GENERAL ORDER: Altering Regulations as to Payments on behalf of Guardians:—
SALFORD UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Salford Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Article 84 of a General Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Salford Union, amongst others, and hereinafter referred to as "the General Consolidated Order," the Poor Law Commissioners directed that the Guardians should pay every sum greater than Five Pounds by an order drawn upon their Treasurer and signed by the presiding Chairman and two other Guardians at a meeting, and countersigned by the Clerk;

And whereas by Article 16 of a General Order dated the 14th day of January, 1867, addressed to the Guardians of the said Union, amongst others, and hereinafter referred to as "the General Accounts Order," the Poor Law Board directed that the Clerk to the Guardians should keep a Book of Account termed the Petty Cash Book;

And whereas it is expedient that, so far as regards the Salford Union, provision should be made for assigning to an Assistant Clerk, in substitution for the Clerk to the Guardians, certain duties with respect to the receipt and disbursement of moneys on behalf of the Guardians:

Now, therefore, we, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, by this Our Order, Direct as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—(1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the Salford Union shall from time to time by a resolution designate an Assistant Clerk (hereinafter referred to as "the Assistant Clerk") by whom the duties prescribed by this Order shall be discharged.

(2.) The Assistant Clerk shall, in substitution for the Clerk to the Guardians, while the resolution by which he is designated remains in force, discharge the duties prescribed by this Order, and be accountable for the due application of all moneys from time to time received by him from the Guardians for the purposes of this Order.

ARTICLE II.—(1.) The Assistant Clerk shall keep a Petty Cash Book, in which shall be entered

promptly, and in the order of date, an account of the moneys received by him for the aforesaid purposes, and of the sums paid by him thereout in accordance with this Order, whether by direction of the Guardians or on his own authority in any case of urgency.

(2.) The said account shall be balanced quarterly, and laid before the Guardians at their ordinary meetings, and the Assistant Clerk shall submit and account for the same to the Auditor at the time of the audit, and the said account shall accordingly be an account to which such of the provisions of the General Accounts Order as relate to the examination and closing of accounts and the auditing of accounts shall apply.

ARTICLE III.—The moneys which the Guardians from time to time entrust to the Assistant Clerk for the purposes of this Order shall be of an amount which, in the opinion of the Guardians, will suffice for every such petty disbursement on their behalf as will not exceed the sum of Five Pounds and for every such payment in respect of the salary or other remuneration of an officer, assistant, or servant of the Guardians as will not exceed the sum of Ten Pounds, and as in either case will need to be made within such period as the Guardians fix.

ARTICLE IV.—(1.) While this Order is in force with regard to the payment of any salary or other remuneration by the Guardians to any of their officers, assistants, or servants, Article 84 of the General Consolidated Order shall, in relation to the Salford Union, have effect as if the words "Ten Pounds" were substituted in the said Article for the words "Five Pounds."

(2.) While this Order is in force, so much of Article 16 of the General Accounts Order as relates to the Petty Cash Book and the duties of the Clerk with respect to that Account shall cease to apply and have effect with respect to the Salford Union.
