WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years

of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation, bearing date the fourth day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and five, in the words following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Willaston, situate in the county of Chester and in the diocese of Chester, and of the new parish of All Saints, Thornton Hough, situate in the said county of Chester and in the said diocese of Chester.

“Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the eighteenth day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and published in the London Gazette on the nineteenth day of the same month a district chapelry was assigned to the consecrated church called Christ Church situate at Willaston in the parish of Neston in the said county of Chester and the said district chapelry was named ‘The District Chapelry of Willaston’

“And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the fourteenth day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine and published in the London Gazette on the fifteenth day of the same month a consolidated chapelry was assigned to the Church of All Saints situate at Thornton Hough within the said cure of

Willaston and the said consolidated chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Thornton Hough.'

"And whereas the said district chapelry of Willaston and the said consolidated chapelry of All Saints, Thornton Hough, have become new parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty chapter thirty-seven, by the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and four and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Willaston and of the said new parish All Saints, Thornton Hough, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Francis John, Bishop of the said diocese of Chester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Willaston and of the said new parish of All Saints, Thornton Hough, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said new parish of Willaston which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of All Saints, Thornton Hough.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the new parish of Willaston, in the county of Chester and

in the diocese of Chester, and to be annexed to the new parish of All Saints, Thornton Hough, in the said county and diocese being:—

"All that portion of the said new parish of Willaston which is bounded upon the south-east by the parish of Eastham upon the north-east partly by the last-named parish and partly by the parish of Bromborough, upon the north by the parish of Bebington, all in the said county and diocese, upon the north-west and upon the greater part of the west, by the said new parish of All Saints, Thornton Hough, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the west and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of All Saints, Thornton Hough, from the said new parish of Willaston, at the junction of the road leading from Raby and Willowbrow Farmhouse with the road leading from Four Lanes End to Willaston, and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road which leads past the houses known as Rabyhouse Rabyhouse Farm and Hargrave Hall to Hooton, and extending thence first eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of one mile and thirty-two chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Willaston from the said parish of Eastham."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Chester.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1895, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render

the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient;

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the twenty-sixth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and the Swiss Federal Council for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, in the case of which Treaty the Extradition Acts of 1870 and 1873 were applied by Order in Council of the eighteenth May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one;

And whereas a Supplementary Convention was concluded on the twenty-ninth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and four, between His Majesty and the Federal Council of the Swiss Confederation, amending Article XVIII of the said Treaty of the twenty-sixth of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Supplementary Convention is in the terms following:—

Convention supplementing Article XVIII of the Extradition Treaty concluded between Great Britain and Switzerland, November 26, 1880.

THE Government of His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Federal Council of the Swiss Confederation, having deemed it necessary to extend, so far as regards the relations of Switzerland with the British Colonies and foreign possessions, the periods of thirty days and two months respectively fixed by Article III, paragraph 3, and Article VIII of the Treaty concluded on the 26th November, 1880, between Her late Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, &c., and the Swiss Federal Council respecting the extradition of persons accused or condemned, the Undersigned, duly authorized to that effect by their respective Governments, have agreed as follows:—

The following stipulation is added to the first paragraph of Article XVIII of the Treaty of Extradition:

“Nevertheless, so far as regards the relations of Switzerland with these Colonies and foreign possessions, the period of time fixed by Article III, paragraph 3, within which the requisition for extradition is to be made through the diplomatic channel, shall be six weeks; and that provided by Article VIII for the production of proof sufficient to warrant the extradition shall be three calendar months.”

The present Convention shall come into force from the date when the ratifications shall be exchanged. It shall have the same force and duration as the Treaty of Extradition of the 26th November, 1880, to which it relates.

It shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at London as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the undersigned have signed the present Convention, and have affixed their seals thereto.

Convention relative à un Complément de l'Article XVIII du Traité d'Extradition conclu entre la Grande-Bretagne et la Suisse, le 26 Novembre, 1880.

LE Gouvernement de Sa Majesté le Roi du Royaume-Uni de Grande-Bretagne et d'Irlande et le Conseil Fédéral de la Confédération Suisse, ayant jugé nécessaire de prolonger les délais de trente jours, respectivement de deux mois, prévus, pour les rapports de la Suisse avec les Colonies et possessions étrangères de la Grande-Bretagne, par l'Article III, alinéa 3, et par l'Article VIII du Traité conclu le 26 Novembre, 1880, entre feu Sa Majesté la Reine du Royaume-Uni de Grande-Bretagne et d'Irlande, Impératrice des Indes, &c., et le Conseil Fédéral Suisse concernant l'extradition de personnes accusées ou condamnées, les Soussignés, dûment autorisés à cet effet par leurs Gouvernements respectifs, sont convenus de ce qui suit:—

Est ajoutée au premier alinéa de l'Article XVIII du Traité d'Extradition la disposition suivante:

“Toutefois, dans les rapports de la Suisse avec ces Colonies et possessions étrangères, le délai prévu par l'Article III, alinéa 3, pour la demande d'extradition par voie diplomatique, sera de six semaines; et celui prévu par l'Article VIII pour la production des preuves permettant d'accorder l'extradition, sera de trois mois de calendrier.”

La présente Convention entrera en vigueur dès que les ratifications en auront été échangées. Elle aura la même force et la même durée que le Traité d'Extradition du 26 Novembre, 1880, auquel elle se réfère.

Elle sera ratifiée, et les instruments de ratifications en seront échangés à Londres aussitôt que possible.

En foi de quoi les Soussignés ont apposé leurs signatures et leurs sceaux à la présente Convention.

And whereas the ratifications of the said Supplementary Convention were exchanged at London on the twenty-ninth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and five;

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the ninth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and five, the said Acts shall apply in the case of Switzerland, under and in accordance with the said Treaty, as amended by the said Supplementary Convention above set forth.

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and entitled “An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals,” shall continue in force there, and no longer.

WHEREAS by section twenty (three) of "The Finance Act, 1894," it is enacted that His Majesty the King may, by Order in Council, apply that section to any British Possession where His Majesty is satisfied that, by the law of such Possession, either no duty is leviable in respect of property situate in the United Kingdom when passing on death, or that the law of such Possession as respects any duty so leviable is to the like effect as the foregoing provisions of that section:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the law of the State of New South Wales in the Commonwealth of Australia, as respects the duty leviable in respect of property situate in the United Kingdom when passing on death is to the like effect as the provisions of sub-section (one) of the aforesaid section.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the power by the aforesaid Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the twentieth section of "The Finance Act, 1894," shall apply to the State of New South Wales in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend in certain particulars regulations prescribed by Orders made by Her late Majesty in Council on the twenty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, the fifteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and the twenty-ninth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, respecting the employment and remuneration of persons in the Established Civil Service of the State:—

Now therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

PART I.—General.

1. When the sick leave granted to any officer employed in the Civil Service shall have amounted in the aggregate to twelve months during any period of four years or less, and it is desired to grant to him any further sick leave during such period, the case shall be reported to the Commissioners of the Treasury, who shall decide whether any, and if so what payment shall be made to him in respect of salary during such further sick leave.

Section (4) of Clause 9 of the Order in Council of the twenty-first March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and Section (4) of Clause 8 of the Order in Council of the fifteenth August,

one thousand eight hundred and ninety, are hereby repealed.

2. In Clause 20 of the Order in Council of the twenty-ninth November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, the words "but subject to the approval of the Treasury" are hereby cancelled.

PART II.—Second Division.

3. When under the provisions of Clause 6 of the Order in Council of the twenty-first March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, a promotion has been made to the higher grade of a clerk other than the clerk who reached the salary of two hundred and fifty pounds, the latter may, nevertheless, at the discretion of the head of his department, receive promotion to the higher grade, at or after the date when the clerk who was actually promoted would in ordinary course have reached a salary of two hundred and fifty pounds.

4. The Commissioners of the Treasury may, if they think fit, upon the recommendation of the head of a department, advance the salary of any clerk of not less than six years' service in the Second Division—who is reported to be exceptionally meritorious—by such amount (not exceeding four annual increments of his salary) as they may deem expedient.

Clause 3 of the Order in Council of the twenty-first March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, is hereby amended accordingly.

And whereas an Order in Council was made on the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, directing the discontinuance of burials in, amongst other places, the churchyard of Saint Mary, Blackburn:

And whereas it seems fit to His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the said Order be varied:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Order of the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, be varied, so that, notwithstanding anything therein, it shall be lawful to reinter in the churchyard of the parish church of Saint Mary, Blackburn, certain human remains which have been or are about to be removed from a part of the said churchyard under a licence issued or to be issued by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

WHEREAS the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the churchwardens of the parish of Saint Mary of Charity, Faversham, in the county of Kent, ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representation, have, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial ground should be opened in the borough of Faversham without the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials should be discontinued therein, as follows, viz.:—

FAVERSHAM.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Mary of Charity, Faversham, in the county of Kent; and after the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and five, in the churchyard, except as follows:—

(a.) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In any earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave:

(c.) In the said churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place with the exclusive right of burial therein.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the tenth day of July next:

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the *London Gazette*, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation one month before the said tenth day of July.

Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground should be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case might require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, should be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances might require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it should please His Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, should be published in the *London Gazette*, and should be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation was so considered; provided also that no such representation should be made in relation to the burial ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation should have been given to the Incumbent and vestry clerk or churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas by the Burial Act, 1855, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the churchwardens of the parish of Rothley, ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representation, have made a representation stating that they are of opinion that so much of the Order of Her late Majesty in Council of the fourteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, as relates to the church and churchyard of the said parish and the Rothley Baptist Chapel and chapelyard, should be varied, by substituting for the directions contained in the said Order relating to Rothley the following directions, viz.:—

ROTHLEY.—That, except as hereinafter provided, burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Mary the Virgin, Rothley, in the county of Leicester, and in the Rothley Baptist Chapel; and in the churchyard and chapelyard, except as follows:—

(a.) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said chapelyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In any earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave.

(c.) In the said churchyard in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place the burial may be allowed at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any person for whom, or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the tenth day of July next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation one month before the said tenth day of July.
