ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 19TH MAY 1905.)

DIPPING OF SHEEP (WORCESTERSHIRE) ORDER OF 1905.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Power to make Regulations.

- 1. The Local Authority of any district specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make regulations-
 - (i.) for prescribing regulating and securing the periodical treatment by effective dipping of all sheep in the district, or in any part of the district specified in the regulations;
 - (ii.) for prescribing the separation of sheep dipped in accordance with regulations under this Order from sheep not so dipped, and, for such purpose, for prohibiting or regulating the movement of sheep along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare;
 - (iii.) for requiring returns by owners of sheep as to the sheep in their possession to be delivered to such persons, at such time, in such form, and with such particulars, as may be prescribed by the regulations;
 - (iv.) for requiring notice of intention to carry out the prescribed dipping to be given by the owner or person in charge of the sheep to be dipped to such person, at such time, in such form and with such particulars, as may be prescribed by the regulations;
 - (v.) for requiring evidence of dipping in compliance with the regulations to be furnished by the owner or person in charge of sheep to such person, at such time, in such form, and with such particulars, as may be prescribed by the regulations;
 - (vi.) for prescribing and regulating the cleansing and disinfection of dipping places; and
 - (vii.) for authorising the sampling by an Inspector of the Local Authority of any dip which is being used for the dipping of sheep.

Confirmation of Regulations.

- 2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.
- (2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply-
 - (i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirma-

- one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the district three weeks at least before the making of the application.
- (ii.) For three weeks at least before an application, a copy of the regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the district, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the district without fee or reward.
- (iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed regulations on payment of sixpence.
- (3.) A copy of any regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the regulations, without further or other proof.

Powers of Entry of Inspectors.

3. An Inspector of the Local Authority may, subject to their direction and for the purposes of any regulation under this Order, enter any premises and examine any sheep thereon.

Power to provide Dipping Places.

4. The Local Authority of any district specified in the Schedule to this Order may provide and fit up and maintain dipping places, but subject to the approval in writing by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries of the site of each dipping place; provided that no dipping place shall be used under this provision if its use would injuriously affect the water in any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, well, pond, or place constructed or used for the supply of water for drinking or other domestic purposes.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the DIPPING OF Sheep (Worcestershire) Order of 1905.

Bury Corporation Tramways.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Bury, being the Promotors of the Bury Corporation Tramways Undertaking, and Lessees of certain Tramways in the Urban District of Radcliffe, under and in pursuance of

Council, held on the 4th day of May, 1905, duly made the following Bye-laws, namely:-

Interpretation.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the word "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the county borough of Bury, and such other local authority as may for the time being use the tramways of the Corporation; the word "tramways" means the tramway system at present worked by the Corporation, whether situate within the county borough of Bury or in any other district, and any future extensions thereof in the said borough and in any such district; the words "the Tramways Committee" mean the committee appointed by the Corporation for the time being to undertake the control and management of the tramways; the word "car" means any carriage or car run by the Corporation upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers, and shall include the cars of local authorities or persons exercising running powers over the tramways; the word "conductor" means any officer or servant of the Tramways Committee having the charge of or helping in the charge of a car; and the word "driver" means any officer or servant of the Tramways Committee driving or helping to drive a car.

Extent of Bye-laws.

2. The Bye-laws hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all cars of the Corporation and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws.

Entering and Leaving Cars.

3. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor.

All persons desiring to alight from any car, shall do so before any person boards such car for the purpose of travelling thereon, and all persons desiring to board the car shall permit such persons to alight as aforesaid.

Smoking.

4. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar, or cigarette inside any car.

Musical Instruments.

5. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any car, play or perform upon any musical instrument, or make any other noise which may be objectionable to passengers

Intoxicated Persons, &c.

6. Any person who is in a state of intoxication or affected with any dangerous, contagious, or infectious disorder, shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any car, and any such person found in or upon any car shall be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of the fare so paid.

Offensive Language or Conduct.

7. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language, or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any car, or spit or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car or tramway station or premises used in connection with the tramway system, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger. No person shall distribute advertisements or tracts the powers conferred upon them by the Tram- of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms, or ways Act, 1870, at a Meeting of the Town subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or truit in or-upon any car.

Damage to Cars.

8. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall be liable, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, to pay the amount of any damage so done.

Objectionable persons.

9. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of a conductor of a car, soil or injure the seats, linings, or cushions of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any car, and may be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon any car, and shall not enter in or upon any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in or upon any car, shall, on the request of the conductor, leave such car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

Payment of Fares.

10. Each passenger shall, before leaving the car, pay to the conductor or other servant of the Tramways Committee, acting in the performance of his duty, the fare legally demandable for the journey, or for the stage thereof for which it is demanded, and obtain a ticket therefor. Any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his journey.

Children's Fares.

11. No child under three years of age shall be liable to pay a fare; a child over three and under seven years of age shall pay the fare of one penny for any distance, whilst two children, over three and under seven years of age, shall together be liable to pay one full ordinary fare.

Tickets.

12. Each passenger shall show his ticket when required so to do to the conductor or other servant of the Tramways Committee, acting in the performance of his duty, and shall also, when required so to do by the conductor or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger. Tickets shall not be transferable, and shall only be available by the car on which they are issued.

Artisans.

13. A passenger, not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Corporation, shall not use, or attempt to use, any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers, or travel or attempt to travel on the tramways as an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer.

Luggage.

14. No passenger shall bring on to any car any luggage other than his own personal luggage, and any such personal luggage shall be carried at the responsibility of the passenger, and shall be placed by the passenger in such position on the car as shall be directed by the conductor, and shall not exceed 28 lbs. in weight.

Travelling on Steps, &c.

15. No passenger or other person, not being a servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, shall be permitted to travel or ride on the steps, platforms, outside rails, buffers, or guards of any car, or sit on the outside rail on the outside of any car, or stand in any case on the outside, or, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained, in the interior of any car,

No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or board any car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any car.

Full Number of Passengers.

16. When any car contains in the interior thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided in such interior, no additional person shall enter, board, or remain therein, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained.

When a car contains, on the outside thereof, the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided on such outside, no person beyond such number shall enter, board, or remain thereon.

Entering or leaving a Car when in motion.

17. No person shall enter, board, or leave, or attempt to enter, board, or leave any car whilst in motion.

Dogs.

18. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any car, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any car, after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car in breach of this Bye-law, shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car, immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by, or under the direction of, the conductor.

Firearms, &c.

19. No person shall enter, board, or travel in or on any car with firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement, or any material or substance which may in the opinion of the conductor be dangerous or offensive to the passengers, provided that nothing in this Bye-law shall apply to persons in the Naval, Military, Reserve, or Auxiliary Forces carrying unloaded firearms.

Interference with Conductor or Driver.

20. No person, other than the conductor, driver, or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a car, or its equipment, or signal a car to start.

Obstruction.

21. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any conductor, driver, or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramway; and no person shall within the county borough of Bury wilfully obstruct or impede any car.

Disabled Cars.

22. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way injured, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but shall have the right to complete their journey by the next available car. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or injured car.

Conductors and Drivers to enforce Bye-laws.

23. Every conductor and driver of a car shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws to the best of his ability.

Penalty.

24. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Bye-laws to be placed in Cars.

25. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws.

Operation.

26. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the 12th day of July, 1905.
