

the Malvern Wells and Wyche roads at Cherbourg House.

Work No. 7.—A small catchwater reservoir pumping station, machinery and other works at the Owls Hole, situate on land No. 77 on the $\frac{1}{25000}$ Ordnance Map, 1893, in the parish of Little Malvern, in the county of Worcester.

Work No. 8.—An aqueduct conduit or line of pipes wholly in the parish of Little Malvern, in the county of Worcester commencing at Work No. 7 of this Notice, and terminating at or in the northern side of the British Camp reservoir.

Work No. 9.—An aqueduct conduit or line of pipes wholly in the parish of West Malvern, in the county of Worcester, commencing at a point in the West Malvern-road, opposite the Dingle spring and terminating in the same road $\frac{1}{2}$ chain north of the north end of Geneva-terrace.

Work No. 10.—A well, tank and aqueduct conduit or line of pipes wholly in the parish of West Malvern, in the county of Worcester, commencing at the Danzell Spring, which is situated at the northern extremity of the plot numbered 553 on the $\frac{1}{25000}$ Ordnance Map, 1st Edition, 1884-5, and terminating in the West Malvern-road by a junction with Work No. 9 above described, at a point $5\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts from the termination of the said Work No. 9.

To sanction and confirm the application of moneys borrowed under the Malvern Link (Extension and Water) Act, 1896, to the purposes of and in connection with the construction of the filter bed in the parish of Little Malvern, adjoining the filter beds authorized and constructed under the Malvern Water Act, 1891.

To empower the Council to make and maintain the waterworks and other works hereinafter described, or some of them, or if and so far as any of them may have been constructed prior to the passing of the Bill, to sanction and confirm such construction, together with all proper embankments, dams, sluices, weirs, outlets, overflows, washouts, bridges, roads, approaches, wells, pumps, engines, tanks, basins, gauges, filter beds, water-softening tanks and apparatus, discharge pipes, adits, shafts, tunnels, aqueducts, culverts, cuts, channels, conduits, drains, mains, pipes, junctures, valves, telegraphs, telephones, and other means of electric communication, engines, apparatus, rails, sidings, houses, buildings, conveniences, connected with or ancillary to the intended works or any of them, or necessary for inspecting, maintaining, repairing, cleansing, managing, working, or using the same; that is to say:—

Work No. 11.—A borehole or boreholes and pumping station with shafts, borings, buildings, machinery, and other works, wholly situate in the parish of Leigh, in the county of Worcester, in the said piece of land numbered 731 on the $\frac{1}{25000}$ Ordnance Map of that parish, 2nd Edition, 1904, at or near a point about 100 yards south-west of the existing borehole described as Work No. 4 in this Notice.

Work No. 12.—An aqueduct, conduit or line of pipes wholly situate in the parish of Leigh, in the county of Worcester, commencing at Work No. 11 above described, and terminating at Work No. 4 of this Notice.

Work No. 13.—A well or wells and pumping station with shafts, borings, buildings, machinery tunnels, headings, driftways, or adits and other works in connection therewith, wholly situate in the parish of Bromsberrow, in the county of Gloucester, in a piece of land numbered 268 on the $\frac{1}{25000}$

Ordnance Map, 2nd Edition, 1902, of that parish, at or near a point 100 yards north-west from the south-east corner of the aforesaid field.

Work No. 14.—An aqueduct, conduit or line of pipes, partly in the parish of Bromsberrow, in the county of Gloucester, partly in the parish of Redmarley D'Abitot, partly in the parish of Berrow, partly in the parish of Castle Morton, and partly in the parish of Little Malvern, in the county of Worcester, commencing at the well referred to in the parish of Bromsberrow, in the county of Gloucester, known as Work No. 13 of this Notice, and terminating at the north-east corner of the British Camp reservoir, in the parish of Little Malvern, in the county of Worcester.

The Bill will, or may, authorize the Council to take or affect for, or in connection with, the proposed works certain lands, being or reputed to be common or commonable lands, of which the following are particulars and the estimated quantities proposed to be taken:—

To empower the Council to deviate in the construction of the intended works, laterally and vertically, to the extent to be shown on the plans to be deposited as hereinafter mentioned, or to be defined or indicated in the Bill.

To empower the Council to purchase and take, by compulsion or agreement, the following lands, all in the county of Gloucester:—

Certain lands situate in the parish of Bromsberrow, Nos. 267, 268, 269, 270, 271, 272, 273, 274, 285, and portions of 275, and 284 on the $\frac{1}{25000}$ Ordnance Map of the parish of Bromsberrow, 2nd Edition, 1904.

Certain lands situate in the parish of Dymock, Nos. 961, 981, and portions of 983 on the $\frac{1}{25000}$ Ordnance Map, 2nd Edition, 1904, of the parish of Dymock.

To empower the Council temporarily to discharge water from the intended wells and works, and also from the existing or authorized wells and works of the Council, into any available stream or watercourse, and in other respects to make provision for the discharge of water.

To empower the Council to take or divert into the said existing or intended wells, pumping stations, tunnels, reservoirs, aqueducts, and other works, and to take, use, and appropriate for the purposes of their undertaking all such springs and waters as can be collected by the existing or proposed works, or any of them or as may be found in or under any of the lands acquired or to be acquired under the powers of the Bill.

To authorize the Council within the parishes and counties aforesaid, and for the purposes of the Bill, to lay down, maintain, alter, and renew mains, pipes, culverts, and other waterworks in, through, along, under, across, and over, public
