"That the glebe lands in Sibford Gower parish belonging to the benefice of Swalcliffe amounting to sixty-three acres three roods and twenty-four perches and now producing a rent of forty pounds shall be transferred from the benefice of Swalcliffe to the benefice of Sibford Gower with Epwell such transfer being in lieu of a voluntary payment of sixty pounds formerly made by the Vicar of Swalcliffe to the Vicar of Sibford Gower for undertaking the ecclesiastical duties at Epwell.

"That the annual stipend of twenty pounds now charged on and paid by the Vicar of Swalcliffe to the Vicar of Sibford Gower with Epwell shall be increased to thirty pounds.

"That the liability of the Vicar of Swalcliffe for the repair of the chancel of Epwell Church attaching to him as Rector of Epwell be transferred to the Vicar of Sibford Gower with Epwell.

"That no alteration shall be made in the patronage of the said benefices or either of them.

And whereas the said scheme hath been transmitted by the said Bishop to the said Archbishop for his consideration;

And whereas the said Archbishop, being satisfied with the said scheme, hath certified the same and the consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council by his report dated the eighteenth day of January one thousand nine hundred and five, which said report is in the words and figures following:—

"We the undersigned Randall Thomas Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council

"That the Right Reverend Francis Bishop of Oxford has represented unto us (amongst other things)

"That there are in the county of Oxford and his diocese of Oxford the benefice (being a vicarage) of Swalcliffe and the benefice (being a perpetual curacy) of Sibford Gower.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that a certain portion or district of the said parish of Swalcliffe comprising the civil parish of Epwell the boundaries whereof are well known and defined may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Swalcliffe and annexed to the said parish of Sibford Gower for ecclesiastical purposes only under the provisions of the Pluralities Act 1838.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the Warden and Scholars of New College Oxford the patrons or persons entitled to present to the said benefice of Swalcliffe and to the said benefice of Sibford Gower in case the same or either of them were now vacant the Reverend Canon Thomas Jordan Moulder and the Reverend Archibald James Moxon the Incumbents respectively of the same benefices has been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents above referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act 1838 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.
