### MARRIAGES BETWEEN BRITISH SUBJECTS AND FRENCH CITIZENS.

CERTIFICATE TO BE ISSUED BY FRENCH CONSULS IN THE UNITED KINGDOM.

Having regard to the requirements which by French Laws have to be met in order to constitute a marriage binding on a French Citizen, whether the marriage is celebrated in France or abroad, it is most important in the interest of both parties that marriages with French Citizens should not be contracted in England without the production of a certificate in this form, which has been agreed upon between His Majesty's Government and the Government of the French Republic.

And I further certify that pursuant to the terms of Articles 47 and 170 of the Civil Code, a marriage contracted in a foreign country between two persons of French Nationality, or between a person of French Nationality and a person of another Nationality is valid if celebrated with the formalities customary in the country where such marriage takes place, provided that the notifica-tions and publication prescribed by French law have preceded such marriage, and that the con-tracting party of French Nationality has not infringed the provisions of Articles 144 to 164 of the Civil Code.

### DOVER HARBOUR.

(Alteration of Constitution of the Dover Harbour Board; Appointment of Chairman; Repeal and Amendments of Acts; and other purposes.)

OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the present Session by the Dover Harbour Board (hereinafter called "the Board") for leave to bring in a Bill, and to pass an Act for all or some of the following purposes:

To enact provisions for the alteration of the constitution of the Board, and so far as may be necessary for that purpose to repeal, alter or amend section 47 of the Harbours and Passing Tolls, &c., Act, 1861, and section 56 of the

Dover Harbour Act, 1901.

To provide that the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports shall no longer be a member of the Board; to make provision for supplying the vacancy so caused, and so that ultimately the Town Council of the borough of Dover shall elect three members of the Board instead of two as heretofore.

To make new provisions as to the appointment of Chairman of the Board.

To vary, repeal or extinguish all existing rights, powers and privileges which would in any manner interfere with or prevent the carr ing into effect of any of the objects of the Bill, and to confer other rights, powers and privileges.

the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons if and as soon as leave may be given to introduce

the same.

No. 555.—BALTIC, GERMANY—KIEL FIORD APPROACH.

Bülk, and Gables Flat-Light-Vessels Established, and Buoyage Altered. Stollergrund Light-Vessel—Withdrawn.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 287 of 1905:-

The German Government has given further notice, dated 3rd June, 1905, that the undermentioned light-vessels have been established and buoyage altered in Kiel Fiord and its approaches:-

a. A light-vessel, named "Bulk," exhibiting a red flashing light every eight seconds, thus: Flash, two and a quarter seconds; eclipse, five and three-quarter seconds, elevated 36 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 8 miles, has been moored on the western side of the entrance to Kiel Fiord at a distance of about 2 miles N. 89° E. from Bülk Point Lighthouse. This vessel, which is marked "Bulk" on each side, has two masts, and carries a black ball.

A fog horn on board this vessel will give during thick or foggy weather one blast every twenty seconds, thus:—Blast, three seconds; silent interval. seventeen seconds. If the fog horn is out of order two shots will be fired at an interval of thirty seconds every five minutes, and a bell will be struck ten times in succession every thirty seconds.

When this light-vessel is in position no fog signal will be given from Bülk Point Lighthouse.

Approximate position, lat. 54° 273' N., long. 10° 15∤′ E.

b.
