THE CORRINGHAM LIGHT RAILWAY COMPANY.

CERTIFICATE OF THE BOARD OF TRADE AUTHO-BIZING THE RAISING OF ADDITIONAL CAPITAL.

Whereas the Corringham Light Railway Company (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") have compiled with the requirements of the Railway Companies Powers Act, 1864.

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade do by their Certificate, in pursuance of the said Act as amended by the Railways (Powers and Construction) Acts, 1864, Amendment Act, 1870, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers thereby in them vested, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, certify as follows:—

1. The Companies Clauses Acts, 1845 to 1889,

are incorporated with this Certificate.

2. In addition to the share capital already authorized to be raised by the Company under the Corringham Light Railway Order, 1899 (hereinafter called "the Order of 1899"), the Company may from time to time, subject to the provisions of Part II of the Companies Clauses Act, 1863, raise for the purposes of their undertaking any further sum not exceeding in the whole the sum of £5,000 (Five thousand pounds) by the issue of 5,000 new Ordinary Shares of one pound each, the said shares to rank for dividend as from the dates when they are respectively paid up in full, and in all other respects to rank equally with the shares already issued, and to be issued subject to the same terms and conditions as the original capital issued in pursuance of the Order of 1899.

3. The Company may in respect of the additional capital of five thousand pounds which they are by this Certificate authorized to raise, borrow, on mortgage of their undertaking in addition to the sums which they are authorized to borrow by the Order of 1899, any sum or sums not exceeding in the whole one thousand six hundred and sixty-six pounds.

4. The mortgagees of the undertaking may enforce payment of arrears of interest or principal or principal and interest due on their mortgages by the appointment of a Receiver. In order to authorize the appointment of a Receiver in respect of arrears of principal the amount owing to the mortgagees by whom the application for a Receiver is made shall not be less than five hundred pounds in the whole.

5. Every mortgage duly granted by the Company before the time when this Certificate comes into operation and subsisting at that time shall during the continuance thereof have priority over all mortgages granted under this Certificate.

6. The Company may create and issue debenture stock subject to the provisions of Part III of the Companies Clauses; Act, 1863, as amended by subsequent Acts, but notwithstanding anything therein contained the interest of all debenture stock and of all mortgages at any time after this Certificate comes into operation created and issued or granted by the Company shall rank pari passu, and shall have priority over all principal monies secured by such mortgages. REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for Situations on the Lower Permanent Clerical Staff in the Department of the Registrar-General for Scotland.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations,

I. The limits of age for this situation are 18 and 25, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.

II. Candidates must be natural-born or

naturalized British subjects.

III. The examination will be in the following subjects:—

1. Handwriting.

2. Orthography.

- 3. Arithmetic (including Vulgar and Decimal Fractions).
- 4. English Composition.
- 5. Digesting Returns into Summaries.

No Candidate will be eligible who fails to pass in any of the foregoing subjects.

- IV.—(i.) The following classes of persons are ineligible to compete, viz.:—
 - (a) Persons actually serving in the Army or Navy.
 - (b) Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary of less than five years' service.
- (ii.) The following classes of persons are eligible under certain conditions only, that is to say:—
 - (c) Persons holding situations in the Civil
 - (d) Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary, of more than five years' service.
 - (e) Probationary Engineer Cadets in the Navy and Apprentices in His Majesty's Dockyards.
 - (f) Persons who have been trained in Training Colleges at the public expense.
 - (g) Persons who have been trained in the Inland Revenue Branch of the Government Laboratory.

Persons comprised in the classes (c), (d), (e) must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons comprised in class (\hat{f}) will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Persons comprised in class (g) will not be qualified for appointment until the consent of the Board of Inland Revenue, given with the like sanction, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

V. Application for permission to attend an examination must be made at such time and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

VI. A fee of 10s. will be required from every Candidate attending an examination.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 10TH APRIL 1905.)

WORCESTERSHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) URDER OF 1905.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, with modifications, to certain Scheduled Districts.

1. The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 shall apply to the Districts specified in the Schedule hereto, (in this Order referred to as Scheduled Districts,) as if they had been declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area, but subject to the modifications hereinafter contained.

Markets Fairs Sales and Exhibitions of Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

- 2.—(1.) The Local Authority may grant a Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition of swine in a Scheduled District, if they are satisfied that the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held in a market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition which is capable of being thoroughly cleansed and disinfected, and thereupon the market fair sale or exhibition may be held accordingly: Provided that unless and until the Board otherwise order, no such Licence shall be granted by the Local Authority for the holding of a market fair sale or exhibition of swine within the petty sessional division of Worcester, in the administrative county of Worcester, or within the county borough of Worcester.
- (2.) A Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority, by special direction of the Local Authority, and shall specify the name and address of the person licensed to hold the market fair sale or exhibition (as owner of a market, or as an

auctioneer, or otherwise), and shall also specify the place where the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held, and may authorise the holding of periodical markets fairs sales or exhibitions on stated days for a time limited, not exceeding three months, but the Licence may be renewed from time to time or revoked at any time by the Local Authority.

- (3.) A Licence shall be published in such manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to ensure publicity for the same, and a copy of the Licence shall be posted and kept posted during the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition by the person licensed to hold or holding the same at or near the gate or other entrance of the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition where such market fair sale or exhibition is held.
- (4.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Licence granted by them for the holding of a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article.
- (5.) A fit person or a sufficient number of fit persons shall be appointed by the Local Authority and named in the Licence for the purpose of receiving Licences authorising movement of swine to the market fair sale or exhibition, and for granting Licences for movement of swine therefrom in accordance with the provisions of this Order.
- (6.) Nothing in this Order shall authorise the movement of swine along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare into a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Article without a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902.

Licences for Movement out of Licensed Markets, &c.

- 3.—(1.) Swine exposed at a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order may be moved from the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition along over or across a high-way or thoroughfare in a Swine-Fever Infected Area or a Scheduled District if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement—in the Form set forth in the Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or to the like effect—granted by the Local Authority of the District in which the market fair sale or exhibition is held.
- (2.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (3.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where the place of destination specified in the Licence is in a Swine-Fever Infected Area, or a Scheduled District, the swine shall be moved to such place and not elsewhere.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

- 4.—(1.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to a market fair sale or exhibition in a Swine-Fever Infected Area or a Scheduled District, the Licence shall be delivered up at the entrance to the market fairground sale-yard or place of exhibition by the person in charge of the swine to the person appointed under this Order to receive the same.
- (2.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to any other premises in a

Swine-Fever Infected Area or a Scheduled District, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

Attendance at Markets, &c.

5. A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend at every market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order.

Revocation by Board of Licences.

6. If the Board are of opinion, with respect to any Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Order, that the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the Licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 7.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Forms.

9. For the purposes of any Movement Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or this Order, the Scheduled Districts shall be deemed to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area.

Offences.

- 10.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of
- (3.) If any person fail to deliver up or send a Licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

11. In this Order-

- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- "Swine-Fever Infected Area" means an area declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever infected Area:
- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement

12. This Order shall come into operation on the seventeenth day of April, nineteen hundred and five.

13. This Order may be cited as the WORCESTER-SHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1905.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Amending Regulations with respect to remuneration of Collector of the Guardians:—

PARISH OF SAINT MARY, ISLINGTON.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Mary, Islington;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Orders bearing date the twenty-second day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and the twenty-third day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, the Poor Law Board, and We, the Local Government Board, made rules and regulations relating to the appointment and renuneration of certain Officers, therein named Collectors of the Guardians, by the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Mary, Islington;

And whereas by a General Order dated the seventh day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, We made further

regulations relating to the appointment and remuneration of certain Officers including Collectors of the Guardians;

Heald Bank (Cole Shoal)—Light-Buoy Replaced
by Light-Vessel.

Fort Point, Galveston-Fog Signal Established.

With reference to Notices to Mariners Nos. 46 and 102 of 1904:—

The United States Government has given further notice that, on the 1st April, 1905, the light-buoy, exhibiting a white occulting light

every twenty seconds, formerly moored to the south-westward of Heald Bank or Cole Shoal, about 34 miles S. 71° E. from Bolivar Point Lighthouse, Galveston Harbour, would be replaced by a steam light-vessel moored in a depth of 7 fathoms at a distance of about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles S. 34° W. from the $4\frac{1}{3}$ fathom head, or $33\frac{4}{10}$ miles S. 68° E. from Bolivar Point Lighthouse.

Heald Bank Light-vessel will show two white fixed dioptric lights (one from each masthead), each elevated 50 feet above the sea and visible in clear weather from a distance of 12 miles; this light-vessel, which is painted red and marked "Heald Bank" on the sides, and "81" on each bow, is schooner rigged with no bowsprit, has two black masts surmounted by red circular daymarks, and a black funnel between them.

During thick or foggy weather a steam chime whistle will give two blasts every thirty seconds, thus:--blast, two seconds; silent interval, six seconds; blast, two seconds; silent interval, twenty seconds.

Approximate position, lat. 29° 6′ N., long 94° 12½′ W.

(Construction of Tramway in Aspull; Gauge; Motive Power; Borrowing of Money; Tolls, Rates, and Charges; Incorporation, Repeal, and Alteration of Acts; and other matters.)

OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made in the state of the intended to be made to Parliament in the present Session by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Wigan (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation"), by petition for additional provision, for leave to introduce into the Bill now pending in Parliament under the above title, provisions and amendments to give effect to all or some of the following objects and purposes (that is to say):-

1. To empower the Corporation to make, lay down, form, and maintain the tramway hereinafter described with all necessary and proper rails, plates, sleepers, channels, junctions, turn-tables, turnouts, crossings and passing-places, carriage-houses, engine, boiler, and houses, sheds, buildings, engines, dynamo houses, sheds, buildings, engines, dynamos, works and conveniences connected

therewith respectively.

In the following description, where any distance is given with reference to any street which intersects or joins the street in which the tramway is to be laid the distance (unless otherwise stated) is to be taken as measured along the centre of the street from the point at which lines drawn along the centres of the two streets and continued would intersect each other; and a point described as being opposite to a street is to be taken as opposite to the centre of the street.

The tramway proposed to be authorized will be situate in the urban district and township of Aspull, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, and

is as follows:

Tramway No. 3.—Commencing in Wigan-road by a junction with Tramway No. 2, described in the above-named Bill, at a point 1 chain 50 links from Kirkless-street measured in a south-westerly direction, and terminating in Scot-lane at a point 1 chain from Stanley-road measured in a southwesterly direction.

In the following instances the tramway will be laid along Wigan-road, so that for a distance of 30 feet or upwards a less space than 9 feet 6 inches will intervene between the outside of the foot-

path on both sides of the said road and the nearest rail of the tramway.

(a) From a point opposite to Kirkless-street, for a distance of 286 yards in a northeasterly direction.

(b) From a point opposite to Higher-lane, for a distance of 300 yards measured in a north-

easterly direction.

(c) From a point 57 yards measured in an easterly direction from Duke's-row, for a distance of 110 yards measured in an easterly direction.

(d) From a point 48 yards measured in an easterly direction from Crawford-street, for a distance of 110 yards measured in a

north-easterly direction.

2. The tramway is proposed to be constructed on a gauge of 3 feet 6 inches, with power to substitute therefor a gauge of 4 feet 81 inches either when constructing the tramway or at any time thereafter. It is not intended to run on the tramways carriages or trucks adapted for use on railways. The motive power will be animal power or any mechanical power (including steam, electric, and every other motive power

not being animal power).
3. To provide that the proposed tramway shall form part of the existing Tramway Undertaking of the Corporation, and to extend and apply thereto all or some of the powers and provisions relating to that Undertaking or such provisions re-enacted with amendments in the said Bill, and to extend and apply thereto all or some of the powers and provisions contained in

the said Bill.

4. To modify or exclude the provisions of section 43 of the Tramways Act, 1870, in their

application to the tramway.

5. To empower the Corporation, the Aspull Urban District Council, and the Leeds and Liverpool Canal Company to enter into and carry into effect agreements in relation to the widening or reconstruction of the bridge carrying Wiganroad over the Leeds and Liverpool Canal in the district of the said Council; to confirm any agreements entered into prior to the passing of the said Bill, and to confer upon the said parties any necessary powers for the purposes aforesaid.

6. To authorize the Corporation to borrow money for the construction of the tramway for the widening and improving of streets and bridges and for other purposes, and to charge the same on the borough fund and rate, the district fund and general district rate, and the undertakings, estates, rates, revenue and other property of the Corporation, or any of such securities.

7. To incorporate, with or without amendment, or to render inapplicable, all or some of the provisions of the following public Acts:—The Public Health Acts; the Local Loans Act, 1875; the Lands Clauses Acts; the Tramways Act, 1870; and all Acts amending those Acts respectively.
