The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the fifth year of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria (session two) chapter twenty-six duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-ninth day of June, in the year one thousand nine hundred and five, in the words

following, that is to say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the fifth year of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria (session two) chapter twenty-six, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing certain sanitary and other improve-ments at the episcopal house of residence belonging to the See of Gloucester which is situate in the city of Gloucester.

"Whereas the Right Reverend Edgar Charles Sumner, now Bishop of Gloucester, is desirous that certain sanitary and other improvements should be made at the said episcopal house of residence and has submitted to us the particulars of such proposed improvements and we have

approved the same.
"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the said proposed improvements a sum of seven hundred and fifty pounds (being a sum which does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by the borrowing of the same sum by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Bishoprick of Gloucester.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Edgar Charles Sumner, Bishop of Gloucester (testified by his having affixed his signature and episcopal seal to this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorized to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above-mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding seven hundred and fifty pounds and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands, tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by deed for the term of twenty years or until the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid with the interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned i

and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following: that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of twelve months of the said term, computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable, but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly, at the end of the second period of twelve months so computed and at the end of every such like period of twelve months thereafter, pay to the said Governors, their successors or assigns, fifteenth part of the said principal sum until the whole thereof shall be repaid and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of twelve months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of four pounds per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid, and that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of forty days after the same shall become due, it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors, their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale and that such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and shall bind as well the said Edgar Charles Sumner now Bishop of the said diocese of Gloucester as every succeeding Bishop of the same diocese until the principal money and interest, costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that he said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be paid to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and that the receipt of our Joint Treasurers for the time being indorsed on the said mortgage deed shall be a good and sufficient discharge of the said Governors and their successors for the same who shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof and that upon the receipt of the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed sanitary and other improvements at the episcopal house of residence aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that the Bishop of Gloucester for the time being shall insure against loss or damage by fire and keep insured the said episcopal residence the said insurance to be for a sum of not less than seven thousand pounds, and to be effected in one or more of the public offices of insurance in London or Westminster to be approved by us and that in case of loss or damage by fire to the same episcopal residence the moneys receivable in respect of the said insurance shall be paid over to us by the said Bishop and shall with any interest or accumulations thereon be applied by us in rebuilding or repairing the same episcopal house of residence with the concurrence of the said

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the

advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Gloucester.

THEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter thirty-seven, sections six and eight, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-ninth day of June, in the year one thousand nine hundred and five, in the words following, that is to say:-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter thirty-seven, sections six and eight, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property formerly belonging to the prebend of White Lackington, in the cathedral church of

Wells, and now vested in us. "Whereas on the vacancy of the said prebend, which occurred in or about the sixteenth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, by the decease of the Reverend Charles Johnson, the then prebendary, all the lands, tithes, tenements, hereditaments, and endowments, theretofore belonging to the said prebend (except rights of patronage) became, by virtue of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, absolutely vested in us, for the purposes and subject to the provisions applicable

to other hereditaments vested in us.
"And whereas the lands, tithes, tenements, hereditaments and endowments aforesaid are not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but are now in our possession but some portions thereof on account of their character or situation are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable, under the Acts by

which our proceedings are governed.

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the said lands, tithes, tenements, hereditaments and endowments, or of the proceeds thereof for the ultimate improvement of our common fund, it is expedient that the said lands, tithes, tenements, hereditaments and endowments, or such parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit, should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly that we should be empowered to dispose of our interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

"Now therefore we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by instrument or instruments in writing duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey according to the provisions of the said Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty's reign, all or any of the said lands, tithes, tenements, hereditaments and endowments, theretofore belonging to the said prebend

of White Lackington, and so vested in us as aforesaid, with their appurtenances, and all our estate, right, title and interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same, and his, her or their heirs, executors, administrators or assigns, or otherwise as he, she or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall, upon due calculation and inquiry, appear to us to be just and reasonable, it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale, from time to time as occasion may arise, in the purchase of other lands, tithes, rent charges, tenements or hereditaments, or of some estate or interest therein, convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our preceedings are governed as aforesaid and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary Stock or other public securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Bath and Wells.

THEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of the Act of the fourth year of Your Majesty, chapter one hundred (Local), duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twentyninth day of June, in the year one thousand nine hundred and five, in the words following that is

to say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fiftyfive; and of the Act of the fourth year of Your Majesty, chapter one hundred (Local), have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Mary, situate at Edge Hill, in the parish of West Derby, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Liverpool.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient

that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Mary, situate at Edge Hill, as aforesaid.

"And whereas the Reverend Andrew Wilson is no longer the Incumbent of the said church.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Francis James, Bishop of the said diocese of Liverpool (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of West Derby which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Mary, situate at Edge Hill, as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Mary, Edge Hill.'

"And with the like consent of the said Francis James, Bishop of the said diocese of Liverpool (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Mary, situate at Edge Hill as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Mary, Edge

Hill, being: "All that part of the parish of West Derby, in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Liverpool, which is bounded upon the east by the new parish of Saint Cyprian Edge Hill, upon the south-east by the new parish of Saint Catherine, Edge Hill, upon the south by the new parish of Saint Nathaniel Windsor, West Derby, upon the south-west by the new parish of Saint Stephen, Edge Hill, upon the west and upon a small part of the north by the new parish of Saint Jude, Edge Hill, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the north by an imaginary line commencing at the junction of Prescot-street with the street called Low Hill and with Hall-lane, where the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Jude Edge Hill, of the new parish of Christ Church, Kensington, Liverpool, in the said county and diocese and of the said parish of West Derby all meet, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Hall-lane for a distance of five chains and a quarter, or thereabouts, to its junction with Edinburgh-road, and extending thence first north-eastward and then eastward along the middle of Edinburgh-road for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Jubilee Drive, and extending thence south-eastward and in a straight line (thereby crossing Kensington Gardens and the Kensington Reservoir of the Liverpool Corporation Water Works) for a distance of ten

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter fifty and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and twenty-four have prepared and now humbly olay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage of the benefice (being a rectory) of Buttermere situate in the county of Wilts and in the diocese of Salisbury for the patronage of the benefice (being a rectory) of Fulmer situate in the county of Buckingham and in the diocese of Oxford.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Buttermere is vested in the Bishop of Oxford for the time being.

"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Fulmer is vested in the Dean and Canons of Your Majesty's Free Chapel of Saint George in Your Castle at Windsor.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Francisnow Bishop of Oxford and the said Dean and Canons of Windsor have respectively signified tous their desire that the patronage of the said two benefices of Buttermere and Fulmer may be re-arranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two benefices and of the patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two benefices and rectories are as set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed.

HEREAS by section twenty-six of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, "chapelries, and other places or districts may be " separated from the parishes or mother churches " to which they belong, with great advantage, and "places altogether extra-parochial may in some "instances with advantage be annexed to parishes " or districts to which they are contiguous, or be "constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical "purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his own diocese it "shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, "or when the Bishop of any diocese shall re-"present to the said Archbishop that any such "tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the "diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, "may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be con-"stituted a separate benefice by itself, or be

"united to any other parish to which it may be "more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial, or extra-parochial, so as to "form a separate parish or benefice, or that any "extra-parochial place may with advantage be-"annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous,... "or be constituted a separate parish for eccle-" siastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or "Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing "(the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted "to the said Archbishop for his consideration) "describing the mode in which it appears to him "that the alteration may best be effected, and "how the changes consequent on such alteration. "in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe "lands, tithes, reut charges, and other ecclesias-"tical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect "to patronage and rights to pews, may be made "with justice to all parties interested; and if "the patron or patrons of the benefice or bene-"fices to be affected by such alteration shall "consent in writing under his or their hands to "such scheme, or to such modification thereof; as the said Archbishop may approve, and the "said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and.

"inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or "modification thereof, and shall certify the same " and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to "His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for "His Majesty in Council to make an Order for "carrying such scheme, or modification thereof,

"as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Right Reverend Edwyn,
Lord Bishop of Southwell, hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, made a representation dated the eighteenth day of April one thousand nine hundred and five, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:

"I Edwyn by Divine permission Bishop of Southwell do in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of 'The Pluralities Act 1838,' hereby

represent unto your Grace as follows:-"There is in my diocese of Southwell the vicarage of Ashborne-with-Mapleton annexed in the county of Derby the ecclesiastical parish whereof is of large area and extent consisting of various scattered townships among them being the township of Yeldersley in the ancient ecclesiastical parish of Ashborne containing according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one a population of one hundred and sixty-three and having an area of about one thousand five hundred acres.

"The boundaries of the said township of Yeldersley are well known and ascertained and the said township is divided into two parts by a brook or stream running through the township from north to south known as Yeldersley Brook.

" All that portion of the township of Yeldersley which lies to the east of Yeldersley Brook is adjacent to the parish of Bradley in the said county of Derby within my diocese and jurisdiction and contains a population of about eighty persons who are resident from two to three and one half miles from the parish church of Ashborne and who are accustomed to resort to the parish church of Bradley distant about half a mile for the purpose of Divine service and for the purpose of their marriages and burials.

"All that portion of the township of Yeldersley which lies to the west of Yeldersley Brook is adjacent to the parish of Osmaston in the county of Derby aforesaid and in my diocese and jurisdiction and contains a population of about seventy persons resident from one and one half to three miles from the parish church of Ashborne and who are accustomed to resort to the parish church of Osmaston for the purpose of Divine service and for the purpose of marriages and burials.

"That the patronage of the benefice of Ashborne-with-Mapleton is vested in me in right of my bishopric and the present incumbent thereof is the Reverend Ernest Edwin Morris.

"That the patronage of the benefice of Bradley is vested in the Dean and Chapter of Lichfield and the present Incumbent thereof is the Reverend Richard Hombersley Tomlins.

"That the patronage of the benefice of Osmaston is vested in Sir Peter Carlaw Walker Baronet and the present Incumbent thereof is the

Reverend Horace Valentine Titmuss.

"It appears to me that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament passed in the first and second years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter one hundred and six and in the second and third years of the same reign chapter forty-nine the township of Yeldersley may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Ashborne-with-Mapleton and part thereof annexed to the adjoining parish of Bradley and the remaining part thereof annexed to the adjoining parish of Osmaston.

"Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said Act of Parliament I the said Bishop of Southwell have drawn up a scheme in writing and have annexed the same to this representation describing that portion of the township of Yeldersley proposed to be annexed to the said parish of Bradley and that portion of the township of Yeldersley proposed to be annexed to the said parish of Osmaston and the mode in which it appears to me the alteration may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues and payments and in respect of patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the patrons of the said benefices of Ashborne-with-Mapleton Bradley and Osmaston and of the Incumbents of the aforesaid benefices to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such scheme you may certify the same and such consents by your report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the consents referred to in the

said representation are as follows:

"SCHEME.

"1. That a district consisting of all that portion of the township of Yeldersley in the parish of Ashborne which lies to the east of an imaginary line commencing at the point where Yeldersley Brook meets the boundary of the said parish of Bradley and the township of Yeldersley marked 'A' upon the plan annexed hereto and runs thence in a south-easterly and southerly direction for a distance of one hundred and thirtyfour chains down the centre of Yeldersley Brook until it meets the boundary of the township of Yeldersley and parish of Shirley at the bridge on the high road leading from Ashborne to Derby known as Shirley Bridge which point is marked 'B' upon the plan and which said district is more particularly delineated on the said plan and thereon surrounded by a blue verge line shall be separated from the said parish of Ashborne and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoin-

ing parish of Bradley.

"2. That the Incumbent of the benefice of Bradley shall have the sole and exclusive cure of souls within such district and the inhabitants of such district shall be entitled to accommodation in the parish church of Bradley and shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the

parish church of Ashborne.

"3. That all rights of sepulture in the churchyard of Ashborne formerly belonging to the inhabitants of the said district shall absolutely cease and determine but that the parishioners of such district shall be entitled to rights of sepul-

ture in the churchyard of Bradley.

"4. That marriages baptisms churchings and burials shall be solemnized in the parish church of Bradley for the inhabitants of such district and all fees dues ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments (except tithe rent charge) arising from such district shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the benefice of Bradley aforesaid.

"5. That a district consisting of all that portion of the township of Yeldersley in the parish of Ashborne which lies to the west of the said imaginary line between the points marked 'A' and 'B' on the said plan shall be separated from the said parish of Ashbornewith-Mapleton and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining parish of Osmaston

which said district is more particularly delineated and described on the said plan and thereon

surrounded with a green verge line.

"6. That the Incumbent of the benefice of Osmaston shall have the sole and exclusive cure of souls within such last-mentioned district and the inhabitants thereof shall be entitled to accommodation in the parish church of Osmaston and shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the parish church of Ashborne.

"7. That all rights of sepulture in the churchyard of Ashborne formerly belonging to the inhabitants of the said district shall absolutely cease and determine but that the inhabitants of such district shall be entitled to rights of sepul-

ture in the churchyard of Osmaston.

"8. That marriages baptisms churchings and burials shall be solemnized and performed in the parish church of Osmaston for the inhabitants of such district and all fees dues ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments (except tithe rent charge) arising from such district shall thenceforth belong to the Incumbent of the benefice of Osmaston aforesaid.

"9. Except as aforesaid no other alteration shall be made in the endowments of the said benefices or either of them and no alteration shall be made in the patronage of the said benefices or either of them.

" CONSENTS.

"I the Right Reverend Edwyn Lord Bishop of Southwell being the patron or person or corporation entitled to present to the benefice (being a vicarage) of Ashborne-with-Mapleton annexed. And I the Reverend Ernest Edwin Morris being the vicar of the said vicarage of Ashborne-with-Mapleton annexed and we the Very Reverend Herbert Mortimer Luckock Doctor in Divinity Dean of the cathedral church of Lichfield and the Chapter of the same church being the patrons or persons or corporation entitled to present to the benefice (being a rectory) of Bradley and I the said Richard Hombersley Tomlins being the rector of the said rectory and parish church of Bradley and I the said Sir Peter Carlaw Walker Baronet being the patron or person entitled to present to the benefice (being a vicarage) of Osmaston. And I the said Reverend Horace Valentine Titmuss being the vicar of the said vicarage and parish church of Osmaston do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our several consents to the scheme above proposed

and to every matter and thing therein contained.
"In testimony whereof the said Dean and Chapter of the cathedral church of Lichfield have caused their capitular seal to be hereunto affixed and we have hereunto respectively set our hands this thirtieth day of March one thousand nine

hundred and five.

To Their Most Gracious Majesties King Edward VII and Queen Alexandra.

May it please Your Majesties, We, the Members of the Urban District Council of Harrow-on-the-Hill, on behalf of our fellow townsmen, respectfully beg to tender to Your Majesties a most loyal and hearty welcome.

Recalling as we do the pleasure of Your Royal visit, during the reign of Her late revered Majesty Queen Victoria, we gratefully recognize in Your Majesties' presence here to-day continued evidence of a gracious and kindly interest in our town and its famous School, and we rejoice to have this opportunity of expressing our dutiful allegiance and our fervent hope that Your Majesties may long continue to reign in peace and prosperity over the world-wide Empire of which it is our privilege to form part.

May it please Your Majesties, We, Your Majesties' most loyal and dutiful subjects, humbly approach Your Majesties on the occasion of this visit to our ancient and historic Borough to inaugurate the new Cathedral of St. Saviour.

We note with the deepest and most loyal satisfaction the interest taken by Your Majesties in all matters affecting the welfare of the enormous population of this great Metropolis.

It is worthy of note that the Crown and Southwark have long been associated. Ever since 1295, Your Majesty's ancestors have called two Burgesses from our midst to take part in Parliament in matters affecting the well-being of the Empire. And even after 1327, when Southwark came under the City of London, Members of Parliament for this Borough have sat continuously at Westminster.

"I am well aware of the historical and literary associations of your ancient Borough, and I must take this occasion of expressing Our heartfelt gratification at the signs of loyal enthusiasm which We have observed during Our visit.

"I shall always feel sincere interest in the

May it please Your Gracious Majesties, We, the Corporation of Wardens, the Rector and Churchwardens of the ancient Church and Parish of St. Saviour, Southwark, venture to approach Your Majesties with every sentiment of loyalty and affectionate devotion, and to offer

a hearty and respectful welcome.

We recall with feelings of deep gratitude the great interest Your Majesties have taken for years in this Church, laying the Memorial Stone of the Nave, making a private visit while the Building was in progress, attending the Service of Thanksgiving when the work was complete, and now, once more, coming amongst us at the Inaugurating of this Church as the Cathedral of the Diocese of Southwark.

We need not remind Your Majesties that we are standing on classic ground—the place where Shakespeare made England famous, and his younger brother lies buried here in company with Massinger and Fletcher—a place of literary renown long before then, in the days of Gower, who rests amongst us, and Chaucer, whose Canterbury Pilgrims set out from the Tabard Inn, once close at hand.

It is the resting place of more than one Prelate, amongst them the Saintly Bishop

Andrewes.

Here also the Anglican Martyrs witnessed a good confession, and braved the fires of Smithfield.

Here, John Harvard, the founder of the American University which bears his name, was baptized, in whose memory the late American Ambassador, Mr. Choate, gave to our Cathedral a few weeks ago a painted window, to be another link in the ever-strengthening chain which binds the Old and the New World together.

Your Majesties, whose interest in the Hospitals of London is so well known and well remembered, will be pleased to have it recalled to mind that that splendid array of buildings on the Albert Embankment, known as the Hospital of St. Thomas, had its origin here when the Prior and Canons of this Church founded, in the 12th century, a Hospitium for sick and wounded soldiers and others, dedicating it to the martyred Saint of Canterbury.

Kings and Queens have been associated with this Church and neighbourhood in olden times.

Henry the Fourth here attended the marriage of the Earl of Kent to the daughter of the Duke

of Milan, and gave the bride away.

James the First of Scotland was wedded here to the niece of Cardinal Beaufort. Queen Elizabeth and Queen Anne were frequent visitors to this place. And Your Majesties, by more than one visit to this Church, have added another brilliant page to its long and varied history of more than one thousand years.

In the 365th Anniversary of the Incorporation by Royal Charter of the Wardens of this Parish, we, their successors, in company with the Rector

of the Cathedral and its Churchwardens, once more sincerely and respectfully thank Your Majesties for Your gracious and encouraging presence here to-day, and humbly express the hope and fervent wish that Your beneficent reign over this great Empire may be long, happy, and glorious, and that every blessing, both in public and private, may rest upon You, which a kind Providence may seem fitting to bestow.
