The Board of Trade have received a copy of the following Quarantine Notice, dated July 11, issued by the Governor of Malta:—

Government Notice. No. 142.

His Excellency the Governor, acting on the advice of the Council of Health, has been pleased to repeal Government Notice No. 237 of the 29th September, 1904, and to direct that the following regulations be observed as regards vessels and passengers:—

Infected Places.

- 1. The following countries and ports are declared to be infected:—
  - (a.) Arabia (excepting Perim and Aden);

(b.) India;

(c.) Alexandria (Egypt).

Infected Vessels.

2. Infected vessels are vessels which have, or have had, on board, during the voyage or the preceding 20 days, cases of cholera, yellow fever, plague, or any disease with symptoms which, in the opinion of the Chief Government Medical Officer, resemble the symptoms of the said diseases.

Vessels which are not allowed to enter the Harbour, but are allowed to communicate with Quarantine Establishments.

3. Infected vessels.

4. Vessels with pilgrims from the East, which do not carry a recognized Medical Officer.

Vessels allowed to load in Quarantine.

5. Infected vessels carrying a recognized Medical Officer, and not having on board an actual case of any of the diseases mentioned in clause 2 on board.

6. Vessels with pilgrims from the East which

carry a recognized Medical Officer.

7. Vessels from infected places not having on board an actual case of any of the diseases mentioned in clause 2, when arriving within 10 days from date of departure.

8. Vessels arriving at Malta without a clean

bill of health.

Vessels from Infected Places admitted to Pratique.

9. Vessels without a clean bill of health, or from infected places, will be admitted to pratique after 10 days from date of departure.

Pilots allowed to board Vessels.

10. Pilots will be allowed to board the vessels referred to in clauses 5, 6, 7, and 8 for the purpose of taking them into the Quarantine Harbour, subject to the following conditions:—

(a.) The pilot shall go direct from his boat to the bridge, without holding communication with any person except the Officers and crew of the vessel, and after the vessel is moored, shall be taken in one of her boats to the Lazaretto, where his clothes and person shall be disinfected.

(b.) To prevent communication or contact with passengers, the Master of the vessel shall cause the portion of the deck over which the pilot has to pass to be roped off, and shall exclude from such space and from the bridge all persons except the Officers and crew of the vessel so long as the pilot is on board.

Medical Inspection.

11. All vessels and passengers are subject to medical inspection on arrival.

Passengers.

12. Passengers who, according to the declaration of the captain of the vessel by which they arrive, embarked at Ports beyond Suez, or at Mediterranean Ports, east of Malta, or at Sicily, Tripoli (Barbary States) or Tunis, shall, before landing, declare on oath before a Marine Police Officer that they have not been in, or have not communicated with, an infected place within the last 10 days. Otherwise they shall remain in quarantine till the expiration of 10 days from the date of departure.

13. Passengers arriving on board vessels without a clean bill of health, and the Officers of such vessels, will be permitted to land after medical inspection, but will not be permitted to land any of their luggage or effects until the same shall have been thoroughly disinfected. This clause does not apply to deck passengers.

14. Passengers not otherwise provided for are subjected to the restrictions applicable to

the vessels on which they arrive.

15. When 20 days have elapsed from the last case of plague, cholera, or other disease against which restrictions have been in force with regard to a country or place declared to be an infected place, a notice will be issued by the Collector of Customs to the effect that the place or port is no longer to be dealt with as infected.

### NEWCASTLE-UPON-TYNE UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Newcastleupon-Tyne Union;—

And to all others whom it may conceru.

Whereas by a General Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Newcastle-upon-Tync Union (amongst others) the Poor Law Commissioners made certain Regulations for the government of the Workhouse of that Union;

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order and Direct that, notwithstanding anything contained in the above-cited Order, if the Guardians of the Poor of the said Union shall submit to Us for Our approval a Statement showing the total number of persons which the said Guardians consider it necessary to appoint to hold the office of Nurse at the said Workhouse, and the salaries or scale of salaries to be assigned to such Nurses, and We approve that Statement, it shall not be necessary for the said Guardians to report to Us each appointment under the said Order of a person to hold the office of Nurse in the said Workhouse, nor to obtain Our approval to the remuneration of any such person, so long as the number of persons so appointed and their salaries do not exceed the number of persons and the scale of salaries shown in the said Statement and approved by Us:

(1.) This Order shall not apply to the appointment of any Superintendent Nurse appointed subject to the provisions of the Nursing in Workhouses Order, 1897.

### WEST HAM UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the West Ham Union :-

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by General Orders of the Poor Law Board, dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1867, and the 16th day of February, 1869, and addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the West Ham Union (amongst others) and by other Orders made by Us, the Local Government Board, dated respectively the 7th day of March, 1881, and the 5th day of August, 1903, and decreed to the soid Guardian it, is now indicated the soid Guardian it. addressed to the said Guardians, it is required that in relation to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, and at Premises provided by the said Guardians at Leytonstone and appropriated for the purposes of a School and Infirmary respectively for the reception and treatment of poor persons belonging to the said Union, the Accounts when made up and balanced, shall be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some Member thereof, who shall enter a memorandum at the foot of those Accounts, certifying to the same having been submitted, and to the correctness of the said Accounts as regards the stock remaining in store;

And whereas it is expedient to empower the said Guardians to appoint a competent person or persons to examine the stores at the Workhouse, and at any House (whatever be its designation or description) which belongs to the

Guardians, in which any poor person is lodged and maintained, and to which the Orders hereinbefore mentioned apply, and to perform the other duties hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, in the exercise of our powers

in that behalf, We do hereby Order as follows:—
ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the
West Ham Union, as and when they shall think fit to do so, may appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as hereinafter set forth, and may revoke that appointment. Any appointment of a Stocktaker by the Guardians shall be notified to Us forthwith.

ARTICLE II.—Every appointment of a Stock-taker shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Regulations in force for the time being as to the appointment of Officers by the said Guardians, and a person appointed to the office of Stocktaker shall receive such remuneration as may from time to time be assigned to him by the said Guardians.

ARTICLE III.—No person, except with Our consent, shall be appointed to the office of Stocktaker while holding any other office under the Guardians.

ARTICLE IV .-- The Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stores at the Workhouse, and at any House such as is hereinbefore described, and compare the said stores with the quantities of stock remaining in store as shown by the entries in the proper columns in the Accounts termed respectively the "Quarterly Balance of the Provisions Account" and the "Quarterly Balance of the Necessaries and Mis-cellaneous Account," or in such additional Accounts as may be kept under the directions of the Guardians.

He shall also, on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of clothing at the Workhouse, and at any House such as is hereinbefore described. and compare the same with the balance appearing in the Accounts termed respectively the "Ulothing Materials Receipt and Conversion Account" and the "Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Account, and shall compare the various articles enumerated in the Inventory Books of the before-mentioned establishments, and see that the said articles are distributed in accordance with the entries therein.

ARTICLE V .-- After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article IV, the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of each of the balanced Accounts in the following form :

"Submitted to me this day of 19 , and found to be correct as regards the quantities of stock remaining in store.

"(Signed) "Stocktaker."

If he find the stock to be in any respect incorrect he shall make such alteration in the said certificate as he may deem necessary, specifying the particulars in which he finds the quantities of stock to be incorrectly stated.

ARTICLE VI.—The Master of the Workhouse, and the Master, Steward or Superintendent of any such House as aforesaid, shall, when required by the Stocktaker to do so, on the days and at the times referred to in Article IV, submit to him the stores and Accounts therein mentioned, and render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of such examination and comparison as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VII.—The Master of the Workhouse, and the Master, Steward or Superintendent of any such House as aforesaid, shall lay each of the said Accounts before the Guardians at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of any such certificate as aforesaid.

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE SYDNEY MINT.

VERDICT.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn this sixth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and five, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the Assays and Trials of His Majesty's Gold and Silver coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Sydney, in the Colony of New South Wales, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and four, to the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and five, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins in each packet produced to us corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took two coins from each of such packets of Gold coins, amounting altogether to one hundred and twentyfour Sovereigns, or Twenty-shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, so as to ascertain whether they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the Standard of Weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act was minus two-thousandths of an ounce (-.002 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said Gold coins so taken out and weighed, into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the Standard of Fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act was plus fourteen hundred-thousandths (or + 00014), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said Gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue twelve Sovereigns, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such Sovereigns weighed respectively,—the first, 123-319 grains, the second, 123-378 grains, the third, 123-168 grains, the fourth, 123-154 grains, the fifth, 123-429 grains, the sixth, 123-106 grains, the seventh, 123.376 grains, the eighth, 123.124 grains, the ninth, 123·171 grains, the tenth, 123·397 grains, the eleventh, 123·247 grains, and the twelfth, 123·206 grains. We then assayed the said twelve Sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such Sovereigns to be,—the first, 916.76, the second, 916.70, the third, 916.70, the fourth, 916.66, the fifth, 916.66, the sixth, 916.70, the seventh, 916.80, the eighth, 916.70, the ninth, 916.60, the tenth, 916.76, the eleventh, 916.90, and the twelfth, 916.90, respectively.—Dated the fifth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and five.

Hook Point Fog Signal-Altered.

The white fixed light at present exhibited on the old North Mole Head will be replaced by a provisional green fixed light, visible from a distance of 7 miles; this light in line with the red flashing light on the new north breakwater head will mark the northern edge of the second section of the newly-dredged channel, and in line with the fixed white light on the new south breakwater head, will mark the southern edge of the same channel. The light power of this light over the channel will be 130 candles:

The newly-dredged channel in the northwest passage will also be marked by five lightbuoys moored about 30 yards from the limits, those on the northern side being painted black and marked A 1, A 3, A 5, each exhibiting a red fixed light, those on the southern side being a buoy painted in black and white horizontal bands marked A 2 and exhibiting a white occulting light every six seconds, thus:—light, four seconds; eclipse, two seconds; and a buoy painted red, marked A 4, exhibiting a white fixed light.

When the state of the works admits of it, the provisional red fixed light on Boulevard Maritime near St. Adresse, the lights on the heads of the north and south piers, and the green light in the Avant Port will be discontinued; the light-buoys Nos. 1, 3, 5, 7, and 11, and the buoys marking banc de l'Éclat will also be withdrawn.
