ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 14TH APRIL 1905.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Until the first day of June, including that day, the production of the declaration prescribed by Article 4 (2) of the Sheep-Scab (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1905 shall not be necessary for the granting of a licence to move out of the area described in the schedule hereto to a specially authorised market, fair, or saleyard, sheep which have been previously marked by the painting or stamping with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back, and another broad line across the loins of each sheep thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

2. Sheep marked in accordance with the preceding Article may be moved from a specially authorised market, fair, or saleyard if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority to any lair, field, or other inclosed premises appropriated for the sole purpose of the detention of sheep so moved, and approved for that purpose by the Local Authority, and the sheep, notwithstanding anything in Article 4 (3) of the said Order, may at any time be moved from such premises to a slaughterhouse without being previously dipped, provided that they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority.

SCHEDULE.

Area to which this Order applies.

An Area comprising the counties of Aberdeen, Argyll, Banff, Caithness, Clackmannan, Dunbarton (except its detached part), Elgin, Fife, Forfar, Inverness, Kincardine, Kinross, Nairn, Orkney, Perth, Ross and Cromarty, Sutherland, and Zetland, and that part of the county of Stirling which lies to the north of a line from the mouth of the Carron River on the Forth at Grangemouth and following the Caledonian and North British Railway line from Grangemouth via Falkirk, Larbert Junction, and Kilsyth to the point where it crosses the county boundary of Dunbarton between Belmore and Summerston stations; the cities of Aberdeen, Dundee, and Perth; and the burghs of Campbeltown, Peterhead, Dunbarton, Elgin, Dunfermline, Kirkcaldy, Arbroath, Brechin, Forfar, Montrose, Inverness, and Stirling, and that part of the burgh of Falkirk which lies to the north of the railway line aforesaid.

(SHEEP-SCAB COMPULSORY DIPPING AREA.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Declaration of Sheep-Scab Compulsory Dipping Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Compulsory Dipping Area for the purposes of the Sheep-Scab (Compulsory Dipping Areas) Order of 1905.

Period for Compulsory Dipping.

2. The dates between which all sheep in the Compulsory Dipping Area hereby declared are to be treated by the owner for sheep-scab by effective dipping under Article 2 of the abovementioned Order are bereby fixed to be the third day of July and the thirty-first day of the same month in every year.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of May, nineteen hundred and five.
