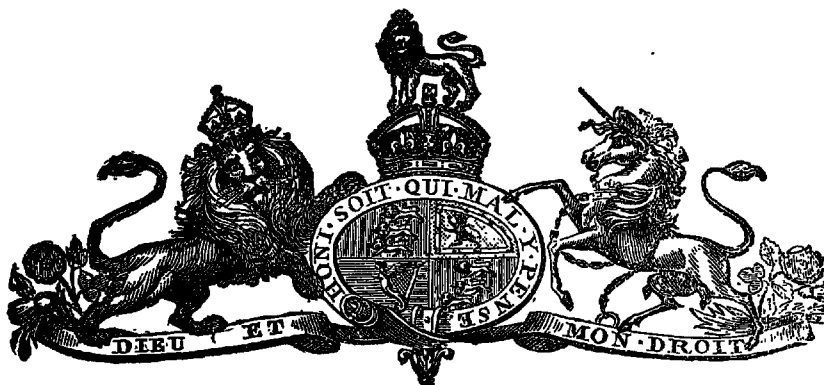

Rule of the Supreme Court.

The following draft Rule is published pursuant to the Rules Publication Act, 1893.

Money paid into Court in action remitted to County Court.

Where money has been paid into Court in an action which is subsequently remitted to a County Court, the money shall be subject to any Order made in the action by the County Court as if it were an Order of the High Court.
