No. 6 Company, Indian Mounted Infantry	Lieutenant Herbert Augustine Carter, Indian Army	During a reconnaissance near Jidballi, on 19th December, 1903, when the two Sections of the Poona Mounted Infantry and the Tribal Horse were retiring before a force of Dervishes which outnumbered them by thirty to one, Lieutenant Carter rode back alone, a distance of four hundred yards, to the assistance of Private Jai Singh, who had lost his horse, and was closely pursued by a large number of the enemy, and, taking the Sepoy up behind him, brought him safely away. When Lieutenant Carter reached Private Jai Singh, the Sections were several hundred yards off.

In consequence of the above, the appointment of this Officer to the Distinguished Service Order, which was notified in the London Gazette of 7th June, 1904, is cancelled,

**WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).**

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Glamorgan) Order, 1904.

Dated 7th December, 1904.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Glamorgan, I hereby make the following Order:—

*Title.*

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Glamorgan) Order, 1904."

**BIRDS.**

*Close Time for Wild Duck varied.*

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Duck is prohibited throughout the County of Glamorgan shall be varied so as to be the period between the 1st day of February and the 1st day of July in any year.

**EGGS.**

*Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.*

III. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Glamorgan:—

Kentish Dotterel, Goldfinch, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Nightingale, Nightjar, Ring Ouzel, Water Ouzel, Oyster Catcher, Barn Owl, Brown Owl, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, Stormy Petrel, Lesser Tern, Woodlark, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

*Repeal of former Orders.*

IV. The Orders of the 11th March, 1895, and the 6th April, 1897, are hereby repealed.

## CITY OF WORCESTER.

### TRAMWAYS AND LIGHT RAILWAYS.

#### Bye-laws.

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that the City Council on the 15th November, 1904, made the following Bye-laws:—

#### Definitions.

1. The expression "the Council" means the Council of the City of Worcester.

The expression "the Railways" includes all tramways and light railways constructed in the City of Worcester, under the powers of the Tramways Act, 1870, the Worcester Tramways Act, 1901, the Worcester and District Light Railways Order, 1901, and the Worcester (Extension) Light Railways Order, 1902.

The term "Car" shall mean any carriage using the railways, and the terms "Driver" and "Conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor, or other person having charge, of a car.

#### Distances between Cars.

2. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than 40 yards.

#### Stopping Places.

3. Subject to the requirements of Bye-law No. 3 the driver and conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers at such points as shall be approved from time to time by the Council, such points to be indicated by notices affixed to the tramway or electric lamp posts.

4. Except at a passing place or terminus, or at points fixed and approved by the Council for the setting down or taking up of passengers, no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction of two or more streets or roads, nor within 10 yards of a car on an adjoining line of rails.

#### Traffic on Roads.

5. A driver of a car on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road, so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with all reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed, so as not to obstruct the car.

6. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the railways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption of the ordinary road traffic.

#### Sunday Traffic.

7. No car shall be used on the railways on any Sunday earlier than 1 o'clock P.M.

#### Advertisements, &c., on Cars.

8. No advertisement, board, placard, or notice which shall be unsafe, unsightly, or inconvenient

shall be placed on or in any car, and it shall be the duty of the Company working the railways to remove any such advertisement, board, placard, or notice, on or in the car, when required to do so by the Council.

#### Overcrowding.

9. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Company shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platform of any car, or stand on the roof or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any car, and any person so travelling, standing, or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

10. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any car, except straps or other appliances provided inside or outside the car for the convenience of passengers.

11. When any car contains in the interior thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation is provided in such interior, no additional person shall enter, or remain in the interior of such car, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained.

A conductor may allow passengers to stand inside a car during inclement weather, and on public holidays, and busy days, but he shall not allow more passengers than one-third of the number of passengers for which seating accommodation is provided inside such car, to enter the inside thereof, in excess of the number of passengers for which seating accommodation is provided inside such car.

When a car contains on the outside thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation is provided on such outside, no additional person shall enter, board, or remain thereon.

12. When a car contains the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation is provided in or on such car, a notice to that effect shall be placed in conspicuous letters, and in a conspicuous position on the car.

13. Subject to the provisions of Bye-law No. 11, the conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond the number for which seating accommodation is provided in or on such car to enter, or mount, or remain in or upon any part of a car.

14. The Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Council on the 1st July, 1884, and allowed by the Board of Trade on the 3rd September, 1884, and the Bye-laws made by the Council on the 7th July, 1885, and allowed by the said Board on the 10th September, 1885, are hereby repealed.

15. These Bye-laws shall come into force and have effect from and after the 1st day of March, 1905.

16. Any person who offends against any of the preceding Bye-laws shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings, and to a further penalty not exceeding ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues after conviction therefor.
