ORDER of the Local Government Board: Amending Regulations with respect to remuneration of Collector of the Guardians:—

PARISH OF SAINT MARY, ISLINGTON.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Mary, Islington;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Orders bearing date the twenty-second day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and the twenty-third day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, the Poor Law Board, and We, the Local Government Board, made rules and regulations relating to the appointment and remuneration of certain Officers, therein named Collectors of the Guardians, by the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Mary, Islington;

And whereas by a General Order dated the seventh day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, We made further

regulations relating to the appointment and remuneration of certain Officers including Collectors of the Guardians;

And whereas the said Orders contained provisions as to the remuneration of any person holding the office of Collector of the Guardians, and it is expedient to amend the said Orders as hereinafter mentioned, so far as regards the said Parish;

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order that with respect to the said Parish of Saint Mary, Islington, the said Orders shall have effect as if, in addition to the existing provisions with respect to the remuneration of the Collector of the Guardians, the following proviso were included in those Orders; that is to say:—

Provided that the Guardians, with the approval of the Local Government Board, may pay to any person for the time being holding the office of Collector of the Guardians a reasonable compensation on account of extraordinary services, or other unforeseen circumstances connected with his duties or the necessities of the Parish.
