WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years

of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation, bearing date the fourth day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and five, in the words following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Willaston, situate in the county of Chester and in the diocese of Chester, and of the new parish of All Saints, Thornton Hough, situate in the said county of Chester and in the said diocese of Chester.

“Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the eighteenth day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and published in the London Gazette on the nineteenth day of the same month a district chapelry was assigned to the consecrated church called Christ Church situate at Willaston in the parish of Neston in the said county of Chester and the said district chapelry was named ‘The District Chapelry of Willaston’

“And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the fourteenth day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine and published in the London Gazette on the fifteenth day of the same month a consolidated chapelry was assigned to the Church of All Saints situate at Thornton Hough within the said cure of
