Whereas it has been humbly represented unto Us that a Scale of Precedence in Scotland has not been defined with due authority, and that doubts and a diversity of practice have arisen in consequence which it is desirable should be determined by the exercise of Our Royal Prerogative.

And whereas We have deemed it expedient for these and other considerations Us thereunto moving that the place and precedence in Scotland of Peers, Officers of State, Lords of Session, Sheriffs, and other persons having hereditary, official or personal rank should be regulated by Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual.

Therefore know ye that We of Our Princely Grace and mere Motion have ordained and declared, and do by these Presents ordain and declare that all such Peers, Officers, Lords of Session, Sheriffs, and other persons entitled as aforesaid and all ladies entitled as aforesaid, or in their own right, shall have on all occasions place, pre-eminence and precedence in Scotland in their degrees according to their respective positions in the Tables hereunto annexed intituled "The Scale of General Precedence in Scotland" and "The Scale of Precedence for Ladies in Scotland."

Our Will and Pleasure, therefore, is that Lyon King of Arms, to whom the cognizance of matters of this nature in Scotland doth properly belong, do see this Order observed and kept, and do cause the same to be recorded in the Lyon Office in Edinburgh to the end that Our Officers of Arms there, and all others upon

occasion may take full notice, and have knowledge thereof, and for so doing this shall be his Warrant.

#### LICENSING ACT, 1904.

(4 Edw. 7, c. 23.)

#### Rules made by the Treasury.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of section 3 (2) of the Licensing Act, 1904, in these Rules called "the Act," make the following Rules:—

1. An Account shall be opened in the Books of the Bank of England to be entitled "The Compensation Fund (Licensing Act, 1904) Account," and to be operated upon by the Commissioners of Inland Revenue, hereinafter called the Commissioners.

2. The Commissioners shall transfer to the said Account, from time to time, all sums received by them in respect of charges levied and paid under section 3 of the Act.

3. Any payment to be made by the Commissioners to any authority under section 3 (2) of the Act on account of the amount produced in any area, or, where an area is divided into districts under section 5 (1) of the Act, in any such district, by charges levied and paid under section 3 of the Act, shall be made by an order drawn on the said Account, and the order shall be transmitted by the Commissioners to the Treasurer of the compensation fund for the area or district.

4. In the month of November in each year the Commissioners shall, where charges have been imposed in any area or district, make a payment

under section 3 (2) of the Act to the proper authority on account of the sums received in respect of those charges of such an amount as in their opinion will approximate to, but will not exceed, the actual amount produced by the charges in that area or district.

5. So soon as the actual amount produced by the charges levied in any area or district can be ascertained, the Commissioners shall pay to the proper authority the balance of the amount so produced, provided that the Commissioners may, if they see fit, at any time between the first payment on account and the payment of the final balance, make any further payments on account.

6. Where any order is transmitted under these Rules to the treasurer of a compensation fund, the Commissioners shall notify the amount of the order to the Clerk of the authority by whom the treasurer is appointed.

In pursuance of an Act for better preserving the navigation of the River Mersey (5 and 6 Vict., cap. 110), we, the Liverpool Lighterage Company Limited, Flatowners, Carriers, and Shipwrights, Drury Buildings, Water-street, Liverpool, and Dock-road, Garston, give notice that the said Company propose to construct a Gridiron on the River Mersey abutting upon the River Wall of the London and North Western Railway Company's North Dock, Garston, at about 185 feet from its northern end, as shown on the plan deposited in the Office of the Mersey Conservancy. The Gridiron would be constructed of wood in the form of a parallelogram 76 feet long by 24 feet wide with cross pieces at intervals of 16 feet, bolted to and flush with the ends and sides.
