THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Urban District Council of Wimbledon, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:—

Whereas by the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885, it is enacted that where a Petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a Scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularized.

And whereas in the month of April, one thousand nine hundred and four, certain Inhabitant Householders of the Urban District of Wimbledon, in the county of Surrey, petitioned His Majesty the King praying for the grant of a Charter of

Incorporation.

And whereas the said Petition for a Charter was referred to the Committee of Council, and it was proposed by the Charter to create the Urban District of Wimbledon hereinafter described a Municipal Borough, and to incorporate the Inhabitants thereof, and to extend the Municipal

Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter.

And whereas under and by virtue of the Local Government Act, 1858, the Local Board for the District of Wimbledon (hereinafter called "the Local Board") was in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six constituted and became invested with various powers and duties, and the Local Board was constituted the Urban Sanitary Authority for the Local Government District of the Parish of Wimbledon.

And whereas under and by virtue of the Local Government Act, 1894, the Local Board became the Urban District Council for the Urban District of Wimbledon (hereinafter called "the District Council").

And whereas at a Meeting of the Vestry of the Parish of Wimbledon, held on the 22nd day of January, 1873, the Wimbledon Local Board was, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1857, and the Local Government Act, 1858, appointed the Burial Board for the said Parish.

And whereas the Urban District Council of Wimbledon as such Burial Board as aforesaid are the owners in fee simple of certain lands within the District of the said Council, and which said lands are laid out and used for the purposes of a burial ground.

And whereas a table of fees duly allowed and approved in accordance with the provisions of the Burial Acts is now in force within the District of the said Council.

And whereas by an Order dated the fourteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and finally approved on the ninth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, the Surrey County Council divided the District of Wimbledon into six Wards named No. 1 (St. Mary's) Ward, No. 2 (St. John's) Ward, No. 3 (Cottenham Park) Ward, No. 4 (Dundonald) Ward, No. 5 (Triuity) Ward, and No. 6 (South Park) Ward.

And whereas the Education Act, 1902, has come into operation in the District of Wimbledon, and the District Council thereof is now the Local Education Authority within the said District for the purposes of Part III of the said Act, and a Scheme for the constitution of an Education Committee was made by the District Council on the twenty-fifth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and three, and was approved by the Board of Education on the ninth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and three.

And whereas the Local Government Board did on the sixth day of March, one thousand nine hundred, and the twenty-first day of April, one thousand nine hundred, under sections 33 and 34 of the Local Government Act, 1894, issue certain Orders by which the District Council were vested with the power to appoint Overseers, the power to appoint and to revoke the appointment of Assistant Overseers, and other powers of a Parish Council (Sections 5 and 6 in part of the said Act), and powers of Vestry under the Poor Rate Assessment and Collection Act, 1869.

And whereas the County Council of Surrey, by an Order dated the 11th day of February, 1902, and finally approved on the 13th day of May, 1902, and made under Section 57 of the Local Government Act, 1888, increased the number of Members of the District Council from 15 to 18.

And whereas the following Acts have been adopted by the Local Board, and by the District Council, and are now in force within the District of the District Council, that is to say:

1. The Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1889; adopted on the 16th day of October,

2. The Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act, 1890; adopted on the 17th day of December, 1890.

3. The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890 (parts 2, 3 and 5); adopted on the 17th day of December, 1890.

4. The Public Libraries Acts; adopted on the 21st day of June, 1883.

5. The Housing of the Working Classes Act, 1890 (part 3); adopted on the 7th day of June, 1899.

6. The Baths and Washhouses Acts; adopted on the 4th day of August, 1897.

And whereas the following Provisional Orders are now in force within the District of the

1. The Wimbledon Electric Lighting Order, 1897, as confirmed by the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 2) Act, 1897.

2. The Wimbledon Electric Lighting (Extension) Order, 1903, as confirmed by the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 7) Act, 1903.

And whereas the District Council are one of the Constituent Authorities owning and maintaining with the Croydon County Borough Council, the Croydon Rural District Council and the Penge Urban District Council, a Small-pox Hospital at Cheam, under the provisions of the Croydon and Wimbledon Joint Small-pox Hospital Order, 1898, as amended by the Croydon and Wimbledon Joint Small-pox Hospital Order, 1903.

And whereas under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, the District Council have made Bye-laws in respect of new streets and buildings allowed by the Local Government Board on the twenty-first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety - two; thousand eight hundred and ninety - two; slaughter houses, nuisances and flushing of water closets allowed by the Local Government Board on the twenty-second day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four; tents, vans. sheds and similar structures allowed by the Local Government Board on the twenty-sixth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight; common lodging houses and houses let in lodgings allowed by the Local Government Board on the twenty-fourth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and one; management, use, and regulation of the Public Baths and Duties of the Officers and Servants of the Public Baths allowed by the Local Government Board on the seventeenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and one; pleasure grounds allowed by the Local Government Board on the twenty-second day of October, one thousand nine hundred and one.

And whereas the District Council made Regulations with respect to Allotments which were allowed by the Local Government Board on the eleventh day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

And whereas the District Council on the fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, made Regulations under the Dairies,

Cowsheds, and Milkshops Order of 1885.

And whereas the District Council on the twenty-sixth day of March, 1904, made Regulations under section 21 of the Public Health Act.

And whereas the County Council of Surrey have made certain Bye-laws for the good rule and government of the Administrative County of Surrey, and the same are now in force in the Urban District of Wimbledon.

And whereas the District Council is a local authority within the meaning of the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885.

And whereas this Scheme was before being settled by the Committee of Council referred for consideration to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, to the Local Government Board, to the Board of Trade and to the Board of Education.

And whereas it is expedient that a Scheme should be made and settled, containing the provisions hereinafter set forth.

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order and declare as follows:

This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as "The Borough of Wimbledon Scheme, 1905."

The Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Wimbledon are in this Scheme referred to as "The Corporation."

This Scheme, when confirmed, shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter, and this Scheme shall be construed and applied as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council on the day before the day of the said first Meeting, and everything thereunder shall be done and had accordingly. This date is hereinafter referred to as "the commencement of this Scheme." So far as may be necessary this Scheme shall operate retrospectively.

From and after the commencement of this Scheme the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter shall be placed within the jurisdiction of the Corporation acting by the Council of the Borough as the Sanitary Authority of the

said Borough.

The District Council, their powers, duties, rights, obligations, and privileges, shall continue and be deemed to have continued to exist until the commencement of this Scheme, unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said Charter or the creation of the said Borough. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the District Council shall be and the same is hereby abolished, and the powers, duties, rights, obligations, and privileges thereof shall cease and determine.

All the jurisdiction, powers, duties, and property vested in or possessed by the District Council, or by any person or body in trust for them or any of their members as such (and not otherwise dealt with or transferred by or under any part of this Scheme), shall vest in the Corporation, and shall be exercised, held, and applied for the municipal and public purposes of the said borough.

All duties and liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the District Council or the property thereof, shall | attach to and he enforceable against the Corporation.

Any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the District Council before the commencement of this Scheme may be continued, prosecuted, or enforced by or against the Corporation.

The term "property" in this Scheme means and includes all property real and personal, and all things in action and all rights of common and commonable rights and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges and rights which have any pecuniary value, and all charters, records, deeds, books, and documents and all rights and all claims to relief and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise and includes any estate or interest legal or equitable in or in respect of any

property so defined

The District Fund and General District Rate of the Borough of Wimbledon shall for all purposes whatsoever (subject to the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, with respect to the Borough Fund and Borough Rate and Watch Rate respectively) take the place of and be substituted for the District Fund and General District Rate respectively of the District Council, and all sums of money respectively payable to, from, or out of, and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the District Fund and General District Rate of the said Urban District shall (subject as aforesaid) be paid to, from, or out of, and shall be charged upon the said District Fund and General District Rate of the said borough respectively.

All the rights, interests, powers, property, liabilities or obligations vested in or attached to the District Council under "The Public Health Act, 1875"; "The Wimbledon Electric Lighting Order, 1897"; "The Wimbledon Electric Lighting (Extension) Order, 1903"; "The Croydon and Wimbledon Joint Small-pox Hospital Order, 1898"; "The Croydon and Wimbledon Joint Small-pox Hospital Order, 1898"; "The Public Libraries Acts"; "The Infectious Disease (Notification) Act. 1899". "The Infectious Disease (Notification) Act. 1899". "The Infectious Disease (Notification) Act. cation) Act, 1889"; "The Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act, 1890"; "The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890, Parts 2, 3, and 5"
"The Baths and Wash-houses Acts"; "Th Housing of the Working Classes Act, 1890, Part ; and the Local Government Board Orders of the 6th day of March, 1900, and the 21st day of April, 1900, shall pass to, devolve upon, be exercisable by or against, vested in or attached to the Corporation acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the Borough, and from and after the commencement of this Scheme, the Corporation shall be and continue the legal successors of the Urban District Council of Wimbledon for all purposes. The Town Clerk of the Borough shall be substituted for and perform the duties of the Clerk to the District Council.

Any regulations under the Allotments Acts, the Public Health Act, 1875, and the Dairies, Cowsheds, and Milkshops Order of 1885, and any Bye-laws and any tables of fees and charges in force within the Urban District of Wimbledon at the commencement of this Scheme, shall, unless duly repealed, revoked or varied, continue in force and have operation in the Borough in like manner and with like effect as if the Corporation, acting by the Council and their Officers, and the Borough, were referred to therein instead of the Local Board or the District Council (as the case may be) and their Officers and the District.

The Bye-laws for the good rule and government of the Administrative County of Surrey, so far as they are in force in the Urban District of Wimbledon, shall continue in force and be enforced within the Municipal Borough of

Wimbledon until the expiration of two years from the commencement of this Scheme, or until other Bye-laws for good rule and government made by the Corporation shall have come into force whichever shall first occur.

As soon as may be convenient after the commencement of this Scheme, the Council of the Borough shall prepare and submit to the Board of Education a Scheme for an Education Committee for the Borough, in accordance with the provisions of Section 17 of the Education Act, 1902.

Until such Scheme shall have been approved by the Board of Education, the members of the Education Committee of the District Council who are in office immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be deemed to have been appointed and shall be the Education Committee for the Borough of Wimbledon.

As soon as the Scheme of the Borough Council shall have been approved by the Board of Education, the Education Committee appointed by the District Council shall be dissolved and cease to

Saving for Rates, &c.

Notwithstanding the incorporation of the Borough and the provisions of this Scheme, all rates, assessments, compositions, charges, mortgages, contracts, leases, conveyances, deeds, documents, acts, matters, and things made, entered into, or done before the commencement of this Scheme, by, to, or with reference to the District Council, shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation as if the same had been done, entered into, or done by, to or with reference to the Corporation instead of the District Council and may be proceeded on or enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of the District Council had been party or privy to the same and had been named or referred to therein.

In case any Officer of the District Council who shall have been employed by the District Council shall not be employed by the Council of the said Borough, nor offered by the said Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him, he shall be entitled to be paid by way of compensation for the loss of his position out of the funds of or under the control of the Corporation acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority for the said Borough, and the amount to be paid in each case shall be determined in accordance with the provisious of Section 120 of the Local Government Act, 1888, and Sub-sections (1) to (7), inclusive, of that Section, shall apply as if they formed part of this Scheme, with the substitution of the words "Borough Council" for "County Council," and "this Scheme" for "this Act," and with such other modifications as are necessary to make them applicable hereto.

Provided, nevertheless, that if any such Officer be so employed by the said Corporation and discharged by them (otherwise than for misconduct) within four years of the commencement of this Scheme he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the said Corporation. Provided that the term "Officer" shall include only persons employed by the said Council whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one

month and no other persons.

The accounts of the District Council and their Officers shall be (as soon as conveniently may be) audited by the District Auditor, in like manner, and subject to the like powers, duties, provisions and right of appeal as if the Charter had not been granted and the provisions of Sections 247 and 250 of "The Public Health Act, 1875," as amended by "The District Audi-tors Act, 1879," and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board with respect to the audit of accounts of Local Boards or Urban District Councils, and of their Officers shall apply to such audit; and the provisions of this scheme with respect to the District Council shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made, but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time, extent, character, and operation to the purposes of such audit; any money certified to be due from any person by the District Auditor at such audit shall be paid by such person to the Treasurer of the Borough.

Area to which this Order applies.

An Area comprising the counties of Aberdeen, Argyll, Banff, Caithness, Clackmannan, Dunbarton (except its detached part), Elgin, Fife, Forfar, Inverness, Kincardine, Kinross, Nairn, Orkney, Perth, Ross and Cromarty, Sutherland, and Zetland, and that part of the county of Stirling which lies to the north of a line from the mouth of the Carron River on the Forth at Grangemouth and following the Caledonian and North British Railway line from Grangemouth via Falkirk, Larbert Junction, and Kilsyth to the point where it crosses the county boundary of Dunbarton between Belmore and Summerston stations; the cities of Aberdeen, Dundee, and Perth; and the burghs of Campbeltown, Peterhead, Dunbarton, Elgin, Dunfermline, Kirkcaldy, Arbroath, Brechin, Forfar, Montrose, Inverness, and Stirling, and that part of the burgh of Falkirk which lies to the north of the railway line aforesaid.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: (Altering General Accounts Order): Appointment of Stocktaker:— HITCHIN UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Hitchin Union:—

And to all others wi

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by General Orders of the Poor Law Board, dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1867, and the 16th day of February, 1869, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Hitchin Union (amongst others), it is required that certain Accounts relating to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, when made up and balanced, shall be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some Member thereof, who shall enter a memorandum at the foot of those Accounts, certifying to the same having been submitted, and to the correctness, or otherwise, of the said Accounts as regards the stock remaining in store;

And whereas it is expedient to empower the said Guardians to appoint a competent person or persons to examine the stores at the Workhouse belonging to the said Union, and to perform the other duties hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us

by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Hitchin Union, as and when they shall think fit to do so, may appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as hereinafter set forth, and may revoke that appointment. Any appointment of a Stocktaker by the Guardians shall be notified to Us forthwith.

ARTICLE II.—Every appointment of a Stock-taker shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Regulations in force for the time being as to the appointment of Officers by the said Guardians, and a person appointed to the office of Stocktaker shall receive such remuneration as may from time to time be assigned to him by the said Guardians.

ARTICLE III.—No person, except with Our consent, shall be appointed to the office of Stocktaker while holding any other office under the Guardians.

ARTICLE IV.—The Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stores at the Workhouse and compare the same with the quantities of stock remaining in store as shown by the entries in the proper columns in the Accounts termed respectively the "Quarterly Balance of the Provisions Account" and the "Quarterly Balance of the Necessaries and Miscellaneous Account."

He shall also, on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of clothing at the Workhouse and compare the same with the balance appearing in the Accounts termed respectively the "Olothing Materials Receipt and Conversion Account" and the "Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Account."

the "Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Account."

ARTICLE V.—After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article IV, the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of each of the aforesaid Accounts in the following form:—

"Submitted to me this day of 19, and found to be correct as regards the quantities of stock remaining in store.

"(Signed)....." Stocktaker."

If he find the stock to be in any respect incorrect he shall make such alteration in the said certificate as he may deem necessary, specifying the particulars in which he finds the quantities of stock to be incorrectly stated.

ARTICLE VI.—The Master of the Workhouse shall, when required by the Stocktaker to do so, on the days and at the times referred to in Article IV, submit to him the stores and Accounts therein mentioned, and render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of such examination and comparison as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VII.—The Master of the Workhouse shall lay each of the said Accounts before the Guardians at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of any such certificate as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VIII.—So long as a Stocktaker is appointed it shall not be necessary for the Visiting Committee to examine the stores or to enter in any Account the memorandum required by the first above-cited Order.

HEYWOOD CORPORATION TRAMWAYS.

Bye-Laws and Regulations made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Heywood, being the local authority of the said borough and the promoters of Tramways in the said Borough, under and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, at a Meeting of the Council of the said Borough held on the 11th day of May, 1905.

Interpretation.

Throughout these Bye-laws-

1. The word "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Heywood; the word "tramways" means the tramway system belonging to and worked or leased by the Corporation within the Borough of Heywood, whether worked by "mechanical" or "animal" power; the word "car" means any tram car or carriage run by the Corporation or its lessees upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers; the word "driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation or its lessees driving or assisting to drive a car; the word "conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation or its lessees having charge of or assisting in the charge of a car; words importing the masculine gender shall include females; words in the singular shall include the singular.

Application of Bye-laws.

2. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to every car run upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers, and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Byelaws or Regulations.

Entering or leaving Cars.

3. Every person shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor. All persons desiring to alight from any car shall do so before any person boards the car for the purpose of travelling thereon, and all persons desiring to board the car shall permit such persons to alight as aforesaid.

Smoking.

4. No person shall smoke or carry any lighted pipe, cigar, or cigarette inside a car or any compartment of a car not especially provided for that purpose.

Musical Instruments, &c.

5. No person shall play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon the car.

Objectionable Persons.

- 6. Any person who is in a state of intoxication, or who from that or any other cause is in the opinion of the conductor unfit to be a passenger on a car, or who in the opinion of the person in charge of premises belonging to the Corporation is unfit to remain on such premises, shall not be allowed to board or enter any car or premises; and if any such person be found in or upon any car or premises, he shall be requested by the conductor or person in charge to leave the car or premises, failing which it shall be lawful for such person to be removed by or under the direction of a conductor or person in charge of such premises.
- 7. Any person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of a conductor of a car or person in charge of premises belonging to the promoters, soil, injure or damage the seats, linings, curtains, or cushions of any car or premises or the dress or clothing of any passenger or occupant, or any person who in the opinion of the conductor or person in charge of such premises might for any reason be offensive to any passenger or occupant, shall not be entitled to enter, mount or remain in or upon any car or premises, and may be prevented from entering, mounting or remaining in or upon any car or premises or any part thereof, after having been requested not to do so by the conductor or person in charge of such premises, and if found in or upon any car or premises shall, on the request of the conductor or person in charge of such premises, leave the car or premises upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

Damaging Cars.

8. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions, curtains or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, or printed or other notice, in or upon any car, or break or scratch any windows of or otherwise wilfully damage any car. And any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and

Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage so done.

Offensive Language or Conduct.

9. No person shall swear or use obscene language, or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any car, or spit or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car or tramway station, or premises used in connection with the tramway system, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

Payment of Fares.

10. Each passenger shall upon demand pay to the conductor or other servant of the Corporation, acting in the performance of his duty; the fare legally payable for the journey, and accept a ticket corresponding thereto, or if the car is provided with a money-box for the receipt of fares, each passenger shall, immediately on entering the car or when required, deposit in the money-box the fare legally payable for the journey. No child under three years of age, who is sitting on the lap of a passenger, shall be liable to pay a fare.

Tickets.

- 11.—(a) Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do by the conductor or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally payable for the distance or stage travelled over by such passenger.
- (b) Any ticket for the time being issued by the Corporation in respect of fare shall only be available for the car on or for which it is issued (except in the case of a transfer or season tickets), and no passengers shall be entitled to leave any car for any purpose whatever at any stage and resume his journey by a different car to that on or for which such ticket was issued without payment of a fresh fare from the point at which the passenger entered the second or other car.
 - (c) Tickets are not transferable.

No passenger shall wilfully alter or deface his ticket so as to render the number or any material portion thereof illegible.

(d) No passenger shall use or attempt to use a ticket on any day for which such ticket is not available, or use a ticket which has already been used on a previous journey.

Workmen's Ticket.

12. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Corporation or to Tramways, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics or daily labourers, and any person not being an artisan, mechanic or daily labourer travelling on any workmen's cars shall pay the fare ordinarily chargeable on other than workmen's cars.

Personal Luggage.

13. Personal luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) not exceeding 28 pounds in weight shall be carried by hand by the passenger and shall not occupy any part of a seat nor be of a form or description to annoy or inconvenience other passengers, and if in the opinion of the conductor such luggage, if so carried, would cause such annoyance or inconvenience the same shall be placed on the front or driver's platform and not in the interior

or on the roof of any car, and shall be at the responsibility and risk of the passenger.

Travelling on Steps, &c.

- 14. No passenger or other person not being an officer or servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duties shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any car, or stand on the roof, or sit on the outside rails, buffers or guards of any car, or (except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained) stand in the interior of any car.
- 15. No person except a passenger or intending passenger shall enter or mount any car, and no person shall hold or hang on by any part of any car, or (except as aforesaid) travel therein otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

Cars containing Full Number.

- 16. When a car contains the full number of passengers which it is certified to contain, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount or remain in or upon any such car except by express permission of the conductor first obtained.
- 17. When any car contains the full number of passengers which it is certified to contain, a notice to that effect shall be placed in conspicuous letters and in a conspicuous position on the car.

Cars in Motion, &c.

18. No person shall enter, board or leave, or attempt to enter or leave, any car whilst in motion. Any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his journey.

Dogs.

19. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or upon any car, except by the permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Firearms.

20. No person shall enter, get upon or travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument or implement which may be dangerous to any passenger.

Interference with Conductor or Driver.

- 21. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any car, tramway, or premises of the Corporation.
- 22. No person other than the conductor or driver shall signal a car to start, or shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolly cord, or any part of a car or its equipment, or without reasonable cause signal a car to stop.

Disabled Cars.

23. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or it any way injured, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall upon the request of continues.

the conductor leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but shall have the right to complete their journey by the next available car. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or injured car.

Persons suffering from Disease not to Travel on Cars.

24. No person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall board, enter, or travel on any car, or attempt so to do. And no driver or conductor shall suffer or permit any such persons so to do.

Conductors and Drivers to enforce Bye-laws

25. Every conductor and driver shall to the best of his ability enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations and prevent the breach thereof, and if any such conductor or driver fails to enforce the same as aforesaid he shall be deemed to have committed a breach thereof.

Exhibition of Bye-laws.

26. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws.

Power to remove Passengers committing Offences.

27. Any person who shall commit, whilst on any car, any illegal offence, or any breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations, shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be immediately removed from the car, and if such person shall have paid his fare shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his fare so paid.

As to Distances between Cars, Stoppages, and Traffic.

Distance between Cars.

28. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than 50 yards, except in cases of emergency, when the driver shall comply with the directions given by the authority controlling traffic on the spot.

Stoppage of Cars.

29. No car shall be stopped within a clear space of 15 yards of another car on a parallel line of rails, nor within a clear space of 15 yards of the intersection or junction of two or more streets or roads.

Traffic Interruption.

No driver or conductor shall needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

Cars Crossing.

31. In cases where, by reason of the traffic, it becomes necessary for any car to cross over from one set of rails to the other, the car so crossing shall re-cross the roadway at the next practicable crossing.

Penalty.

32. Any driver, conductor, or other person infringing any of the foregoing Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding forty shillings, and in case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not exceeding ten shillings, in addition to the first-mentioned penalty, for every day during which such offence continues.

Date of coming into force.

These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of September, 1905.
