(SHEEP-SCAB COMPULSORY DIPPING AREA.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Declaration of Sheep-Scab Compulsory Dipping Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Compulsory Dipping Area for the purposes of the Sheep-Scab (Compulsory Dipping Areas) Order of 1905 (hereinafter referred to as the "principal Order"), as modified by the Sheep-Scab (Compulsory Diping Areas) Order of 1905 (No. 2) and this Order.

Period for Compulsory Dipping.

2. The dates between which all sheep in the Compulsory Dipping Area hereby declared are to be treated by the owner for sheep-scab by effective dipping under Article 2 of the principal Order are hereby fixed to be the eleventh day of September and the ninth day of October in every year.

Modification of Existing Orders.

3. Article 2 (Compulsory Dipping of all Sheep in Compulsory Dipping Area) of the principal Order shall not apply to the undermentioned

(1.) Sheep for which an exemption has been obtained from the Local Authority of the district which exemption shall only be granted for sheep which for the purposes of sale, exhibition or movement shall have been dipped under and in accordance with the provisions of the principal Order on or since the fifteenth day of August in the current year, and have since such dipping

been kept separate from sheep not dipped in the manner prescribed by the principal Order. The sheep thus exempted shall until the expiration of the prescribed dipping period be kept separate from sheep which have not been dipped in the manner pre-scribed by the principal Order. Every exemption shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority and shall be subject to any conditions specified in the exemption. A copy of every exemption shall be sent to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Sheep moved out of the Compulsory Dipping Area under and in accordance with the provisions of Article 5 of that Order, or slaughtered within the Area during the

dipping period; or
(3.) Sheep moved through the Area by railway
from a place outside the Area to another place outside the Area without unnecessary delay or being untrucked within the Area.

Revocation of Orders.

4. The Orders described in the Second Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked, but returns under Article 3 of the principal Order shall not be necessary in respect of sheep of which returns have been duly made in consequence of the provisions of the revoked Orders.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the fourth day of August, nineteen hundred and five.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Borough of Ealing.

W HEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted, that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour.

CITY OF COVENTRY. Tramways Act, 1870.

NOTICE is hereby given that at a Meeting of the Council of the City of Coventry, held on the 18th day of July, 1905, the following Byelaws and Regulations were made, under section

46 of the Tramways Act, 1870 :-

1. For the purposes of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "car" shall mean any carriage using any tramway laid down within the city of Coventry, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the inspector, driver and conductor, or other person having charge of a car; the term "Company" shall mean the Coventry Electric Tramways Company, and any Company authorized to construct or work any tramway laid down within the said city; and the term "person" shall include any body of persons whether corporate or unincorporate.

2. Every driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers in the course of its journey.

(a) When required so to do by any passenger

desirous of leaving the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made, at any place the Local Authority, with the approval of the Board of Trade, and after notice to the Company, shall have appointed for that purpose; or

(b) Without such request, at any other place which the Local Authority, with the approval of the Board of Trade, and after notice to the Company, shall have appointed as a

stopping place.

Such places shall be indicated by the Company in such distinctive manner as may from time to

time be approved by the Local Authority.

3. Except at a stopping place referred to in Bye-law No. 2, or except at a passing place or a terminus, or except as provided by Bye-laws made or to be made by the Board of Trade, no car shall be stopped for the purpose of taking up or setting down passengers, or for any purpose whatsoever unless such car be impeded by other traffic, or for the purpose of changing the points, or in the case of unavoidable accident.

4. Every driver of a car on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road without there being sufficient free space for the car to pass shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall with reasonable dispatch cause such vehicle to be removed so as

not to obstruct the car.

5. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause

interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

6. If at any time a block occurs in the ordinary traffic in any street the driver of any car in such street shall either stop running or move in such direction as may be necessary to relieve such block in the traffic.

7. The Company shall affix inside each car a copy of these Bye-laws, and the conductor shall on the request of any passenger permit the same to be perused by such passenger, and the Company shall affix and keep affixed in each of their offices and waiting rooms within the city a printed copy of the same for the use of the public.

8. The Company or any driver, conductor or other person offending against any of these Byclaws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

Provided nevertheless that the Justices or Court before whom any complaint may be made or any proceedings may be taken in respect to any such offence may, if they think fit, adjudge the payment as a penalty of any sum less than the full amount of the penalty imposed by this Bye-law.

9. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of October, 1905.

Information has been published in the Shipping Gazette of 11th July, 1905, that H.B.M. Minister at Tokyo reports that the Japanese Government have published on Ordinance, dated 7th July, declaring that the state of siege of the Port of Makyu (Makung) in the Pescadores Islands, and the neighbouring seas, is no longer in existence.
