[The bearings are magnetic, and those concerning the visibility of lights are given from seaward.]

No. 202.—NORTH SEA—EIDER RIVER. Eider Galliot Light-Vessel—Alteration in Tidal Signals.

The German Government has given notice, dated 25th February, 1905, that the tidal signals shown from the Eider Galliot Light-Vessel have been altered as follows:—

- a. A red triangular flag hoisted on the fore-mast indicates 9 feet 9 inches.
- b. A black cylinder suspended horizontally from the right hand yardarm, as seen from seaward, indicates 6 feet 6 inches.
- c. Two black cones, bases together, hoisted on the left hand yardarm, as seen from seaward, indicates 3 feet 3 inches.
- d. A yellow square flag under the red triangular flag on the foremast indicates 3 inches.

The above signals shown separately or in combination denote the depth over the bar, and at the same time signify that it is clear.

EXAMPLE.—A red triangular flag, with a yellow square flag under it, hoisted at the foremast head, and two black cones, bases together, shown on the left hand yardarm, as seen from seaward, indicates that there is a depth of 9 feet 9 inches + 3 feet 3 inches + 0 feet 3 inches = 13 feet 3 inches over the bar.

No. 203.—ICELAND—SOUTH COAST.

Skeidara (Skeidar) Sands—Shipwreck Refuge
Established.

Information, dated 25th February, 1905, has been received that a refuge for shipwrecked Mariners has been constructed on a conspicuous hill about $2\frac{1}{3}$ cables from the Skeidara (Skeidar) Sands on the south coast of Iceland. The exact position of this refuge is not at present known; but it contains provisions, means of attracting passing vessels, and directions in the German, English, French, Danish, and Icelandic languages, for guiding Mariners over the rivers and swamps in the neighbourhood to the nearest habitations.

Watchet Harbour-Lights Altered, Tidal Signals.

The Urban District Council of Watchet has given notice that, after 25th March, 1905, and without further notice, the red fixed light on the extremity of the Western Breakwater of Watchet Harbour will be replaced by a red occulting dioptric light every ten seconds, thus:—light seven seconds, eclipse three seconds, elevated 31 feet above high water, and visible seaward in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles, but obscured over the harbour; it will be shown from an iron hexagonal tower 16 feet high, painted red, the light power being 300 candles. This light will be shown when there is a depth of or above 8 feet on the flood or 10 feet on the ebb in the harbour entrance and when the passage between the piers is clear.

The green light on the extremity of the eastern breakwater will be discontinued.

Day Tidal Signals.—A black ball will be hoisted on the gaff of the flagstaff on the Western Breakwater Head when the harbour entrance is clear, and when there is a depth of or above 8 feet on the flood, or 10 feet on the ebb.

Kap Shui Mun (Kap Sing Mun) Light—Alteration in.

Information has been received through the Board of Trade that, on 1st April, 1905, the two white fixed lights at present exhibited from the western point of Mawan Island, will be replaced by a red fixed dioptric light of the 6th order, elevated 50 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 6 miles.
