Notice is hereby given that His Majesty The King will hold Levées at St. James's Palace on Thursday, 9th March, and on Thursday, 16th March next, at 12 o'clock noon, and that for these and all future Levées Cards of Admission will be required, as the numbers at each of these Ceremonies must be limited.

The following are the rules to be observed :—

ATTENDANCES AND PRESENTATIONS.

All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, of whatever rank, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty. All Civil Officers of the Admiralty will follow the same rule.

Deputy Lieutenants of Counties and all Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Army, Militia, Yeomanry, or Volunteers, of whatever rank, except those on the Indian and Colonial Establishments, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the Inspector-General at the Horse Guards, Whitehall; but Officers of the Household Cavalry or the Brigade of Guards should communicate with the Lord Chamberlain at St. James's Palace.

All Officers of the Indian Civil Service and of the Indian Army, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.

All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the Colonies possessing responsible Government, who will apply to the Private Secretary to the Inspector-General at the Horse Guards, Whitehall, for their cards for attendance or for presentation by the Inspector-General. The application must in all cases be supported by a credential from the Governor or Officer commanding the local Forces of the Colony.

Similarly, all Gentlemen connected with the Foreign Office, the Home Office, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament or any Government Department, will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation at Levées from the Department under which they serve.

Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel, and all Legal Officials holding appointments under the Crown, are requested to make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Lord Chancellor.

Peers, Bishops, Members of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all Gentlemen other than the above mentioned, will be good enough to communicate with the Lord Chamberlain at St. James's Palace, when they will each be furnished with a card of admission for use at the Levée.

The names, both for attendance and presentation, must be received at the various Offices above indicated not later than eight days prior to the date of each Levée.

HIS MAJESTY The King has been graciously pleased to confer the Decoration of the Albert Medal of the Second Class on—

ALFRED STICKLEY, Chief Stoker, R.N.

The following is the account of the services in respect of which the decoration has been conferred:—

On the morning of the 11th June, 1904, at about 11.30, His Majesty's Torpedo Boat Destroyer "Success" was steaming towards Lamash, when it became apparent from deck, owing to the issue of steam from the funnel, that something was wrong in the after stokehold. Alfred Stickley, Chief Stoker, in accordance with the orders of the Engineer Officer, went below to ascertain the cause.

On reaching the stokehold he found that there was an escape of steam from the top drum of No. 4 Boiler, which shortly caused one of the furnace doors which had been left unlatched to be blown open. The stokehold was immediately filled with flame and steam, and the men present were burnt and scalded.

Stickley grasped the situation with promptness, showing the greatest presence of mind in the emergency, and ran great risks in endeavouring to minimise the consequences of the accident and prevent further injuries to the men.

In spite of the conditions in the stokehold, and his own severe exposure to the flames, he managed to open out the fans to their full extent, and made many gallant attempts to close the furnace door and open the draught valve. Finding it was impossible to drive the flames back, he gave orders for the hatch to be opened, and himself remained below until the four men in the stokehold effected their escape. His face and neck were severely burned, and his hands and forearms very badly scalded. For over four months he has been on the sick list suffering from his injuries. His lungs escaped injury, as he had the presence of mind to put cotton waste into his mouth while he was in the stokehold.

The following notification in the Gazette of India, No. 43 of the 20th January, 1905, publishing an extract from a report by Major-General P. J. Maitland, C.B., regarding the operations in connection with the protection of the Aden Boundary Commission, has been received from the Government of India:—

No. 43, dated 20th January, 1905. The Right Honourable the Governor-General in Council is pleased to direct the publication of the following extract from a report from the General Officer Commanding Aden District, No. 3260, dated 22nd June, 1904, bringing to notice the services rendered by the Officers attached to the force employed in the protection of the Aden Boundary Commission:—

64. I venture to bring to the notice of the Lieutenant-General Commanding the names of the following Officers:—

Brevet Lieutenant-Colonel F. P. English, 2nd Battalion Royal Dublin Fusiliers, who commanded the force which successfully attacked and destroyed the village of Nakhlen.

Colonel R. I. Scallan, C.I.E., D.S.O., commanding 123rd Rifles. He was in command of the

Aden Column from March to August, 1903, and again from November, 1903, to January, 1904. He commanded the force that marched from Dthala and relieved the Sulek Post on the 29th October.

Major J. R. B. Davidson, Royal Garrison Artillery, was of great service to me as Road Commandant, and deserves credit for rapidly refitting the camel battery with the 7.5 gun.

Major A. F. Pullen, Royal Garrison Artillery, who succeeded Major Davidson as Road Commandant when the latter took command of the Royal Garrison Artillery in Aden, and who acted as my staff officer during the Kotaibi Expedition.

Major G. C. Dowell, Royal Garrison Artillery, commanded No. 6 Mountain Battery throughout. His battery was in excellent order, and rendered most efficient service during the Kotaibi Expedition.

Major E. E. Ravenhill, 1st Battalion, East Kent Regiment (The Buffs). He commanded the Subaihi Column to my entire satisfaction.

Major W. S. Delamain, 123rd Rifles, commanded the escort of the Boundary Commission for about eight months, during which time the Commission marched from Kotaba to the coast, a distance of at least 160 miles. He has been highly spoken of by Colonel Wahab in his letter to the Government of India dated 10th June, 1904.

Captain E. A. F. Redl, 113th Infantry, was Intelligence Officer with the Boundary Commission, and his services in that capacity have been brought to notice by Colonel Wahab. He was placed at my disposal for the Kotaibi Expedition, and did excellent work in charge of the supply and transport arrangements.

Captain A. P. Shewell, 123rd Rifles, who was in command of the post at Awabil when it was attacked by the Yaffais on the 13th September, 1903. He afterwards did good work with his regiment in the Kotaibi Expedition.

Captain F. L. Lloyd-Jones, 113th Infantry, attached 102nd Grenadiers, who was in command of Sulek Post when it was attacked by the Kotaibis from 25th to 29th October, 1903, and who was severely wounded in the action of the 29th October.

Lieutenant J. Macpherson, Indian Medical Service, was Medical Officer with the advanced force during the expedition against the Kotaibis. He is a hardworking and skilful medical officer, and his arrangements for the care of the wounded and sick were very good.

Lieutenant G. S. Symes, 1st Battalion Hampshire Regiment, displayed great coolness and gallantry on the 7th November when a body of Kotaibis suddenly opened fire on the Hampshire detachment at short range, causing a momentary confusion. Lieutenant Symes carried Private Treadwell back some 30 yards under a hot fire at close quarters when the latter was wounded and unable to move, Lieutenant Symes being at the time practically alone.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of East Sussex) Order, 1905.

Dated 15th February, 1905.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of East Sussex, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I: This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of East Sussex) Order, 1905.

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of September in any year, except with respect to the following birds:—

Curlew, Godwit, Wild Goose, Lapwing, Mallard, Plover, Redshank and other Sand Pipers, Snipe, Wild Swan, Teal and other Wild Duck, Whimbrel, Widgeon, Woodcock.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of East Sussex to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—

Black-headed Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Bustard, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Peregrine Falcon, Flycatcher (both species), Hobby, Kestrel, Landrail, Martin (both species), Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Kentish Plover, Raven, Redstart, Red-backed Shrike, Tree Sparrow, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit, Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Crested Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Wagtail (all species), Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, White-throat, Lesser Whitethroat, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck.

IV. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the undermentioned area in the Administrative County of East Sussex to the Linnet (Brown and Green) in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act.

The area referred to is bounded on the north by a line beginning on the sea coast at the boundary between the County Borough of Hastings and the Borough of Bexhill, proceeding along such boundary to its junction with the main road from Hastings to Bexhill, thence along the northern side of such main road, through Bexhill, Nimfield, Horsebridge, and Laughton, to the boundary of the Borough of Lewes, thence along the northern boundary of that Borough to its junction with the main road leading from Lewes to Offham, thence along the northern side of such main road through Ditchelting and Hurstperpoint to the County boundary between Hurstperpoint and Albourne, and is outlined in blue on a map deposited with the Clerk of the County Council, sealed with the Home Office seal, and dated the 15th February, 1905.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of March

following, the killing or taking of any of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of East Sussex:—

Avocet, Chough, Crossbill, Stone Curlew (Great Plover, Thick-knee), Common Bittern, Little Bittern, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Pied Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Common Kite, Nightjar (Goat Sucker), Oriole, Osprey, White Owl, Raven, Redpole, Siskin, Tree Sparrow, Spoonbill, Bearded Tit, Dartford Warbler, Wheatear, Woodlark, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

All Birds protected on Sundays except within a certain Area.

VI. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act of 1880, as extended, so far as certain birds are concerned, by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited within the Administrative County of East Sussex, except in so much of the Poor Law Union of Cuckfield as is comprised in the parishes of Bolney and Twineham, which area is outlined in red on the map referred to in Clause IV of this Order.

EGGS.

All Eggs protected in certain Areas.

VII. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of any species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the undermentioned areas for a period of five years from the date of this Order:—

(a.) An area bounded on the west by a line drawn due south from the eastern extremity of the sea wall at Seaford, on the east by a line drawn due south from the eastern extremity of the Coastguard Station at Meads, in the borough of Eastbourne, on the north by the front edge of the sea cliffs extending between those limits, and on the south by the sea.

(b.) An area bounded on the west by a line drawn due south from the western boundary of the parish of Rottingdean, on the east by a line drawn due south from the eastern extremity of the sea cliffs in the Urban District of Newhaven, on the north by the front edge of the sea cliffs extending between those limits, and on the south by the sea.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VIII. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of East Sussex:—

Avocet, Common Bittern, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Crossbill, Stone Curlew (Great Plover, Thick-knee), Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Common Kite, Nightingale, Nightjar, Oriole, Owl (all species), Kentish Plover, Red-backed Shrike, Spoonbill, Bearded Tit, Dartford Warbler, Wheatear, Woodlark, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck.

Repeal of former Order.

IX. The Order of the 17th day of April, 1900, is hereby repealed.

For the purposes of the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 to 1890, and all Provisional Orders and Licences made and issued thereunder, the Board of Trade approve of the pattern and construction of the meter (hereinafter described) for the measurement of electrical quantity when supplied on the constant potential continuous current system, viz. :—

The meter No. 12,796 deposited at the Board of Trade by the Bastian Meter Company, of Bartholomew Works, Lawford-road, Kentish Town, London, N.W., and sealed by the Board of Trade, and known as the Bastian Meter N Type, 1903 pattern.

Provided that the meter be tested, fixed, and used as described in the specification and instructions deposited at the Board of Trade and dated and numbered 27th January, 1905, and H. 1363.

The Board of Trade further approve of the means provided for fixing meters of this description, and for connecting them with the service lines as described in the specification and instructions above referred to.

The electrolyte with which the tube of the meter is to be filled must be a solution in water of caustic soda, the specific gravity of the mixture being 1.06.

The following Order has been made by the Board of Trade in pursuance of the provisions of section 15 of the Pinner Gas Order, 1901 :—

PINNER GAS ORDER, 1901.

Whereas by section 15 of the above-mentioned Order, which was duly confirmed by the Gas Orders Confirmation (No. 1) Act, 1901, it was enacted as follows :—

15. As from the first quarter day after the commencement of this Order section 14 of the Order of 1881 is hereby repealed and the price to be charged by the Undertakers for gas supplied by them shall not exceed five shillings and two pence per thousand cubic feet and so in proportion for any less quantity supplied. Provided that at any time after the expiration of three years from the commencement of this Order the Board of Trade may, if they think fit, by order in writing, signed by a Secretary or Assistant Secretary of the said Board, alter the maximum price, either by substituting any other sum for the said sum of five shillings and two pence or by prescribing a standard price with sliding scale as to profits, and as from the date specified in such Order (hereinafter referred to as "the specified date") the price to be charged by the Undertakers for gas supplied by them shall be in accordance with such Order. Provided further that in case such Order shall prescribe a standard price with sliding scale as to profits, then as from the specified date the provisions set forth in Schedule B to this Order annexed shall be in force and have effect, and this Order shall be read and construed accordingly. A copy of such

Order made by the Board of Trade shall be published in the London Gazette, and a copy of the said Gazette containing such Order shall be conclusive evidence of the due making and validity of the same and of the contents thereof.

And whereas, in pursuance of the provisions of the above recited section, application has been made to the Board of Trade to alter the maximum price to be charged by the Undertakers for gas supplied under the provisions of the said Order, and to fix a standard price and sliding scale of profits in accordance with the provisions set forth in Schedule "B" to the said Order.

And whereas the Board of Trade required notice of such application to be advertised and copies to be served upon each of the local authorities in whose districts the authorized limits of supply are situated.

And whereas no objections have been received against such application.

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the above recited section do hereby fix the standard price to be charged by the Undertakers for gas supplied by them at four shillings and seven pence per one thousand cubic feet, and so in proportion for any less quantity supplied with sliding scale as to profits in accordance with the provisions set forth in Schedule "B" to the said Order, and as from the 1st day of April, 1905, the price to be charged by the Undertakers for gas supplied shall be in accordance with the terms of this Order.

General-Inspector of External Sanitation.

According to official reports communicated to this capital, there exist cases of yellow fever since July last in the ports of Panama and Colon.

With regard to the progress of the epidemic of bubonic plague in the Consular District of Aden, the statistics officially communicated report an increase in the number of persons attacked, and in the number of deaths.

The above is published for the information of the sanitary authorities and shippers whose boats may touch at Spanish ports.
