The KING has been graciously pleased to signify His intention to confer the decoration of the Victoria Cross upon the undermentioned Officer, whose claims have been submitted for His Majesty's approval, for his conspicuous bravery in Thibet, as stated against his name:—

8th Gurkha Rifles	Lieutenant John Duncan Grant	<p>On the occasion of the storming of the Gyantse Jong on 6th July, 1904, the storming Company, headed by Lieutenant Grant, on emerging from the cover of the village, had to advance up a bare, almost precipitous, rock-face, with little or no cover available, and under a heavy fire from the curtain, flanking towers on both sides of the curtain, and other buildings higher up the Jong. Showers of rocks and stones were at the time being hurled down the hillside by the enemy from above. One man could only go up at a time, crawling on hands and knees, to the breach in the curtain.</p> <p>Lieutenant Grant, followed by Havildar Karbir Pun, 8th Gurkha Rifles, at once attempted to scale it, but on reaching near the top he was wounded, and hurled back, as was also the Havildar, who fell down the rock some 30 feet.</p> <p>Regardless of their injuries they again attempted to scale the breach, and, covered by the fire of the men below, were successful in their object, the Havildar shooting one of the enemy on gaining the top. The successful issue of the assault was very greatly due to the splendid example shown by Lieutenant Grant and Havildar Karbir Pun.</p> <p>The latter has been recommended for the Indian Order of Merit.</p>

The following Despatches relating to operations in Northern Nigeria in 1903, have been received by the Secretary of State for the Colonies:—

Despatch relating to Field Operations.

SIR,

I have the honour to transmit herewith Colonel Morland's report on the suppression of the late rising or Jihad led by the ex-Sultan of Sokoto, who was deposed by Sir F. D. Lugard after the occupation of Sokoto in March, and who took the field against us in April, the rising being finally suppressed with the death of the Sultan and many of his fanatical followers, including the Magaji of Keffi, the murderer of Captain Moloney, at the capture of Burmi on the 27th of July.

2. During the continuance of these operations the great danger lay in the paucity of the numerous detachments, many of whom might have been cut up at any time had the enemy showed the same pluck and courage at the beginning as was shown at the latter stage, when they twice attacked, during the night, the walled town of Ashaka, where our troops were, and fought so well and died to a man almost in Burmi. This, however, could not well be avoided until orders got to the front suspending aggressive operations until Major Marsh could get up with reinforcements.

3. While deploring the loss of life, one must still bear in mind that, had these irreconcilables who came from all parts of Hausaland lived, they would have kept up that permanent unrest

and ferment which I trust will now be quite at an end.

4. The area over which the operations extended was a very large one. This, combined with the heavy rains, entailed great hardship on the officers and men, the former on many occasions having to live on native food, often being entirely without European provisions.

5. I cordially endorse and quite concur in the recommendations of the officers, non-commissioned officers and men, made by Colonel Morland as deserving a special recognition, and submit for the consideration of His Majesty's Government that the African General Service Medal with clasp Burmi, 1903, be issued to the officers and troops who participated in these operations.

6. In connection with the Civil Staff, I consider the services of Mr. C. Temple, Resident, Bautshi Province, worthy of special mention. Most of the fighting took place in his province, and his services during the operations were performed in an able and most satisfactory manner. His tactful handling of the natives prevented many of them from joining the enemy, especially the greater part of that fanatical sect the Tejani. He was continually with the various columns advising, supplying intelligence, and arranging for food supplies.

7. Mr. Granville's name was mentioned by Major Marsh, who spoke highly of the indefatigable manner in which Mr. Granville worked to get carriers and other necessities for the reinforcements when they were practically brought to a standstill at Loko in the Nassarawa Province.

8. The medical staff consisted of Dr. H. P. Lobb and Dr. W. J. Healey, who were devoted

to the care of the sick and wounded. I consider them both deserving of much credit.

9. Major Marsh's death was keenly felt by all, although the great loss was tempered by the fact that he died as a soldier would wish, directing his storming party in the hour of victory.

10. The complete success of the recent operations, which led to the severest fighting yet undertaken by the West African Frontier Force in Northern Nigeria, will, no doubt, have a most quieting effect throughout the whole of the Sokoto Empire, and has enabled me to effectively occupy Katagum Province the last of the 16 Provinces in the Protectorate.

SIR,

I have the honour to forward the following report on the military operations from the time the ex-Sultan of Sokoto left Gusau in the middle of April till the capture of Burmi and his death on 27th July, compiled from various reports received from different officers.

2. On 15th April the Officer Commanding Sokoto, at the request of the Resident, Major Burdon, detached 60 men under Captain Goodwin from the Sokoto garrison to endeavour to capture the ex-Sultan, who was at Gusau, 100 miles east of that town. This party did not get in touch with him as he fled to the east on their approach.

3. Meanwhile Dr. Cargill, the Resident of Kano, who was touring in his province with a small escort, discovered the movement east, the Sultan passing within a few miles of him, and at once sent instructions to the Officer Commanding Kano to endeavour to head him off, at the same time informing the Resident of Zaria and asking him to do the same.

4. In compliance with these instructions, on 22nd April, Captain Sword, with one British Non-Commissioned Officer, 42 rank and file and a Maxim gun, struck S.E. from Kano. On the same date Major Crawley, Officer Commanding Zaria, despatched Lieut. Crozier and 25 men of the Mounted Infantry from Zaria, with orders to capture the ex-Sultan and Magaji of Keffi, if possible, but not to proceed far in their pursuit; this party came up at Gimmi with some 30 horsemen and 50 footmen in charge of cattle, killing 6 of them, wounding others and capturing the cattle. Two Mounted Infantry men forming part of a patrol of 6 were wounded by poisoned arrows and died from the effects. Continuing the pursuit to Tutumbiki, Lieut. Crozier inflicted further loss on the enemy, but his horses being exhausted and the ex-Sultan being far ahead, he returned to Zaria.

5. At 8 p.m. on the 25th April Captain Sword reached Gala, hoping to surprise the ex-Sultan; but his approach had been observed by horsemen, and the ex-Sultan, Magaji of Keffi, and their following fled in all directions, losing several killed.

On 26th and 27th Captain Sword engaged the rear-guard of the enemy four times, capturing 20 mounted men, some cattle and four rifles.

In the next few days several hundred men, women and children were sent back to their homes.

On the 2nd May at Yarari he was attacked by the people of Duchi and Zutungwa who were

leaving their town to follow the ex-Sultan to the East; he killed 20 of them and dispersed the rest.

On 4th May he was reinforced by 20 men with extra reserve ammunition under Lieutenant Luttmann-Johnson. On 6th he again came up with some 300 horsemen and many bowmen, but the enemy fled after a show of fighting, losing 15 killed.

On the 7th Captain Sword reached the large town of Messau, the Emir of this place was besieging his own town which had been seized by a usurper during his absence at Sokoto some months previously; he had been joined by the ex-Sultan outside the walls. The siege was raised on Captain Sword's approach, the combined forces of Sokoto and Messau flying to the south-east. Captain Sword was well received by the Chief and people in the town.

On the 8th the pursuit was continued; on the 9th a junction was effected with a force from Bautchi which had left that place on May 5th under Major Plummer, consisting of two officers, 70 rank and file, and a Maxim, the total force now consisted of four officers, one British non-commissioned officer, 130 rank and file, with two Maxims.

6. While these operations were in progress, Lieutenant the Honourable D. Carleton, M.I., with one British non-commissioned officer and 15 mounted men left Kano at end of April, and followed in Captain Sword's track, diverging to the south to endeavour to capture a son of the ex-Sultan who was hurrying to join him: a party of 200 of the latter's followers turned on him and attacked him, he killed 13, and the rest fled. Finding large numbers of the population of the various towns who had followed the ex-Sultan returning to their homes, and the country quieting down, he returned to Kano and reported to the Resident. On 8th May, Major Crawley, commanding at Zaria, on receiving news of the extent of the movement despatched Major Barlow, with two officers and 60 men of the Mounted Infantry, to follow Captain Sword and support him.

7. The first definite news of the movement reached me at Zungeru on the 4th May. I at once despatched a runner with detailed instructions to Major Crawley, directing him, as senior officer, to arrange for the co-operation of the garrisons of Kano, Zaria, Bautchi, and Gujiba for the capture of the ex-Sultan; but, owing to the distance from headquarters of the various posts, Residents and officers had rightly acted on their own initiative, and my instructions arrived long after action had been taken by them.

8. To return to the movements of Captain Sword: with the combined force mentioned in paragraph 5, on 10th May, he followed the ex-Sultan along the course of Gongola River, passing many people who were peacefully following him, as they thought, to Mecca, without interfering with them. So far his force had not suffered a single casualty.

On 13th about 11.30 a.m. he was passing the town of Burmi and sent in a messenger to the Mallam of that place, a reputed Mahdi (the successor of Mallam Jibrella), asking him to come out and see him; the Mallam refused to come, so a section under Major Plummer proceeded into the town; they were fired on, and, as large numbers were collecting, retired from the town, joining Captain Sword, who formed square 100 yards from the wall. A determined attack was at once made on the square by hundreds of men who swarmed out of the gates and over the walls; this attack was repulsed with heavy loss to the enemy, but an attempt to enter the town

was checked by a heavy arrow fire. Shortly after this a still more determined attack was made by the enemy headed by the Mallam; the steady fire of the men and Maxim repulsed this charge, the dead lying in heaps in front of the gate. Major Plummer now led another charge on the gate, shooting three of the enemy with his revolver; but this attack also failed.

Captain Sword at 4 P.M. retired to a position 600 yards from the walls; he remained here till 7 P.M. His casualties were two soldiers killed, Major Plummer slightly and Sergeant Hayes severely wounded, 54 men and three Maxim carriers wounded. 150 at least of the enemy were killed. After due consideration he decided that a further attack would have little prospect of success and retired to Bautchi, which he reached on 23rd.

9. Meanwhile the ex-Sultan of Sokoto, Emir of Messau, with many other Chiefs, had reached Gwoni on the left bank of the Gongola, some 30 miles south of Burmi, not having entered the latter town, but having passed within a few miles of it. Captain Hamilton-Browne commanding at Gujiba, received news of the pursuit of the ex-Sultan on 12th May, at noon. He started the same night with one officer, 51 rank and file and a Maxim, and marching via Mutue to Gebe, a point only 20 miles north-east of Burmi, which he reached at 3 A.M. on morning of 14th, and at once despatched a messenger to Captain Sword.

Hearing later of the presence of the ex-Sultan and all the Chiefs at Gwoni and of Captain Sword's retirement from Burmi, he determined to march on the former place and endeavour to surprise the enemy. At 8 A.M. on the 17th, two scouts were captured. At 9 A.M. the ex-Sultan's camp was sighted close to the river. The enemy were completely taken by surprise, Maxim and rifle fire was at once opened, the enemy flying across the Gongola to the west, their entire baggage, 63 guns, a quantity of powder, many camels, horses and donkeys were captured.

The ex-Sultan now fled to Burmi, from whence he wrote a letter to Captain Browne asking permission to proceed to Mecca. He was told to surrender. Captain Browne not being strong enough to take further action at Burmi (the people of which place were much elated at Captain Sword's retreat), returned to Gujiba, leaving a patrol on left bank of Gongola to watch the movements of the enemy.

10. Major Barlow, who had left Zaria on 8th May, reached Gombe, 75 miles north-east to Bautchi, on 23rd with two officers and 60 rank and file of Mounted Infantry. On 26th, while moving to the east, he received news of Captain Sword's check and return to Bautchi, but hearing of the ex-Sultan's presence in Burmi he decided to push on to the vicinity of that place so as to be in a position to capture him if he attempted to leave it.

On 31st May he reached Ashaka, on Gongola River, two miles east of Burmi, and occupied that walled village, where he was joined by Lieutenant Lawrence and 40 men from the Gujiba garrison on the next day.

With the force on 1st June he proceeded to reconnoitre the town of Burmi, without attempting to force an entrance. He succeeded in drawing the enemy out into the open and killed a large number of them without loss on his side.

On 4th June he again attempted to draw them out with two sections of Mounted Infantry, posting the rest of his force in ambush one mile from the town, but the enemy refused to be drawn.

From the 4th to 18th June Major Barlow continued to harass the Burmi people by cutting off their cattle and food supplies. On the night of the 18th the enemy made a night attack on his force which consisted of four officers and 100 men holding the walls of the inner town of Ashaka. The enemy burnt the outer town and a few men succeeded in forcing an entrance into the inner town; the attack was finally repulsed about 1.30 A.M. Eighteen dead bodies were found close to the wall in the morning. Major Barlow's force had no casualties. Captain Sword with one officer, a Maxim, and 50 men from Bautchi, and Captain Hamilton-Browne and 30 men with Maxim from Gujiba arrived the next day, bringing up his force to a total of seven officers and 180 men with two Maxims. He continued to harass the enemy by day, but they made another night attack on the evening of 22nd, attempting to rush the south gate and south-west corner of the town. This attack was repulsed with loss. Lieutenant Luttman-Johnson and three men were slightly wounded on this occasion. On the 27th June further reinforcements arrived from Bautchi bringing the force up to 270 rank and file with three Maxims, at the same time my orders to the Officer Commanding Bautchi to await reinforcements with guns before renewing attack on Burmi reached Major Barlow.

11. The news of Captain Sword's repulse at Burmi was received at Zungeru on 6th June. After consultation with your Excellency, arrangements were made for concentrating a force of 500 men with three guns at Bautchi as soon as possible, and the officer commanding Bautchi was ordered to await these reinforcements. I was, of course, at this time ignorant of the action taken by Major Barlow and imagined he would join the Bautchi garrison. Two officers with half company of Infantry and a large supply of ammunition were ordered from Zaria to Bautchi. Major Marsh with eight Europeans, 165 rank and file, and a .75 mm. gun, left Lokoja for Loko by steamer on 13th June, but owing to difficulty with carriers at Keffi, and swollen state of the rivers, he did not reach Bautchi till 12th July. A similar force with two guns was held in readiness at Zungeru to proceed to Zaria under my command, but owing to favourable reports from you on your arrival there only one gun actually left Zungeru.

12. On 30th June Major Barlow proceeded with 30 Mounted Infantry and 80 Infantry and a Maxim to visit various towns in the vicinity of Burmi, at the Resident's request. All were friendly, with the exception of Great and Little Birri; these towns proved hostile; both were carried by assault on 5th July, the casualties being Lieutenants Christy and Zekki Effendi slightly wounded, 2 men severely, and 13 slightly wounded; the enemy lost heavily. Captain Sword remained in command of the remainder of the force at Ashaka and continued to harass the Burmi people, Lieutenant Gallagher and 15 Mounted Infantry inflicting considerable loss on a party of 200 of the enemy, who came out and attacked him while cutting off food supplies. On this occasion Sergeant-Major Dandola was wounded and one horse killed; 20 of the enemy's spearmen were killed within 10 yards of the square, and 30 at longer distances.

13. From Birri, Major Barlow proceeded to Nafada, 20 miles north of Burmi, to await arrival of Major Marsh's forces, the garrison at Ashaka being considered ample for defensive purposes, and food being more abundant at Nefada. Owing to difficulties on the road from Zaria to Bautchi the gun from Zaria had not reached Major Marsh when he left Bautchi. On 23rd July he joined

Major Barlow at Nefada, and on 24th, having arranged for the co-operation of Captain Sword's force from the east, marched for Burmi, making a detour to approach it from the south-west, the probable line of enemy's retreat.

14. On 27th July, at 11.30 A.M., a junction having been effected with Ashaka force, the attack on Burmi began; two gates were breached by artillery fire, and a heavy front and flanking fire brought to bear on the defenders of the walls and trenches.

At 12, a storming party under Major Plummer advanced against the two gates which had been breached, but at 60 yards distance they were met by such a heavy fire from men unexpectedly concealed in the ditch in front that the advance was temporarily checked. Reinforcements were hurried up by Major Marsh, who accompanied them, and it was while directing operations at this time that he was wounded by a poisoned arrow above the knee which proved fatal in 20 minutes. The gates were now rushed by Major Plummer's storming party, the enemy offering a desperate resistance; and it was here that the majority of the casualties occurred. House to house fighting took place and the town was set on fire; another party entered by a westerly gate.

The ex-Sultan of Sokoto and many of his followers were killed near the south wall, a final stand of fanatics was made in the Mallam's house: the gun being brought in did excellent service under Captain Henvey. Major Barlow, who with the Mounted Infantry had been cutting off the retreat of the enemy at the north-west of the town, took over command at 4.45 P.M. The town was burnt and the force camped outside for the night.

The ex-Sultan, the Magaji of Keffi, and the greater number of the irreconcilable Chiefs and over 600 of the enemy were killed.

The force which took part in final attack on Burmi consisted of 18 Officers, 3 British Non-Commissioned Officers, 2 Residents, 2 doctors, 445 rank and file Infantry, with 4 Maxims, 60 rank and file Mounted Infantry, and 15 rank and file Royal Artillery with one 75 mm. gun.

The following were the casualties in the force:—Killed, Major Marsh, 4 rank and file, 6 carriers; dangerously wounded, 4 rank and file (1 since dead); severely wounded, Captain Hamilton-Browne, 26 rank and file, 4 carriers; slightly wounded, Major Plummer, Captain Lewis, 25 rank and file and 3 carriers.

The troops started to return to their several garrisons on 6th August, all opposition having ceased.

15. In summarising the many military reports I have received, I wish to make it clear that the various Officers concerned deserve the whole credit for the complete success of these operations. Remaining as I did at headquarters, except in the despatch of reinforcements and certain orders which were generally too late, I had nothing to do with the operations in the field. At the beginning small bodies of troops pursued and hustled large bodies of the ex-Sultan's followers some 400 miles. The fighting value of his people does not seem to have been great. Captain Sword's check at Burmi was more or less the result of an accidental meeting with a body of fanatics following a new Mahdi at Burmi; but if this had not taken place the movement might have been spread and caused much future trouble, and I think it is lucky that this movement has been checked in time. The ex-Sultan only retired to Burmi after his defeat by Captain Browne.

The operations extended over a period of three months, and a great number of skirmishes took

place where many Officers and men had opportunities of displaying individual initiative. The final action at Burmi brought the operations to a most successful conclusion.

I therefore feel justified in bringing to your notice the names of a somewhat large proportion of the Officers and men concerned, whose names have been submitted to me by the various Officers in command.

The following Officers are deserving of special mention:—

Brevet Major C. W. Barlow, Essex Regiment. This Officer accurately gauged the situation on his arrival, and adopted a bold course which was completely successful. He handled his men well on every occasion, and proved that in the open his small party had nothing to fear. He was the senior Officer till Major Marsh's arrival, and after his death a few days later; his valuable services at a somewhat critical time deserve recognition.

Major Plummer, 5th Battalion Munster Fusiliers, was present at both actions at Burmi, and was wounded on each occasion, in the final attack commanded the storming party, and was in command of attacking column for some hours after Major Marsh's death.

Captain R. Henvey, Royal Artillery, in the final attack at Burmi, at a critical period in the fight, brought his gun under close fire of the enemy to support the infantry attack, in which position it rendered signal service; out of his gun detachment one was killed and six wounded. His name has been specially mentioned by Majors Barlow and Plummer. This Officer has distinguished himself on several occasions in the last two years.

Captain W. Hamilton-Browne, 6th Battalion, Royal Fusiliers, by his surprise of ex-Sultan's camp at Gwoni, headed him off from his movement east. He was severely wounded in final action at Burmi.

Captain W. D. Sword, North Staffordshire Regiment, for his energetic pursuit up to Gongola River.

Captain P. M. Robinson, Royal West Kent Regiment, Staff Officer to Major Marsh, specially mentioned by Major Barlow.

Lieutenant C. C. Maud, Somersetshire Light Infantry, S. H. Christy, 20th Hussars, and C. T. Lawrence, Hampshire Regiment, are mentioned for gallantry, the former on two occasions.

Lieutenant C. E. Gallagher, East Lancashire Regiment, with 15 Mounted Infantry in square, repulsed the attack of some 200 of the enemy and killed 50 of them.

No. R.A./78759 Sergeant W. T. G. Williams, Royal Horse Artillery, was specially mentioned for his services in the final action at Burmi.

No. Leinster/4007 Sergeant E. Hayes, Leinster Regiment.

Had Major Marsh lived I should have brought his services most prominently to your notice, for the able arrangements he made for the advance in and capture of Burmi. The death of this gallant Officer is a great loss to the Northern Nigeria Regiment.

The Wild Birds Protection (City of Lincoln and County of the same City) Order, 1905.

Dated 23rd January, 1905.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the Council of the City of Lincoln, I hereby make the following Order:—

##### *Title.*

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (City of Lincoln and County of the same City) Order, 1905."

##### *BIRDS.*

##### *Close Time varied.*

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be varied within the County of the City of Lincoln, so as to be between the last day of February and the 16th day of August in any year.

##### *Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.*

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County of the City of Lincoln to the following species of Wild Birds, in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—

Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Hobby, Kestrel, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Swallow, Swift, Wryneck.

##### *Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.*

IV. During the period between the 15th day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of the City of Lincoln:—

Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Kingfisher, House Martin, Sand Martin, Nightingale, Owl (all species), Oyster Catcher, Ruff or Reeve, Swallow, Tern, Wagtail (all species), Woodpecker (all species).

##### *Eggs.*

##### *Certain Eggs protected throughout the County of the City of Lincoln.*

V. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of the City of Lincoln:—

Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Cuckoo, Wild Duck (all species), Goldfinch, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar, Owl (all species), Ruff or Reeve, Snipe, Swallow, Swift, Teal, Wagtail (all species), Woodcock, Woodpecker (all species), Wryneck.

Whereas by General Orders of the Poor Law Board dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1867, and the 16th day of February, 1869, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Bedford Union (amongst others), it is required

that certain Accounts relating to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, when made up and balanced, shall be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some Member thereof, who shall enter a memorandum at the foot of such Accounts, certifying to the same having been submitted, and to the correctness, or otherwise, of such Accounts as regards the stock remaining in store ;

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Bedford Union, as and when they shall think fit to do so, may appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as hereinafter set forth, and may revoke such appointment. When any such appointment is made it shall be notified to Us forthwith.

ARTICLE II.—Every such appointment shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Regulations in force for the time being as to the appointment of Officers by the said Guardians, and a person appointed to the office of Stocktaker shall receive such remuneration as may from time to time be assigned to him by the said Guardians.
