The KING has been pleased, by Letters Patent, dated 19th November, 1904, passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, to further amend the Letters Patent, dated 16th September, 1885, altering the Constitution of the Council of Government of the Colony of Mauritius.

The Right Honourable Aretas Akers-Douglas, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has appointed J. MacLeod Carey, Esq., to be an Assistant Inspector of Mines under the Coal Mines Regulation Acts, 1887 to 1896, and has directed him to Act also as an Inspector for the purposes of the Metalliferous Mines Regulation Acts, 1872 and 1875, and of the Quarries Act, 1894; and has further appointed him to be an Inspector of Factories and Workshops for the purposes of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901.

**WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).**

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Nottingham) Order, 1904.

Dated 29th November, 1904.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Nottingham, I hereby make the following Order:—

*Title.*

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (County of Nottingham) Order, 1904.

**BIRDS.**

*Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.*

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County of Nottingham to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—

Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Dipper, Kite, Nuthatch, Osprey, Robin, Great Grey Shrike, Red-backed Shrike, Wren (all species).

*Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.*

III. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of any of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Nottingham:—

Avocet, Bittern, Bullfinch, Bunting (all species), Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chaffinch, Crossbill, Dipper, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Greenfinch, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kite, Common Linnet, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Oriole, Osprey, Owl (all species), Redpole, Great Grey Shrike, Red-backed Shrike, Siskin, Warbler (all species), Waxwing, Woodpecker (all species), Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck.
