The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

SPECIAL REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Assistant Surveyor of Taxes in the Department of Inland Revenue. (Supplementary to the General Regulations respecting Open Competitive Examinations for situations in the Civil Service included in Schedule A of the Order in Council of 4th June, 1870.)

N.B.—*These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.*

1. The limits of age for this situation are 19 and 22. Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.

2. The Examination will be in the following subjects:—

1. English Composition (including Spelling and Handwriting).

2. Arithmetic.

3. Accountancy (including Book-keeping by Double Entry).

4. Political Economy.

5. Law of Evidence.

*6. Latin, Translation and Composition.

*7. French, Translation and Composition.

*8. German, Translation and Composition.

*9. Geography and English History.

*10. Geometry, the substance of Euclid, Books I—IV, and VI; and Algebra up to and including the Binomial Theorem.

* Of the subjects numbered 6 to 10 not more than three may be taken.

3. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as the Commissioners may appoint.

4. A fee of £6 will be required from each Candidate attending the Examination.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 16TH JANUARY 1905.)

BIRMINGHAM (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER
OF 1905.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Swine exposed at a market, fair, or sale in the city of Birmingham licensed or authorised by the Local Authority under the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896, the Birmingham (Swine-Fever) Order of 1897, or the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904, or any of them shall be moved from the market, fair, or sale only if marked in the prescribed manner and if accompanied by a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority authorising such movement and only to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the licence.

2. Swine moved with a licence under the said Orders or any of them or under this Order from any premises in the city shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence, and shall be there detained until they are slaughtered, but they need not be slaughtered within the period specified in the said Orders or any of them.

3. Swine moved in accordance with the provisions of the Birmingham (Swine-Fever) Order of 1897, as modified by this Order, shall not, unless otherwise hereafter expressly provided by Order of the Board, be subject to any restriction on movement of swine imposed by any other Order of the Board or by regulations made by the Local Authority of any district, and Article 2 (2) of the said Order of 1897 is hereby revoked.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-third day of January, nineteen hundred and five.

5. This Order shall be read as one with the Birmingham (Swine-Fever) Order of 1897.
