24. To empower the Corporation to grant gratuities to their officers or servants, to lay mains and pipes in private streets for the supply of gas, water or electricity to apportion expenses between joint owners and declare same to be private improvement expenses, power to use land acquired for one purpose for other purposes, and to provide that persons acting in execution of Act are not to be personally liable.

25. To vary or extinguish all existing rights and privileges which would in any manner interfere with or prevent the carrying into effect of any of the objects of the Bill, and to confer other

rights and privileges.

26. To incorporate, amend, extend, enlarge or repeal the powers and provisions, or some of them, of the Colne Corporation Act, 1897, and any other Act or Order relating to the Corporation.

27. To incorporate and apply, with or without amendment or modification, or to render wholly or partially inapplicable as the case may require, all or some of the following public Acts (that is to say) :- The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882; the Public Health Acts; the Markets and Fairs Clauses Act, 1847; the Local Loans Act, 1875; the Lands Clauses Acts; and any other public or general Act which it may be necessary or desirable to incorporate or apply for effecting any of the intended objects.
