field, and joining Fforchaman-road by the northeast corner of Cwmneol Inn, thence along Fforchaman-road and terminating on a vacant piece of land on the eastern side of the said road, and distant 102 yards, or thereabouts, northeastward from the north-east corner of Shepherd's Arms Hotel.

Tramway No. 4 will be constructed as a single line except between the points hereinafter specified where it will be laid as double line:—

(a) In Clarence-street-

- (1) At the junction with Gladstone-street distant respectively 68 yards and 123 yards, or thereabouts, westward from the centre of Cardiff-road.
- (2) At the junction with Jubilee-road distant respectively 36 yards, or thereabouts, eastward of the east corner of Bethany Congregational Chapel, and 25 yards, or thereabouts, southwestward of the east corner of the said chapel.

(b) Gooseberry-hill--

Between points distant respectively 10 yards and 65 yards, or thereabouts, south-westward from the centre of Cwmaman-road.

(c) New road—

Between points distant respectively 5 yards and 60 yards, or thereabouts, south-westward of the south-west corner of Fair View-terrace.

(d) Fforchaman-road-

- (1) At the junction with the new road above described and distant respectively 18 yards and 62 yards, or thereabouts, north-eastward from the south-west corner of Cwmneol Inn.
- (2) At the termination of the tramway on the vacant piece of land above described and distant respectively 102 yards and 120 yards, or thereabouts, north-eastward from such termination.

Tramway No. 5 (7·1 chains in length, single line throughout)—Commencing in Gadlys-road by a junction with Tramway No. 1 at a point distant 42 yards, or thereabouts, north-westward of the south-east corner of No. 100 Gadlys-road, thence along the occupation road to the Gadlys-yard, terminating at a point distant 30 yards, or thereabouts, north-ward of the north corner of Gadlys House and opposite the entrance to the proposed car shed.

Tramway No. 6 (3.5 chains in length, single line throughout)—Commencing in Cardiff-road by a junction with Tramway No. 2 at a point distant 12 yards, or thereabouts, northward of the north corner of Blaengwawr Inn, thence along Club-street in a south-westerly direction, terminating at a point distant 76 yards, or thereabouts, from the centre of Cardiff-road

and opposite the entrance to the proposed car shed.

- 3. The tramways will be constructed on a gauge of 3 feet 6 inches, or such other gauge as the Board of Trade may approve, and it is not intended to run on such tramways carriages or trucks adapted to run on railways.
- 4. Between the following points it is proposed to lay the tramways so that for a distance of 30 feet or upwards a less space than 9 feet 6 inches will intervene between the nearest rail of the tramway and the outside of the footpath on the side of the road hereinafter mentioned, or, if no side is mentioned, on both sides of the road (that is to say):—

Tramway No. 1.

(a) Gadlys-road :-

(1) On the south side thereof between points respectively situate 15 yards and 52 yards, or thereabouts, south-eastward of the south-east corner of No. 100 Gadlys-road.

(b) High-street :--

- (1) On the north side thereof between points respectively situate 76 yards and 104 yards, or thereabouts, south-eastward of the south-east corner of No. 100 Gadlys-road.
- (2) On the south and west sides thereof between points respectively situate 76 yards, or thereabouts, south-eastward of the east corner of No. 100 Gadlys-road and 16 yards, or thereabouts, northward of the north side of Green-street.

Tramway No. 2.

Cardiff-road :---

- '(1) On the south-west side thereof from the junction of Bethuel-street to a point situate 44 yards, or thereabouts, south of the east corner of Victoria Inn.
- (2) On the east side thereof between points respectively situate 48 yards, or thereabouts, and 104 yards, or thereabouts, northward of the south-west corner of the Prince Llewellyn Inn.
- (3) Between points respectively situate 14 yards, or thereabouts, and 64 yards, or thereabouts, south-eastward of the south corner of No. 28 Cardiff-road.
- (4) On the south side thereof between points respectively situate 70 yards, or thereabouts, and 112 yards, or thereabouts, eastward of the intersection of the said road with Sunnybank-street.
- (5) On the east side thereof between points respectively situate 20 yards, or thereabouts, and 56 yards, or thereabouts, north of the intersection of the said road with Ynyslwydroad.
- (6) On the south-west side thereof from Kiln-street for a distance of 28 yards in a south-easterly direction.
- (7) On the south side thereof between Mount Hill-street and Mason-street.

Tramway No. 3.

(a) Cardiff-road :-

- (1) On the west side thereof between points respectively situate 46 yards, or thereabouts, and 63 yards, or thereabouts, from the commencement of the tramway.
- (2) On the south-west side thereof between points respectively situate 36 yards, or thereabouts, westward of North View-road and 60 yards, or thereabouts, of the north corner of the boundary wall of Capcoch School.

Tramway No. 4.

(a) Cardiff-road:—
(1) On the west side thereof from the com-

mencement of the tramway to a point 20 yards, or thereabouts, round the curve to Clarence-street.

(b) Clarence-street:-

- (1) On the south side thereof throughout the entire length of the street.
- (c) Jubilee-road :-
- (1) On the south-east side thereof and at the junction of Clarence-street, and in continuation of the narrow place in the said street, and for a distance of 11 yards, or thereabouts, southwestward.
- (d) Gooseberry-hill:-
- (1) Between points respectively situated 6 yards, or thereabouts, and 58 yards, or thereabouts, south-westward of Cwmaman-road.
- (2) Between points respectively situated 80 yards, or thereabouts, and 206 yards, or thereabouts, south-westward of Cwmaman-road.
- (e) New-road :--
- (1) Between points respectively situated 10 yards, or thereabouts, and 55 yards, or thereabouts, south-westward of the south-west corner of Fair View-terrace.
- (f) Fforchaman-road :--
- (1) Between points respectively situated 10 yards, or thereabouts, and 198 yards, or thereabouts, south-westward of the south-west corner of the Cwmneol Inn.

Tramway No. 5.

Throughout the whole length of such tramway.

5. The motive power to be used on the proposed tramways will be electrical, mechanical or animal power, or partly one and partly another

. of such powers.

- 6. To empower the Council from time to time to make temporary tramways where necessary, and either temporarily or permanently to make, alter, maintain, remove or abandon such turnouts, crossings, passing places, sidings, loops, junctions and other works in addition to those specified herein as may be necessary or convenient to the efficient working of all or any of the tramways, or for affording access to the stables, carriage, engine, boiler and dynamo houses, buildings, car sheds and works of the Council or their lessees, or for effecting junctions with the system of any Local Authority, Company or person.
- 7. To authorize the Council to enter upon and open the surface of and to alter and stop up, remove and otherwise interfere with streets, roads, highways, footpaths, watercourses, sewers, drains, pavements, water and gas pipes, telegraph, telephone, electric wires and apparatus for the purpose of constructing, maintaining, repairing, removing, altering or reinstating the tramways and works, or for substituting others in their place, or for the other purposes of the Bill.
- 8. To empower the Council in connection with the construction of any of the tramways, to increase the width of the roadway by reducing the width of any footpath, and in respect of Tramway No. 4, to remove the footpath altogether on the south side of Clarence-street.

To empower the Board of Trade to extend the time limited by the Bill for the completion of the tramways thereby authorized.

10. To empower the Council in the construction of any of the tramways to alter their position in any street by substituting single or interlacing lines for double lines, or double or interlacing lines for single lines.

- 11. To authorize the Council to widen Gadlys Bridge, and, if deemed necessary, to rebuild or reconstruct the bridge and carry out such works as may be necessary for the maintenance of the bridge and approaches, and to sanction any agreement that may be made with the Taff Vale Railway Company in reference thereto.
- 12. To empower the Council when any road in which a tramway is laid, altered or widened, to reconstruct such tramway in such position as they think fit.
- 13. To empower the Council on the one hand, and any Local Authority, Company, body or person on the other hand, to enter into or carry into effect agreements for the supply of electrical energy for any purpose to and by the Council, by and to such Local Authority, Company, body or person.
- 14. To enable the Council on the one hand, and any Local Authority, Company or person with regard to the tramways or light railways in any adjacent district which can be worked with any of the Council's tramways on the other, from time to time to enter into and carry into effect contracts and agreements with respect to the purchase, sale, lease, working, use, management, maintenance, alteration and construction by the contracting parties of all or any of their respective tramways and works, or tramways or light railways laid within their respective districts, or any part or parts of such tram-ways or light railways respectively; the making of all necessary junctions; the supply of rolling-stock, plant, machinery, and electrical or other energy or power; the appointment and removal of officers and servants; the payments to be paid and the conditions to be performed in respect of such working, use, management and maintenance; the interchange, accommodation, conveyance, transmission and delivery of traffic coming from, or destined for, the respective undertakings of the contracting parties; and the division and apportionment of the revenue arising from such traffic; and the payment of any fixed or contingent rent; and to confirm and to give effect to any agreements which may be made touching any of the matters aforesaid; and to authorize the respective contracting parties to give and take a guarantee against any loss arising by reason of any such agreement, and to pay any such loss out of rates levied by them.

15. To empower the Council to work and use the tramways, or any of them, and to confer on the Council such rights, powers and privileges as may be necessary or expedient for the carrying into effect the purposes of the intended Act, and in particular to lay down on, in, under or over the surface of any such street, road or place in which any of the intended tramways of the Council are or may be situated such posts, brackets, wires, electric lines, cables or apparatus, and (as regards cables, wires and apparatus) in any other street, road or place with the consent of the road authority, and also to make and maintain such openings, posts, brackets, electric lines, cables, wires or ways in or under the surface of any such street, road or place as may be necessary or convenient, either for the actual working of the tramways or for providing access to or in connection with any engine, machinery, carsheds or apparatus, and to empower the Council to erect engines and machinery for the purpose of working the

tramways.

16. To enable the Council to levy tolls, rates and charges for the use of the tramways and for the conveyance of passengers and traffic thereon, and to confer, vary or extinguish exemptions from the payment of such tolls, rates and charges, and to alter existing rates, tolls and charges and any exemptions therefrom.

17. To empower the Council to attach brackets, wires and apparatus to any buildings for the purposes of the tramways, and to prescribe the conditions upon which the same may be so

attached.

18. To empower the Board of Trade from time to time to make, and the Council to enforce, bye-laws and regulations relating to the use of electrical power, and for insuring the protection and accommodation of passengers, and the carrying of traffic in and along the streets in which the tramways are laid.

19. To make provision for the interchange of traffic upon the tramways authorized by the Bill and upon other tramways connected or which may hereafter be connected therewith, and to authorize cheap fares for the labouring

classes.

20. To provide that all or any tramways authorized by the Bill may be worked on Sundays, and to enable the Council to acquire, hold and exercise patent rights and licences with regard to electric traction or motive power.

21. To authorize the Council to make and maintain the following new roads, street widenings and works, wholly situate within the district, with all needful and desirable works and conveniences in connection therewith, namely:—

A New Road (No. 1)—Commencing in Cardiff-road at a point 186 yards, or thereabouts, measured in a southerly direction from the south-east corner of Clarence-street and terminating by a junction with Cardiff-road at a point 44 yards, or thereabouts, measured in a south-easterly direction from the south corner of Bell-place.

A New Road (No. 2)—Commencing at the touth-west end of Gooseberry-hill at a point 120 yards, or thereabouts, measured in a south-westerly direction from the east corner of Fforchneol Arms, and terminating by a junction with Fair View-terrace at its north-east end.

A New Road (No. 3)—Commencing at the south-west end of Fair View-terrace at a point 2 yards, or thereabouts, measured in a south-westerly direction from the south-west corner of Fair View-terrace, and terminating by a junction with Fforchaman-road at a point 46 yards, or thereabouts, measured in a north-easterly direction from the south-west corner of Cwmneol Inn.

Widening No. 1.—A widening on the south side of Gadlys-road between points 0·1 chain and 2·5 chains south-eastward of the south-east corner of No. 100, Gadlys-road.

Widzuing No. 1a.—A widening on the south side of Gadlys-road between points 3.5 chains and 4.1 chains south-eastward of the south-east corner of No. 100, Gadlys-road, including the widening of Gadlys Bridge over the Taff Vale Railway.

Widening No. 2.—A widening on the south side of Gadlys-road, commencing at the termination of Widening No. 1A, and terminating at the north-east corner of No. 28, High-street.

Widening No. 3.—A widening on the southwest side of Cardiff-road (the Mardy Grounds) from its junction with Bethuel-street to a point 0.4 chain north-westward of the north-west side of Victoria Inn.

Widening No. 4.—A widening on the west side of Cardiff-road between points 0.2 chain and 2.3 chains, or thereabouts, south-east of the east corner of Victoria Inn.

Widening No. 5.—A widening on the east side of Cardiff-road between points 0.5 chain and 5.5 chains, or thereabouts, north of the south-west corner of No. 18, Cardiff-road.

Widening No. 6.—A widening on the northeast side of Cardiff-road between points 0.2 chain and 3.1 chains south-eastward of the south corner of No. 28, Cardiff-road.

Widening No. 7.—A widening on the south side of Cardiff-road between points 3.2 chains and 5.1 chains, or thereabouts, east of the intersection of the said road with Sunnybank-street.

Widening No. 8.—A widening on the east side of Cardiff-road between points 0.4 chain and 3.1 chains north of the intersection of the said road with Ynyslwyd-road.

Widening No. 9.—A widening on the southwest side of Cardiff-road from its junction with Mount-street to a point 4.0 chains, or thereabouts, south-eastward of the said street.

Widening No. 10.—A widening on both sides of Cardiff-road between Mount Hill-street and Mason-street.

Widening No. 11.—A widening on the west side of Cardiff-road and north side of Clarence-street between points 1.5 chains, or thereabouts, south of the south-east corner of the boundary wall of Aberaman School and 0.6 chain from the intersection of Clarence-street with Cardiff-road.

Widening No. 12.—A widening on the south side of Clarence-street and south-east side of Jubilee-road between points 1.6 chains, or thereabouts, east of the east corner of Bethany Congregational Chapel and 0.3 chain, or thereabouts, south-westward of the east corner of the said chapel.

Widening No. 13.—A widening on the southeast side of Gooseberry-hill between points 3.6 chains, or thereabouts, and 9.2 chains, or thereabouts, south-westward of Cwmamanroad.

22. To empower the Council to deviate in the construction of any of the intended works authorized by the Bill to the extent shown on the plans to be deposited as hereinafter mentioned or to be sanctioned by Parliament.

23. To authorize the Council in connection with the tramways, new streets and street widenings, to make and maintain all necessary approaches, retaining walls, piers, abutments, embankments, girders, cantilevers, bridges, arches, sewers, drains, goits, culverts, excavations and other works and conveniences.

24. To authorize the Council to construct a public footpath upon and along the north side of the graveyard of St. John's Church, Aberdarc, and for that purpose to remove so far as may be necessary the grave and head stones therein, and to acquire and take portions of the said graveyard and otherwise interfere with the same for the purposes aforesaid.

25. To empower the Council to a ter steps, areas, cellars and pipes, and to appropriate the lands purchased for street widenings as parts of the public highways.

26. To authorize and require the County

Council of Glamorgan to contribute towards the widening or improvement of any main road

authorized by the Bill.

27. To authorize the Council to purchase by compulsion or agreement, or take on lease or otherwise acquire for the new roads, street widenings and footpath, and for the general purposes of their undertaking lands, buildings and hereditaments, subject nevertheless to such regulations and conditions as may be defined by the Bill, and to authorize the Council to use land acquired by them for any one purpose for any other purpose.

28. To define the principle on which the purchase money and compensation payable in respect of lands and property acquired for the proposed new roads, street widenings, footpath and works are to be determined, and to provide for limiting the amount of such compensation and claims in re-

spect thereof in certain cases.

29. To enable the Council to purchase so much only of any property as may be required for the purposes of the Bill, and to exempt the Council from the liability imposed by the 92nd section of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, and from the provisions of the said Act with respect to the sale of superfluous land, and to exempt the Council from the operation of section 133 of that Act

30. To enable the Council to make all necessary and convenient junctions and communications with any roads or streets intersected or interfered with by the intended works, and to cross, open or break up all such roads, highways, streets, places, sewers, pipes, and telegraphic or telephonic or other apparatus within the district as may be necessary or convenient to cross, open or break up

for the purpose of the Bill.

31. To enable the Council to sell, convey, lease, exchange, and otherwise dispose of for building purposes and otherwise any lands, houses and property, or any easement, right or privilege in, under, over or through the same, which may be acquired by or vested in them under the powers, and may not be required for the purposes of the Bill, and to sell and dispose of any building, paving or other material.

32. To enable the Council to acquire by compulsion or agreement the lands hereinafter described, and any interests, rights or privileges over or affecting the same (that is to say):

(1) A piece of land and occupation road containing one acre and three-quarters, or thereabouts, situate in the parish of Aberdare, on the north-east side of Gadlys-road, forming part of the old Gadlys Iron Works and Coke Yards, and comprising parts of the enclosure and buildings thereon numbered 551 on the Ordnance Map of the said parish (scale 2500) published in 1868.

2. A piece of land containing one acre and a-half, or thereabouts, situate in the parish of Aberdare aforesaid, at the rear of Cardiffroad, on the south-west side thereof, bounded on the north-west by Club-street and on the south-east by the boundary wall of Blaengwawr School, and comprising part of the enclosure numbered 936 on the said Ordnance Map.

33. To empower the Council upon all or any of such lands to erect, work, maintain and use a station or stations for generating, transforming and transmitting electrical energy with all batteries, dynamos, transformers, accumulators, condensers, engines, apparatus, plant, machinery and other works, appliances and conveniences for that purpose, and to generate, transform and

transmit such energy accordingly.

34. To authorize the Council upon all or any of such lands to erect, maintain and use a refuse destructor or refuse destructors with all necessary plant, machinery, works, buildings, appliances, apparatus and conveniences for that purpose; and to authorize the Council to manufacture slabs, bricks and other material from the clinker refuse arising therefrom.

35. To enable the Council and any Local Authority, Company or person to enter into or carry into effect contracts for the supply of electricity for all purposes within or beyond the existing limits of supply of the Council; and to confer upon the Council and such Councils, Company or person powers enabling them to lay down the necessary mains and pipes, to break-up streets and highways, and to raise money upon the security of public rates, or otherwise, for any

of such purposes.

36. To empower the Council to purchase, provide, sell and let on hire or otherwise deal in and fix motors, pipes, fittings, engines, stoves, wires, fuses, switches, lamps, dynamos and other apparatus incidental to the supply or consumption of electricity, and to exclude the same from liability to distress; and to make provision in regard to construction, laying down, inspection and testing of meters and any of the articles and things aforesaid in premises supplied by the Council with electricity.

37. To empower the Council to alter the time for filling up annual accounts to allow discounts on charges for electrical energy, and to enable the Council to make bye-laws with respect to electrical fittings, and to exempt the Council from liability to supply in certain cases.

38. To enable the Council to levy and charge such rates, rents and charges for the supply of electricity in bulk or otherwise as may be specified

by the Bill.

39. To empower the Council to borrow money for all or any of the purposes of the Bill, and for the general purposes of their tramways, new roads, street widenings and electrical Undertakings, and for such other purposes as may be prescribed or authorized by the Bill; and to charge the money so borrowed and interest upon the security of the whole or part of the revenues of the Council from time to time arising from the tramways and electrical and other undertakings and property for the time being of the Council, or some of them, and on any other funds and rates established and leviable by the Council, and to empower the Council to apply any of their funds to any of the purposes of the Bill, and to provide for the disposal or application of the revenues arising from the tramways and electrical Undertakings, and to make further provision with reference to the existing debts of the Council, and otherwise in relation to the finances, rates and revenues of the Council.

40. To empower the Council to extend the provisions of any existing bye-laws; to make new bye-laws, rules and regulations with reference to any or all of the foregoing matters and to enforce the same by penalties or otherwise, or to vary or rescind the same; and to confer upon them all powers, rights, authorities and privileges which are or may become necessary for carrying the powers granted by the Bill into execution.

41. To incorporate with alterations and amendments, and to apply, amend, alter or repeal all or some of the provisions of the several Acts of Parliament or Provisional Order following, or some of them (that is to say) :- The Aberdare Electric Lighting Order, 1902, and any Acts or Orders relating to the district; the Lands Clauses Acts; the Tramways Act, 1870, and all Acts amending the said Acts respectively, or any of them.

42. To vary, repeal or extinguish all existing rights, powers and privileges which would in any manner interfere with or prevent the carrying into effect of any of the objects of the Bill, and to confer other rights, powers and privileges.

And Notice is hereby also given, that on or before the 30th day of November instant plans and sections showing the lines, situations and levels of the proposed tramways, new roads, street widenings and footpath, and showing also the lands intended to be taken compulsorily under the powers of the Bill, with a book of reference to such plans and a copy of this Notice as published in the London Gazette, will be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Glamorgan at his offices at Cardiff, and with the Clerk to the Urban District Council of Aberdare at the Town Hall, Aberdare.

Printed copies of the Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Offices of the Houses of Lords and Commons on or before the 17th day of December next.

(Application to the Board of Trade under the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, for a Provisional Order for the Production and Supply of Electricity for all Public and Private Purposes within the Borough of Conway, in the County of Carnarvon; Breaking up of Streets, &c; Construction of Works; Transfer of Undertaking; Borrowing of Money; and other incidental purposes.)

OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Conway (hereinafter called "the Undertakers"), whose address is the Council Offices, Conway, for a Provisional Order (hereinafter called "the Order") under the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):

To authorize the Undertakers to produce, store, supply, sell and distribute electricity for all public and private purposes as defined by the said Electric Lighting Acts within the borough of Conway, in the county of Carnarvon (hereinafter called "the area of supply"), and to confer upon the Undertakers all or some of the powers of the said Acts, and all such other powers as may be necessary or expedient for giving effect to the provisions and objects of the Order, and to alter, vary or extinguish all rights or privileges which would or might interfere therewith.

To incorporate with the Order the provisions of the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, subject to such variations, modifications or exceptions as may be prescribed by the Order.

To authorize the Undertakers to purchase, take on lease or acquire by agreement any lands for the purposes of the Order, or to appropriate for such purposes any lands belonging to or held by them, and to construct, lay down, alter, renew and maintain on lands belonging to, leased by, or to be acquired by the Undertakers, stations, buildings and works requisite for the generation, storage, supply and distribution of electricity within the area of supply, or for other purposes of the Order, together with all engines, machinery and apparatus necessary or convenient for such purposes.

To authorize the Undertakers to lay down or erect electric lines, posts and other apparatus, and to open and break up for the purposes of the Order all streets and thoroughfares within the area of supply, and take up, relay, divert or alter all sewers, drains, mains and pipes therein, and to do all such works as may be necessary to carry

into effect the objects of the Order.

View-terrace, Waen-road, Marine-crescent, the embankment leading therefrom to Llandudno Junction, the roads over the bridges across the London and North Western Railway at Rosemary-lane, Upper Gate-street, Townditch and Cadnant Park approach road, and the respective approaches to such roads.

Railways.

London and North Western Railway, Waen level crossing, Deganwy level crossing, I lan-

dudno Junction level crossing.

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall apply and extend to all cars of the Company, and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make Bye-laws and

2. Every person shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor. No passenger shall board or enter or attempt to board or enter a car until all passengers desiring to alight have done so.

3. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette inside any car or any compartment of a car not especially provided for that purpose. Any person offending against this Byelaw is liable, in addition to incurring the penalty below mentioned, to be summarily removed at the first opportunity from the car.

No person shall spit in or upon any car.

5. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any car, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

6. No person in a state of intoxication, or have, with the sanction of the Local Government affected with any dangerous, contagious or Board, ordered and declared that, on and after the infectious disorder, shall enter or mount upon any car, and any such person found in or upon any car shall be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the conductor.

- 7. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any car, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.
- 8. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage any cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed For other notice, in or upon any car, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.
- 9. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of the car, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person, who, in the opinion of the conductor, might, for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter into or mount upon, or remain in or upon any car, and shall not enter into or mount upon any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in or upon any car shall, on request of the conductor, leave the car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.
- 10. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Company the fare legally demandable for the journey.
- 11. Each passenger shall show his ticket when required to do so to the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Company, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.
- 12. A ticket shall only be available for the car on or for which it is issued (except in the case of transfer or season tickets), and no passenger shall be entitled to leave any car for any purpose whatever at any stage or place and resume his journey by a different car to that on or for which such ticket was issued, without payment of a fresh fare from the point at which the passenger entered the second or other car.
- 13. No passenger shall wilfully alter or deface his ticket so as to render the number or any material portion illegible.
- 14. No passenger shall use or attempt to use a ticket on any day for which such ticket is not available, or which has already been used on a previous journey.
- 15. A passenger not being an artizan, mechanic or daily labourer, within the true intents and meanings of the statutory provisions relating to the Company, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artizans, mechanics and daily labourers.
- 16. No passenger shall bring in or on to any car any luggage other than his own personal luggage, and any such personal luggage shall be carried at the responsibility of the passenger. The personal luggage of any passenger must not exceed 28 lbs. in weight, and must be carried by hand, and must not occupy or overlap any part of a seat, or be placed so as to reduce the clear way between seats, nor be of a form or description to annoy or inconvenience any other passenger.
- 17. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Company shall ride on the steps or

- platforms of any car, or stand on the roof or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any car. Any passenger or other person so acting shall cease to do so immediately on the request of the conductor. No person, except a passenger or intending passengers, shall board a car, and no person shall hold on or hang on to any part of a
- 18. When any car contains the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice attached to the car, is provided, no person beyond such number shall enter except by first obtaining the express permission of the conductor.
- 19. No person shall enter, mount or leave, or attempt to enter, mount or leave any car whilst in motion.
- 20. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or upon any car except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to any passenger. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any car after having been requested by the conductor not to do so. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.
- 21. No person shall travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument or implement, or any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.
- 22. No person other than the conductor or motorman or other servant of the Company acting in the performance of his duty shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controller, brakes, lamps, lights, trolley rope, or any part of a car or its equipment, and no person other than the conductor or other servant of the Company acting in the performance of his duty shall ring the bell or otherwise signal the car to start.
- 23. No person shall wilfully obstruct any conductor, motorman or other servant of the Company acting in the performance of his duty upon or in connection with any car or lines or any part thereof.
- 24. The conductor of each car shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations to the best of his ability.
