

EARL'S COURT ROAD,
Penywern Road.

Eight Carriages.

In two portions, viz. :—

First portion :—Two carriages by the kerb on East side of Earl's Court Road, opposite the District Railway Station; horses' heads North.

Second portion :—Six carriages in centre of Penywern Road; commencing six feet from the crossing at its junction with Earl's Court Road, and extending Westward; horses' heads East.

The first portion of the standing is to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion.

FINCHLEY ROAD
and
LYMINGTON ROAD

Nine Carriages.

In three portions, viz. :—

First portion :—Three carriages on West side of Finchley Road, by kerb in front of Finchley Road Railway Station (London and North Western Railway); horses' heads South.

Second portion :—One carriage on South side of Lymington Road at its junction with Finchley Road; horse's head East.

Third portion :—Five carriages on South side of Lymington Road; commencing at the East end of boundary wall of the Hampstead Borough Council's stone-yard, and extending Westwards; horses' heads East.

The first portion of the standing is to be fed exclusively by the carriage from the second portion, and the second portion by carriages from the third.

Twelve Carriages.

In Blackfriars Road, as far as necessary from South corner of Stamford Street, along centre of road.

STANLEY ROAD,
Teddington.

Two Carriages.

In Stanley Road, on the South side by the footway opposite the Wesleyan Chapel; horses' heads to face Eastwards.

STOCKWELL ROAD,
The Swan Public-house and
St. Michael's Road.

Thirteen Carriages.

In two portions, viz. :—

First portion :—Seven carriages on the South side of Stockwell Road; commencing at the Swan Public-house, and extending Southward alongside the kerb as far as necessary; horses' heads toward Clapham Road.

Second portion :—Six carriages on the North side of St. Michael's Road; commencing at the junction of Stockwell Road, and extending Eastward alongside the kerb as far as necessary; horses' heads toward Stockwell Road.

The first portion of the standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion.

ST. GEORGE'S STREET,

Six Carriages.

Commencing opposite the Hoop and Grapes Public-house, in centre of street to No. 82.

CHRISTCHURCH ROAD,
Brondesbury.

Six Carriages.

At the North side of Christchurch Road, Brondesbury; horses' heads facing Eastwards; commencing four feet from the footway of Edgware Road, and extending Westwards as far as necessary for two cabs; then commencing again under the railway arch, and continuing Westwards as far as necessary for four cabs.
