

## LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.

County of Middlesex (Waltham Cross and Enfield) Light Railways Order.

The Light Railway Commissioners have re-submitted to the Board of Trade, for confirmation (with additional powers) under the above-mentioned Act, an Order made by them for the construction of Light Railways in the County of Middlesex from Waltham Cross to Enfield and Edmonton.
