#### PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the uinth day of February, in the year one thousand nine hundred and five, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

the year one thousand line hundred and live, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and twenty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting an exchange of the alternate patronage of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint Mary Magdalene, Barnstaple, situate in the county of Devon, and in the diocese of Exeter, for the alternate patronage of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Sempringham with the chapelries of Pointon and Birthorpe annexed, situate in the county of Lincoln, and in the diocese of Lincoln.

"Whereas the patronage of the said benefice of Saint Mary Magdalene, Barnstaple, is under the twenty-first section of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, exercised by Your Majesty and by the Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter alternately.

"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Sempringham with Pointon and

Birthorpe, is vested as to one moiety thereof in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors in right of the Crown, and is exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury for the time being, and as to the other moiety in the Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter for the time being.

"And whereas the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, now First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Reverend Archibald, now Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter, have respectively signified to us their desire that the patronage of the said two benefices of Saint Mary Magdalene, Barnstaple, and Sempringham with Pointon and Birthorpe, may be re-arranged by way of exchange, in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas we have made due enquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two benefices and of the patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two benefices and vicarages are as set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Arthur James Balfour, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as such alternate patron of the said benefice of Saint Mary Magdalene, Barnstaple (in testimony of which consent he the said Arthur James Balfour has signed and sealed this scheme), and with the consent of the said Archibald Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter, acting as such owner of one moiety of the said advowson of the benefice of Sempringham with Pointon and Birthorpe (in testimony of which consent he the said Bishop has signed this scheme and affixed his episcopal seal to the same) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and frem the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the

law other than such duly gazetted Order, all that share of the patronage of the said benefice of Saint Mary Magdalene, Barnstaple, and the church thereof which is now exercised by Your Majesty, that is to say, every alternate turn of nomination and presentation thereto shall be assigned and transferred from Your Majesty, your Heirs and Successors and shall become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Archibald Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter and his successors, Bishops of the same diocese for ever to the intent that the whole patronage of the said benefice of Saint Mary Magdalene, Barnstaple, shall thenceforth belong to the said Archibald Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter and his successors for ever, and that in exchange for the same all that moiety or one half part of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Sempringham with Pointon and Birthorpe, and the churches thereof which is now vested in

the said Archibald Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter, shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said Archibald Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter, and from his successors Bishops of the same diocese, and shall become and be absolutely vested in Your Majesty Your Heirs and Successors in right of the Crown for ever, and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Arthur James Balfour, First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, and by his successors to the intent that the whole advowson of the said benefice of Sempringham with Pointon and Birthorpe shall thenceforth belong to Your Majesty Your Heirs and Successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any

other Act of Parliament.

this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the said dioceses of Exeter and Lincoln.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Leicester) Order, 1905.

Dated 28th February, 1905.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Leicester, I hereby make the following Order :-

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Leicester) Order, 1905.

#### BIRDS.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County of Leicester to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:-

Tree Creeper, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Hedge Sparrow, House Martin, Sand Martin, Swallow, Swift, Wagtails.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

III. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year, and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the Goldfinch and Kingfisher is prohibited throughout the County of Leicester.

#### Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

IV. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Leicester for a period of five years from the date of this Order:—

Buntings, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chiffichaff, Tree Creeper, Wild Ducks (all species), Flycatchers, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Little Grebe (Dabchick), Hawks, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Martins, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goatsucker, Night Hawk, or Fern Owl), Nuthatch,

Hadji Méhemmed Youssouf Ismaïl, Sahib Effendi as Consul of Turkey at Rangoon;

Mr. Howard D. Van Sant as Consul of the United Birds), Swallow, Swift, Cole Tit, Long-Birds), Swallow, Swift, Cole Tit, Long-tailed Tit (Bottle Tit, Jack-o'-Bo-peep), Marsh Tit, Wagtails, Blackcap Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Woodpeckers, Common Wren, Firecrested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Willow Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

> V. The Order of the 25th January, 1900, is hereby repealed.

### REMOVAL OF MATERIALS PROHIBITED.

# SHORES OR BANKS OF THE SEA AT WICKLOW.

REMOVAL OF MATERIALS PROHIBITED.

Whereas the Board of Trade, acting in pursuance of the Harbours Act, 1814, as amended by the Harbours Transfer Act, 1862, find it necessary for the protection of the Port of Dublin to prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of the sea between the western side of the Steam Packet Pier or Inner Pier at Wicklow, and the northern boundary of the Wicklow Urban District (which boundary is also the southern boundary of Bollarney Murragh), being within the said port: Now the Board of Trade do hereby, by this

Order, prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of the sea between the points above mentioned.
