

and a half or thereabouts, to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading to the house called Rowley Bank, and extending thence first eastward to the middle of the said footpath, and then first eastward then north-eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of fifty-nine chains or thereabouts, to the point where it crosses the boundary which divides the said parish of Elstree from the said parish of Shenley, and extending thence north-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence which divides the close numbered 603 upon the ordnance map of the said parish of Shenley, published in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, upon a scale of twenty-five inches to a mile, and upon the said map or plan which is annexed to this scheme, from the close numbered 615 upon the said maps, and extending thence north-eastward along the fence which divides the said close numbered 603 and the close numbered 604 upon the said maps, from the said close numbered 615 and the close numbered 614 upon the said maps, for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts, to the fence forming the south-western boundary of the unenclosed land numbered 613 upon the said maps and known as Rowley Green and Rowley-lane, and extending thence north-eastward and in a straight line across Rowley Green and Rowley-lane for a distance of three chains or thereabouts, to the south-western end of the fence which divides the close numbered 605 from the close numbered 606 upon the said maps, and extending thence north-eastward along the fences which divide the said close numbered 605 and the closes numbered 580, 583, 584 and 585 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 606 and the closes numbered 608, 609, 613, 581 and 582 upon the said maps for a distance of thirty chains and a half or thereabouts, to the boundary which divides the said parish of Shenley from the said parish of Ridge, and extending thence southward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts, to the fence which divides the close numbered 404 upon the ordnance map of the said parish of Ridge, published in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight upon the scale of twenty-five inches to a mile, and upon the said map or plan which is annexed to this scheme from the close numbered 444 upon the said maps, and extending thence north-eastward along the fences which divide the said close numbered 404 from the said close numbered 444 and the closes numbered 438, 405 and 406 upon the said maps, for a distance of thirty chains or thereabouts, to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 404 from the said close numbered 406 meets the south-western side of Arkley-lane, and extending thence first north-eastward to and then south-eastward along the middle of Arkley-lane for a distance of two chains and a half or thereabouts, to a point opposite the fence which divides the close numbered 431 upon the said maps from the close numbered 407 upon the said maps, and extending thence first south-eastward and then north-eastward along the fences which divide the said close numbered 431 and the close numbered 430 upon the said maps, from the said close numbered 407 and the closes numbered 434, 435 and 432 upon the said maps for a distance of twenty-five chains and a half or thereabouts, to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 430 from the said close numbered 432 meets the south-western side of Galley-lane, and extending thence first north-westward to the middle of Galley-lane upon the boundary which divides the said parish of

Ridge from the said parish of South Mimms, and then south-eastward along the middle of Galley-lane (thereby following the last-mentioned boundary), for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts, to the point where such boundary meets the boundary of the said parish of Chipping Barnet, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint Albans and of the said diocese of London respectively.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fifth and thirty-sixth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fourteen; duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fifteenth day of December, in the year one thousand nine hundred and four, in the words and figures following; that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of the Act of the thirty-fifth and thirty-sixth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fourteen, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of the Holy Spirit, Rye Harbour, situate within the parish of Icklesham, in the county of Sussex and in the diocese of Chichester.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Icklesham, of the parish of Saint Thomas the Apostle, Winchelsea, in the said county and diocese, and of the parish of Lydd with Broomhill, chiefly in the county of Kent but partly in the said county of Sussex and wholly in the diocese of Canterbury, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of
