Deputy Lieutenants of Counties and all Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Army, Militia, Yeomanry, or Volunteers, of whatever rank, except those on the Indian and Colonial Establishments, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the Inspector-General at the Horse Guards, Whitehall; but Officers of the Household Cavalry or the Brigade of Guards should communicate with the Lord Chamberlain at St. James's Palace.

All Officers of the Indian Civil Service and of the Indian Army, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate

Colonial Forces, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the Colonies possessing responsible Government, who will apply to the Private Secretary to the Inspector-General at the Horse Guards, Whitehall, for their cards for attendance or for presentation by the Inspector-General. The application must in all cases be supported by a credential from the Governor or Officer commanding the local Forces of the Colony.

REMOVAL OF MATERIALS PROHIBITED.

In pursuance of an Act for better preserving the Navigation of the River Mersey (5 and 6 Vic., cap. 110), We, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Warrington, hereby give you notice that we propose to widen the bridge across the River Mersey, known as Warrington Bridge by means of cantilevers, in accordance with plans and sections deposited at the office of the Mersey Conservancy. The object of the proposed widening of the bridge is to provide greater accommodation for the traffic passing over the bridge. It is proposed to widen the bridge from 28 feet to $50\frac{1}{2}$ feet by means of cantilevers constructed of iron, built in, and secured to the existing buttresses of the bridge. The cantilevers or brackets will extend from the face of the existing bridge 113 feet on each side of the bridge. Iron girders will be placed longitudinally upon the cantilevers and the roadway will be constructed on such girders for the use of foot passengers. The entire width of the existing bridge will be utilized for vehicular traffic. work will be commenced in two months' time. It will not exclude, impede, or interrupt the tidal or other waters of the River Mersey.

CHESTERFIELD CORPORATION TRAMWAYS.

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Chesterfield, pursuant to the provisions of the Chesterfield (Corporation) Tramways and Improvements Act, 1904, and the Tramways Act, 1870, as Promoters of the Tramways for the time being belonging to and worked by the Corporation.

1. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall extend and apply to all cars of the Corporation, and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws or

Regulations.

2. Every person shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the bindermost or conductor platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the Conductor. No passenger shall board or enter or attempt to board or enter a car until all passengers desiring to alight have done so.

3. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar, or cigarette in or upon any car, except behind the trolley pole on the top of the Any person offending against this Bye-law shall be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty below mentioned, to be summarily removed at the first opportunity from the car.

4. No person shall spit in or upon any car.

5. No passenger or other person shall, while in or upon any car, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

6. No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious, or infectious disorder, shall enter or mount upon any car, and any such person found in or upon any car shall be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the conductor.

7. No person shall whistle or sing, or swear, or use obscene, noisy, or offensive language, whilst in or upon any car, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car, or wilfully inter-

fere with the comfort of any passenger.

8. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage any cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or upon any car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this Byelaw shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, in addition to the liability to pay

the amount of any damage done.

9. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of the car, soil or injure the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might, for any other reason, be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter into or mount or remain in or upon any car, and shall not enter into or mount upon any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in or upon any car, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

10. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Corporation the fare legally demandable for

the journey.

11. Each passenger shall show his ticket when required to do so to the conductor or any duly

authorized servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required to do so, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

12. A ticket shall only be available for the car on or for which it is issued (except in the case of transfer or season tickets), and no passenger shall be entitled to leave any car for any purpose whatever at any stage or place and resume his journey by a different car to that on or for which such ticket was issued, without payment of a fresh fare from the point at which the passenger entered the second or other car.

13. No passenger shall wilfully alter or deface

his ticket so as to render the number or any

material portion illegible.

14. No passenger shall use or attempt to use a ticket on any day for which such ticket is not available, or which has already been used on a

previous journey.

15. No passenger shall bring in or on to any car any luggage other than his own personal luggage, and any such personal luggage shall be carried at the responsibility of the passenger. The personal luggage of any passenger must not exceed 28 lbs. in weight, and must be carried by hand, and must not occupy or overlap any part. of a seat, or be placed so as to reduce the clear way between seats, nor be of a form or description to annoy or inconvenience any other passenger.

16. No passenger or other person not being a tramway servant of the Corporation shall ride on, or lean over, the steps or platforms of any car, or stand on the roof, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any car. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall board a car, and no person shall hold or hang on to any part of a car.

17. When any car contains the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice attached to the car, is provided, no person beyond such number shall enter except by first obtaining the express per-

mission of the conductor. 18. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or upon any car, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to any passenger. Any dog or animal so taken in or on a car shall be carried on the lap of the passenger, and not otherwise. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any car after having been requested by the conductor not to do so. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

19. No person shall travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement, or any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to any

passenger.

20. No person other than the conductor or motorman, or other tramway servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controller, brakes, lamps, lights, trolley rope, or any part of a car or its equipment, and no person other than the conductor or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty shall ring the bell or otherwise signal the car to start.

21. No person shall wilfully obstruct any con-- ductor, motorman, or other servant of the Corupon or in connection with any car or lines or

any part thereof.

22. The conductor of each car shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations to the best of his ability.

23. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty

shillings.

24. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car a printed

copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

25. These Bye-laws shall come into force on

THE URBAN DISTRICT OF PONTYPRIDD.

PYE-LAWS made by the Urban District Council of Pontypridd as the Promoters of the Tramways in the Urban District of Pontypridd, under the Tramways Act, 1870, the Pontypridd Urban District Council Tramways Orders, 1901 and 1902, respectively, and the Pontypridd Urban District Council Act, 1903.

Interpretation of Terms.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the following words shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them, that is to say :

"Council" means the Urban District Council

of Pontypridd.

"Tramways" means the tramway system now or at any time hereafter worked by the Council, in the Urban District of Pontypridd.

"Car" means any carriage or car run by the Council upon the tramways for the conveyance

of passengers.
"Conductor" means any servant of the Council having the charge of a car or helping in the

charge of a car.

"Driver" means any servant of the Council driving or helping to drive a car.

Extent of Bye-laws.

2. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Council, and to all places with respect to which the Council have power to make Bye-laws or Regulations.

Offensive Language or Conduct.

3. No person shall swear or use obscene, indecent or offensive language, or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any car, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car or tramway station, or premises used in connection with the tramway system, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger. No person shall play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms, or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any car.

Objectionable Persons: 4. Any person who is in a state of intoxication, poration acting in the performance of his duty | and who from that cause is, in the opinion of the conductor, unfit to be a passenger ou a car, shall not be allowed to board or enter upon any car, and if any such person be found in or upon any car he shall be requested by the conductor to leave the car, failing which it shall be lawful for the conductor to remove such person from the

5. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a car, soil or injure the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger. or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any car, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any car, and shall not enter the interior of any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found in the interior of any car shall, on request of the conductor, leave the interior of the car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

Obstructing Conductor.

. 6. No passenger or other person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Council in the execution of his duty or work upon or in connection with any car or tramway of the Council.

Dogs. 7. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any car. Any dog or other animal taken into or found on any car shall be removed by the person in charge thereof from the tramway car immediately upon request by the conductor.

- Damaging Cars.
 8. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contra-vention of this Regulation shall be liable, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, for the amount of any damage so done.
- Firearms. 9. No person shall travel in or on any carriage of the Council with loaded firearms, or with any dangerous or offensive substance or material or implement.

Smoking. 10. No person shall smoke or carry lighted pipes, cigars, or cigarettes inside any car except in a compartment which may be specially set apart for the purpose. No person shall smoke tobacco or other weed in or upon the footboard or other access or other entrance to any car.

Spitting.

11. No person shall spit in or on any car.

Payment of Fares.

12. Every person shall, before leaving the car, pay to the conductor the fare legally payable for his journey and obtain a ticket therefor. Any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his journey, and no ticket shall be used a second time for travelling on any car. child under five years of age, provided such child is sitting on the lap of a passenger, shall not be liable to pay a fare.

No person shall travel or attempt to travel on a car without paying his fare and with

intent to avoid payment thereof.

Tickets

13. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his ticket to any officer of the Council, duly authorized in that behalf, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver I in motion.

up his ticket or pay the fare for the distance

travelled over by such passenger.

14. A passenger, not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Council, shall not use, or attempt to use, any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

Interfering with the Duties of the Conductor or Driver.

15. No person other than the conductor or driver shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a car or its equipment.

Luggage.

16. No luggage, which is in the opinion of the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Council from its size or otherwise, unsuitable for conveyance in or upon a car, shall be taken in or upon such car. Any personal luggage carried by passengers shall be placed in such part of the car as the conductor or other duly authorized officer as aforesaid may direct.

Full Number of Passengers.

17. When any car contains in the interior thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation according to the notice in that behalf attached to the car is provided in the interior, no other person shall enter or remain in the interior except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained.

When any car has, on the exterior thereof, the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation according to the notice in that behalf attached to the car is provided on the exterior, no other person shall mount or remain

on the exterior of such car.

Disabled Cars.

18. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way injured, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available car the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or injured car.

Cars proceeding to Shed.

19. No person shall travel upon a car which is proceeding to a shed and is not on its usual route.

Travelling on Step, &c.

20. No person excepting a passenger or intending passenger shall enter or mount any car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of a car, or, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained, travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

Entering and leaving Cars.

21. Every person shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor.

No person shall board a car before any person desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

Entering a Car when in motion.

22. No person shall enter, board or leave, or attempt to enter, board or leave any oar whilst متمد الجليدي المهاب المتدين للأنواب الروايريات

Use of Signal Bells.

23. No person shall ring, or cause to be rung, any of the signal bells upon any car, so as to effect the unnecessary stoppage of any car, or signal a car to start.

No Person suffering from Disease to travel on Car.

24. No person afflicted with any infectious or contagious disease shall board, enter, or travel on any car, or attempt so to do.

No driver or conductor shall wilfully or knowingly suffer or permit any such person so to do.

Power to remove Passengers committing Offence.

25. Any person who shall commit, whilst on any car, any legal offence or any breach of these Bye-laws, shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be immediately removed from a car, and if such person shall have paid his fare, shall not be entitled to demand the return thereof.

Conductors and Drivers to enforce Bye-laws. 26. The conductor of each car shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws to the best of his ability.

Penalty.

27. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Copy of Bye-laws.

28. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use, a printed copy of these Bye-laws.

These Bye-laws shall come into force on the

first day of July, 1905.

Bre-Laws as to Tramways, in pursuance of Section 44 of the Manchester Corporation Tramways Act, 1900.

HEREAS the Lord Mayor Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Manchester (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") are by the Manchester Corporation Tramways Act 1900 Section 44 required to make bye-laws under the provisions of the Tramways Act 1870 prescribing the distances at which carriages using the tramways of the Corporation within the City shall be allowed to follow one after the other and whereas the aforesaid Section also provides that such bye-laws shall define the extent of the user of the following tramways:—

No. 14-Fennel Street.

" 8-Portland Street (one line).

" 15—Miller Street. " 10—Peter Street.

, 11—John Dalton Street.

And whereas the Corporation have not constructed any tramways in Fennel Street and Miller Street:

Now we the said Lord Mayor Aldermen and Citizens in Council assembled in the Town Hall Albert Square in the City of Manchester on the fifth day of April 1905 do hereby in pursuance of the Tramways Act 1870 and Section 44 of

the Manchester Corporation Tramways Act 1900 above referred to make the following bye-laws namely:—

1. The driver of every carriage using any tramway within the City shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding carriage using the same tramway at a less distance than twenty-five yards except as hereinafter

mentioned viz.:

(a) In the central area hereinafter described the distance at which a carriage shall follow a preceding carriage using the same tramway shall be such as may be directed by the police. Any driver who shall fail to obey such direction shall be deemed to have committed an offence against this Bye-law. The central area above referred to is as follows—The area bounded by Swan Street Miller Street Ducie Bridge New Bridge Street Great Ducie Street Victoria Street Deansgate Whitworth Street West Whitworth Street Store Street Great Ancoats Street and Swan Street and such area shall include the above-named streets or portions thereof bounding the same.

(b) Within fifty yards of a stopping place or terminus outside the central area the distance at which a carriage shall follow a preceding carriage using the same tramway shall be not less than five yards but the speed

of the carriage shall be slackened.

Provided always that it shall not be deemed an offence against this bye-law for carriages upon any tramway outside the central area to stand or to be placed nearer to each other than five yards—

(c) In case of accident or emergency or

(d) When upon any loop or siding or (e) When upon any portion of a tramway outside the central area sanctioned by the Corporation as a stand for tramcars in waiting.

2. The extent of the user by the Corporation of the following tramways shall be as respectively set forth in the second column of the following table:—

The tramways in this street may be used subject to the following restrictions:-No carriage shall be run on such tramways between the hours of nine o'clock in the forenoon and seven o'clock in the afternoon except (a) in case of emergency or (b) in relief of tramway traffic in Street Albert Mount Square Cross Street and Deansgate but in such case the driver of every carriage shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding carriage at a less distance than fifty yards.

So much of the tramway in this street constructed under the powers of the Manchester Corporation Tramways Act 1900 as is situate between Oxford Street and the south-westerly side of Parker Street shall not be used between the hours of nine o'clock in the forenoon and seven o'clock in the afternoon except (a) in case of emergency or (b) in relief of tramway traffic in Mosley Street Piccadilly and Market Street but in such case driver of every carriage shall so drive the same that it shall not a preceding carriage at a less distance than fifty yards.

The portion of the said Portland tramway in Street between the southwesterly side of Parker Street and Piccadilly may be used without restriction.

3. The driver of any carriage who shall offend against the foregoing Bye-laws shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding

forty shillings.

4. The foregoing Bye-laws may be from time to time revoked or altered by the Corporation under and in accordance with the provisions of the Tramways Act 1870.
