The KING was pleased, after the Council holden yesterday at Buckingham Palace, to present to Mr. Albert Victor Hardwick, of Muswell Hill, the Albert Medal of the First Class, conferred upon him by His Majesty's command for conspicuous gallantry in saving life as detailed below:-

On the evening of the 21st December, 1904, No. 4 Platform at Finsbury Park Station was crowded with people (estimated at over a thousand) awaiting down trains. A dense fog prevailed at the time.

An elderly lady fell from the platform just as an incoming train loomed out of the fog at a distance of a few yards. If her rescue was to be effected nothing but great promptitude, re-sourcefulness, and bravery could avail, seeing that but a few seconds remained for action, and the lady had injured her ankle and could not save herself.

Mr. Hardwick leapt on the line, and just succeeded in placing the lady and himself at full length on the ground between the rail and the wall supporting the platform when the train overtook them.

The engine and four coaches had passed th spot where they were lying before the train was brought to a standstill. The Railway Officials, having satisfied themselves that both the lady and Mr. Hardwick had escaped injury, directed the train to be moved forward slowly, and rescued and rescuer, to the great relief of the onlookers, were assisted to the platform in safety.

And Our further Will and Pleasure is that the wife of every Senator of the College of Justice shall be entitled to assume and use the title "Lady" and to continue to use the same during the life of her husband, and after his death so long as she remains a widow.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and forty-two duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twelfth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and five, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and forty-two, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for providing such a rent-charge as is contemplated by the eleventh section of that Act.

"Whereas by an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the seventeenth day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three and published in the London Gazette upon the following day, and ratifying a scheme prepared and submitted by us, the benefice of Saint Mary Aldermary with Saint Thomas Apostle, in the city of London, and the benefice of Saint Antholin with Saint John the Baptist upon Walbrook, in the same city, were united into one benefice as in the same Order is mentioned, and the union of the said two benefices has taken effect, and consequently all the property constituting the endowments of the said two benefices has by virtue of the same Order been transferred and annexed to the united benefice which was created by the same Order by the name and style of 'The United Rectory of Saint Mary Aldermary with Saint Thomas Apostle, Saint Antholin, and Saint John the Baptist upon Walbrook.'

"And whereas it was provided by the said Order that the permanent endowments of the said united benefice should, after the said union, be made subject to the payment of any annual rentcharge in perpetuity, not exceeding the annual sum of three hundred pounds, in favour of the

benefice of Saint John, Waterloo-road, Lambeth. then in the diocese of Winchester but now in the diocese of Rochester, which said annual rentcharge should be charged upon some part or parts (to be duly specified) of the said permanent endowments by virtue of any duly gazetted Order in Council ratifying a scheme to be pre-pared under the said eleventh section of the said Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and forty-two, in which scheme may be contained any lawful powers and remedies for the recovery of the same annual rent-charge, provided that such rent-charge should not commence nor come into operation until the benefices which have been united as aforesaid should be held by an Incumbent who had not held the incumbency of either of the said benefices previously to the taking effect of the said union.

"And whereas the Reverend Bernard Reynolds, a Prebendary of the cathedral church of Saint Paul in London, is now the Incumbent of the said united benefice, having been instituted to such united benefice on the sixteenth day of December, in the year one thousand nine hundred and three.

"And whereas the said Bernard Reynolds did not hold the incumbency of either of the said benefices which have been united as aforesaid previously to the taking effect of the said union.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the cathedral church of Saint Paul in London, acting as the patrons of the said united benefice (in testimony of which consent thay have affixed their Common or Capitular Seal to this scheme), and with the consent of the vestry of each of the four parishes of Saint Mary Aldermary, Saint Thomas Apostle, Saint Autholin, and Saint John the Baptist upon Walbrook (in testimony of which consent this scheme is signed in the case of each vestry by the chairman of a meeting of the same vestry, duly convened for the purpose of giving such consent), and with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, acting as the Bishop of the diocese in which the said benefices which have been united as aforesaid are situate (in testimony of which consent he has affixed his signature and his episcopal seal to this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that asfrom the said sixteenth day of December, in the year one thousand nine hundred and three, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, such of the permanent endowments of the said united benefice as are described and set forth in the schedule to this scheme shall be subject in perpetuity to one annual rent-charge of two hundred pounds, the same rent-charge to be payable and paid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year to the Incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Saint John Waterloo-road, Lambeth, or the representative or representatives of any deceased Incumbent thereof on the one hand, and to his successors in the same incumbency on the other hand.

"And we further recommend and propose that the Incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Saint John, Waterloo-road, Lambeth, shall have the following powers for recovering the said rent-charge; that is to say, power if and whenever any part of the said rent-charge shall at any time be unpaid for twenty-one days after any of the times appointed for the payment

thereof (although there shall not have been made any legal demand thereof), to enter into the receipt of the endowments charged therewith or any part thereof, and to receive and take the same until he shall thereby or otherwise be paid and satisfied the same rent-charge and the arreacs thereof due during his being in possession of the same premises, together with all costs and expenses occasioned by the non-payment thereof, and for the purpose of collecting, receiving, and recovering such endowments or any of them, to use, exercise, and enjoy all such powers and remedies for collecting, recovering and enforcing payment thereof, and of the annual sums payable for or towards raising or making up the same as under and by virtue of the Act of the forty-fourth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter eighty-nine, which is mentioned in the schedule to this scheme, are vested in the Incumbent of the said united benefice.

- "And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and forty-two, or of any other Act of Parliament.
  - "The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing scheme has reference, showing the particulars of the endowments which by such scheme are proposed to be charged with the annual rent-charge of two hundred pounds mentioned in the same scheme:—
- "(1.) The annual sum of two hundred and fifty pounds, payable under the Act of the forty-fourth year of His late Majesty, King George the Third, chapter eighty-nine, for the relief of certain Incumbents of livings in the City of London as the annual certain tithes or sums of money in lieu of tithes, of and for the parishes of Saint Mary Aldermary and Saint Thomas Apostle, or so much thereof as shall from time to time remain payable in respect thereof in case of and after the redemption under the London (City) Tithes Act, 1879, of any tithe rate, rate assessment, or payment payable for raising such annual sum.
- "(2.) The annual sum of two hundred pounds payable under the said Act of the forty-fourth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter eighty-nine, as the annual certain tithes, or sums of money in lieu of tithes, of and for the parishes of Saint Antholin and Saint John the Baptist upon Walbrook, or so much thereof as shall from time to time remain payable in respect thereof in case of and after the redemption under the London (City) Tithes Act, 1879, of any tithe rate, rate assessment, or payment payable for raising such annual sum.
- "(3.) The annual income arising on or to arise from the consideration or considerations or the investments of the consideration or considerations of any such redemption or redemptions as are hereinbefore mentioned.
- "The foregoing scheme is consented to by the Vestry of the parish of Saint Mary Aldermary, in the city of London, under a resolution passed at the vestry meeting, duly convened for that purpose, and held on the thirteenth day of October, in the year one thousand nine hundred and four.

- "The foregoing scheme is consented to by the Vestry of the parish of Saint Thomas Apostle, in the city of London, under a resolution passed

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fiftyninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Mark, Mitcham, situate in the parish of Mitcham, in the county of Surrey, and in the diocese of Rochester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Mark, Mitcham,

situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Mitcham, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Mark, Mitcham, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Mark, Mitcham.' And with the like consent of the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Mark, Mitcham, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being. Provided always that so long as the Reverend Daniel Frederic Wilson, Clerk in Holy Orders, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish of Mitcham shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization or performance at the said church of Saint Mark, Mitcham, situate as aforesaid, shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said Daniel Frederic Wilson; and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the

registration thereof.

"We therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem

"All that part of the parish of Mitcham, in the county of Surrey, and in the diocese of Rochester, which is bounded upon the east by the new parish of Christ Church, Broad Green, Croydon, in the said county of Surrey, and in the diocese of Canterbury, upon the north partly by the new parish of Saint Andrew, Lower Streatham, partly by the new parish of Emmanuel, Streatham, and partly by the new parish of Christ Church, Mitcham, all in the said county of Surrey, and in the diocese of Rochester, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the southwest, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Christ Church, Mitcham, from the said parish of Mitcham, at a point in the middle of Westernroad where such road is joined by the occupation road which leads from the London-road past the site of the Manor House and past the Holborn Union Gasworks, and extending thence southeastward along the middle of Western-road for a
