Notice is hereby given that Their Majesties the King and Queen will hold a series of Courts at Buckingham Palace during the coming season, at which presentations of Ladies to Their Majesties will be made.

Attendance and Presentation at these Courts will be by Summons issued by the Lord

Chamberlain.

Ladies who have already been presented and who are desirous of being summoned to these Courts are requested to send in their names, together with those of their husbands (if they desire to be accompanied by them, and if they have been presented), to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, on, or as soon as possible after, the 2nd January next. Should they desire to make a presentation, the name of the Lady to be presented should be sent in at the same time. The Lord Chamberlain will be glad if Ladies will state, in addition, when it will be most convenient to them to pay their respects to Their Majesties, i.e., whether before or after Easter.

Two Courts will be held by Their Majesties before Easter, probably during the month of February.

Gentlemen who come in attendance on their families are not expected to pass the Presence.

A Lady who makes a presentation to Their Majesties must be personally acquainted with and responsible for the Lady she presents. She must herself attend the Court, and cannot present more than one Lady in addition to her daughter or daughter-in-law.

If it should not be convenient for a Lady to attend or be presented at the particular Court to which she is summoned, it will be open to her to make her excuses to the Lord Chamberlain in writing, when her name can, if desired, and if possible, be transferred to another List.

The Courts will be held in the evening.

The Dress Regulations are:—Ladies: Full Court dress, with feathers and trains. Gentlemen: Full Court dress.

A further notice will be published as to the dates, the issue of Presentation Cards, and other arrangements.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section twenty-six of "The Pluralities Act 1838" after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, "chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother "churches to which they belong, with great

"advantage, and places altogether extra-paro-" chial may in some instances with advantage be " annexed to parishes or districts to which they "are contiguous, or be constituted separate "parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with " respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the " Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop " of any diocese shall represent to the said Arch-" bishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such "Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as "the case may be, may be advantageously " separated from any parish or mother church " and either be constituted a separate benefice " by itself or be united to any other parish to " which it may be more conveniently annexed, or " to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, " place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, " so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or " that any extra-parochial place may with advan-" tage be annexed to any parish to which it is "contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish " for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Arch-"bishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in " writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be trans-" mitted to the said Archbishop for his considera-"tion) describing the mode in which it appears " to him that the alteration may best be effected, "and how the changes consequent on such "alteration in respect to ecclesiastical juris-"diction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and "other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, " may be made with justice to all parties in-"terested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such " alteration shall consent in writing under his or " their hands to such scheme, or to such modifi-"cation thereof as the said Archbishop may "approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full " consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any " such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall " certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, " by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall " be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an "Order for carrying such scheme, or modifica-" tion thereof, as the case may be, into effect.

And whereas the Right Reverend Edward Carr Lord Bishop of Peterborough, hath pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, represented in a writing dated the fourth August, one thousand nine hundred and four to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"I the Right Reverend Edward Carr, Lord Bishop of Peterborough, do hereby represent to your Grace that there is in the county of Leicester and in my diocese the rectory of Sharnford.

"That there is in the same county and diocese and immediately adjoining to the said rectory of Sharnford an ancient hamlet or chapelry known by the name of the hamlet or chapelry of Wigston Parva, belonging to the vicarage of Claybrooke in the said county, the boundaries whereof are well known and defined.

"That the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, First Lord of the Treasnry, is the patron or person entitled in right of the Crown to present to the said vicarage of Claybrooke, and that the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain in right of the Crown is the patron or person entitled to present to the said rectory of Sharnford.

"That the population of the said rectory of Sharnford according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one is four hundred and eighteen persons, and the annual value of the

said rectory is two hundred and three pounds four shillings and two pence.

"That the population of the said hamlet or chapelry of Wigston Parva is forty-nine persons.

"That there is a church within the rectory of Sharnford aforesaid, and also a church or chapel within the hamlet or chapelry of Wigston Parva aforesaid.

"That the church or chapel of Wigston Parva aforesaid is distant from the parish church of Claybrooke three miles or thereabouts, and from the parish church of Sharnford one and a half miles or thereabouts.

"That the church of Sharnford affords accommodation for two hundred persons and the chapel

of Wigston Parva for thirty persons.

"That the said hamlet or chapelry of Wigston Parva appears to have been from time immemorial treated as a separate and distinct parish for all civil purposes.

"That the said chapelry has its own churchwardens overseers and other parish officers, and is in no way connected with the said parish of Claybrooke in respect to rates of any kind.

"That the inhabitants of the said hamlet or chapelry of Wigston Parva have their marriages and burials solemnized and performed in the parish church of Claybrooke aforesaid, and in the burial ground belonging to the said parish, and it is proposed upon the completion of this scheme that they should have their marriages and burials respectively solemnized and performed in the parish church of Sharnford and in the burial ground belonging to the said parish.

ground belonging to the said parish.

"That the gross yearly income of the vicarage of Claybrooke aforesaid amounts to the sum of

four hundred and forty-eight pounds.

"That it does not appear that any of the inhabitants or landowners of Claybrooke possess any legal right by faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any pews or sittings in the chapel of Wigston Parva, or that any of the inhabitants or landowners of Wigston Parva possess any such legal right by faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any pews or sittings in the church of Claybrooke aforesaid.

"That there is a house of residence within the said rectory of Sharnford for the use and occupa-

tion of the Incumbent thereof.

"That the vicar of Claybrooke aforesaid engages upon the completion of the scheme hereinafter proposed to give up the apportioned tithe rent charge which is derived from the hamlet or chapelry of Wigston Parva aforesaid, the commuted value of which is fifty-one pounds five shillings and nine pence.

"That it appears to me that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament of the 1st and 2nd years of the reign of Her late Majesty cap. 106, and of the 2nd and 3rd years of the same reign, cap. 49, the said hamlet or chapelry of Wigston Parva may be advantageously separated from the said vicarage of Claybrooke and be annexed to the said rectory of Sharnford for all ecclesiastical purposes.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Acts of Parliament I have prepared the following scheme which I submit to your Grace to the intent that your Grace may if on full consideration and enquiry you shall be satisfied with such scheme certify the same to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the consents of the patrons and Incumbents of the said benefices respectively are as follows:—

sand nine hundred and one is four hundred and | "That the said chapelry of Wigston Parva eighteen persons, and the annual value of the shall be for all ecclesiastical purposes separated

from the vicarage of Claybrooke and annexed to the said rectory of Sharnford, and the vicar for the time being of the said vicarage shall be exempt from all cure of souls within the said hamlet or chapelry of Wigston Parva so proposed to be separated and annexed as aforesaid.

"That the inhabitants residing within the said chapelry of Wigston Parva shall not be entitled to any pews or sittings or other accommodation within the church or chapel of the said vicarage of Claybrooke, and shall be exempt from all rates, charges, and assessments to be made for or in respect of the church, chapel, and chancel within and belonging to the said vicarage.

"That the tithe rent charge and all ecclesiastical dues, offerings, fees, and emoluments arising within the said chapelry of Wigston Parva shall from and immediately after the said hamlet or chapelry is annexed to the said rectory of Sharnford, belong to and be paid to the said rector of Sharnford and his successors.

"That the inhabitants of the said chapelry of Wigston Parva shall have their marriages and burials solemnized and performed in the parish church of Sharnford aforesaid, and in the burial ground belonging to the said parish.

"That the right of patronage or presentation to the said benefice of Sharnford shall remain as heretofore.

" I, the undersigned, being the patron or person entitled to present, in right of the Crown, to the said rectory of Sharnford do by this writing under my hand signify to your Grace my consent to the scheme above proposed to your Grace for separating the said hamlet or chapelry of Wigston Parva from the said vicarage of Claybrooke and annexing it to the rectory of Sharnford.

And whereas the said scheme hath been transmitted by the said Bishop to the said Archbishop for his consideration:

And whereas the said Archbishop, being satisfied with the said scheme, hath certified the same and the consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council by his report dated the second day of November, one thousand nine hundred and four,

which said report is in the words and figures following:

"We the undersigned Randall Thomas Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby

report to Your Majesty in Council,
"That the Right Reverend Edward Carr Bishop of Peterborough has represented unto us

(amongst other things)

"That there are in the county of Leicester and his diocese of Peterborough the benefice (being a rectory) of Sharnford and the benefice (being a vicarage) of Claybrooke.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that a certain portion or district of the said parish of Claybrooke comprising the ancient hamlet or chapelry of Wigston Parva the boundaries whereof are well known and defined may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Claybrooke and annexed to the parish of Sharnford for ecclesiastical purposes only under the provisions

of the Pluralities Act 1838.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain the patron or person entitled to present in right of the Crown to the said benefice of Sharnford in case the same were now vacant, the Reverend Ebenezer Douglas Starey, the Incumbent of the same benefice, the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, First Lord of His Majesty's Treasury, the patron or person entitled to present in right of the Crown to the said benefice of Claybrooke in case the same were now vacant, and the Reverend Charles Frederick Hayter, the Incumbent of the same benefice has been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents above referred to

are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act 1838 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the same scheme into effect.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7 HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners

for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh

years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirtyseven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the first day of December, in the year one thousand nine hundred and four, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of All Saints, Wellingborough, in the county of Northampton, and in the diocese of Peterborough.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said new parish of All Saints, Wellingborough, is a new parish wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said new parish of All Saints, Wellingborough, which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the

purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas Harriet Elsden Sharman, Henrietta Eliza Sharman, and Mary Gertrude Sharman, all of Elsden Lodge, Wellingborough aforesaid, Spinsters, have contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of Eugland a sum of four thousand three hundred pounds sterling towards the endowment of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore-mentioned Act then of the said new parish and towards the maintenance of the minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being and we have in respect of such sum agreed and have undertaken to provide and pay by equal quarterly payments on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August and the first day of November in each and every year to such minister or Incumbent as aforesaid when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the lastly-mentioned Act the sum of one hundred and twenty-nine pounds per annum so long as the said capital sum shall remain in our hands.

"And whereas the said capital sum of four thousand three hundred pounds sterling has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that we should grant out of the common fund created by the firstly hereinbefore-mentioned Act a capital sum of seven hundred pounds sterling in respect of which there shall be paid by us to the minister or Incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district or new parish when duly licensed as before mentioned a yearly sum of twenty-one pounds and upon the further understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said district or new parish and

the nomination of the minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas the said grant of seven hundred pounds sterling will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme be made and secured by an instrument to be executed by us, the said Commissioners, under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twentyninth and thirtieth years of Her said late Majesty,

chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Honourable and Right Reverend Edward Carr, Bishop of Peterborough (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said new parish of All Saints, Wellingborough, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Mary the Virgin, Wellingborough.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and when such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and the nomination of the minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may be exercised by the said Harriet Elsden Sharman, the said Henrietta Eliza Sharman, and the said Mary Gertrude Sharman, their heirs and assigns for ever, as joint tenants.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or any of them or any other Act of

Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Mary the Virgin,

Wellingborough, being:-

"All that part of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of All Saints, Wellingborough, in the county of Northampton and in the diocese of Peterborough, which is bounded upon the east partly by the parish of Irthlingborough and partly by the parish of Finedon, upon the north-west by the parish of Wellingborough, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Wellingborough from the said new parish of All Saints, Wellingborough, at the junction of Finedon-road and Albert-road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Albertroad for a distance of twenty-four chains or thereabouts to its junction with Mill-road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Mill-road for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to its junction with Ranelagh-road, and extending thence south-eastward along the

middle of Ranelagh-road for a distance of sixteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Midlandroad and Brook-street East, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Brook-street East for a distance of six chains and a half or thereabouts to the wall at its southern end which separates it from Swan's Pool Brook, and extending thence in the same direction and in a straight line to the middle of Swan's Pool Brook and then first eastward and afterwards south-eastward along the middle of the said brook for a distance of forty chains or thereabouts to the confluence of such brook with the River Ise, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of All Saints, Wellingborough, from the said parish of Irthling borough."
